A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ,

I draw your attention to a new addition to the Christmas decorations in our church this year which is **a star** hanging in our sanctuary above the large crucifix on the back wall. The light from a similar star the gospel tells us caught the attention of the **Magi from the east** who were gazing at the night sky to discern the ultimate meaning and purpose of life. The attraction of that star



moved them to leave the safe and familiar confines of their homeland, to journey to where the light ultimately led them, to the place where Jesus was born, revealing the glory of God to all the nations. And what is the glory of God? St. Irenaeus said, "The glory of God is the human person fully alive." The great Epiphany then and now is that Jesus, the son of God, born of Mary is the revelation of what it means to be human, to be made in the image and likeness of God, and this is a great truth that all people everywhere share in common.

That is a rather remarkable and some might claim audacious proposition, given the complex and often challenging diversity of religions, cultures, ethnicities, philosophies, and ways of life in our world. For all of our differences, and they are many, the great solemnity of the Epiphany declares that we are all beloved children of God, made for as Thomas Merton put it, "To love others without stopping to inquire whether or not they are worthy." That is at the heart of the message revealed by the light of Christ to shepherds and kings and through the life of his body the church everywhere including St. Bridget's parish.

We have a great opportunity to reflect on that mission in the upcoming **Synod listening sessions** you have been hearing about for the past couple of months. Our first session is coming up on **Monday, January 10**, at 7:00 pm here at St. Bridget's. If you have not done so, please consider registering at **stbridgetchurch.org/synod** to participate in this gathering of the church, called to proclaim the light of Christ to all the nations!

THE LIGHT OF THE MOON

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.


Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

WHAT HAPPENS TO A CONSECRATED HOST IF IT ACCIDENTALLY FALLS TO THE GROUND?

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).
