A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ,

When Archbishop Sartain asked me to serve as your pastor in April of 2019, one of the first things I did was to read up on the life of **St. Bridget of Kildare**, our patron saint. I frankly did not know much about her. After two and a half years in this parish, I think St. Bridget is an outstanding patron and spiritual guide for several reasons.



The first is her decision at a young age to **consecrate her life to Christ**. Her father had arranged a marriage for Bridget that would have provided her with material comfort and security. She had given her heart already to Christ, so she rejected her family's wishes for her and made private vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. This was a counter-cultural thing to do then and now. I hope it inspires our parish to be Christ-centered and willing to challenge cultural norms and expectations that are contrary to the gospel. This is the call we share whatever our particular vocation.

Bridget in time formed several monastic communities of women and men whose lives were **dedicated to prayer and the works of mercy, especially hospitality to the poor**. Her witness spread widely, and she is now considered along with St. Patrick and St. Columba, to be one of the three founders of Christianity in Ireland. Her official feast day, February 1, will become a national holiday in 2023. May her life always inspire our parish to be a place of welcome and compassionate care to all we meet. Celebrating our patron saint is an opportunity to rejoice in the life and history of our parish community. Thanks to those who have been part of St. Bridget's from the founding of the parish in 1968. Welcome to those who have recently joined, and cheers to everyone in between. May we continually grow in the faith, hope, and love we share as a Catholic Community. **Happy Feast Day Brothers and Sisters!**

You brought harmony where there was conflict.

You brought light to the darkness.

You brought hope to the downcast.

May the mantle of your peace cover those who are troubled and anxious.

And may peace be firmly rooted in our hearts and in our world.

We take this responsibility seriously and strive to provide physically and emotionally safe environments for young people to learn and grow in confidence into future leaders of our communities. We challenge each student to look beyond themselves and, with Jesus as their most important teacher, develop hearts of kindness, courage, and compassion for others.

OUR PATRON SAINT - ST. BRIDGET OF KILDARE

FEAST DAY - FEBRUARY 1



Bridget or Brigid of Kildare as she is commonly known (c. 451–525), was a nun and abbess who founded several monasteries in Ireland. Christians believe that God performed miracles through Brigid during her lifetime, most of which had to do with healing. Brigid is the patron saint of babies, midwives, children whose parents aren't married, scholars, poets, travelers (especially those who travel by water), and farmers (especially dairy farmers).

Legend also has it that she also turned bathwater into beer. Channeling a little divine intervention, she answered the prayers of the thirsty lepers under her charge by turning the water they used to bathe into not just any beer, but a genuinely brilliant beer that was enjoyed by one and all.

SAINT BRIGID CROSS

A special type of cross known as "Saint Brigid's cross" is popular throughout Ireland. It commemorates a famous story in which Brigid went to the home of a pagan leader when people told her that he was dying and needed to quickly hear the gospel message. The man was delirious and upset when Brigid arrived, unwilling to listen to what she had to say. Brigid sat with him and prayed, taking some of the straw from the floor and weaving it into the shape of a cross. Gradually, the man quieted down and asked Brigid what she was doing. She explained the gospel to him, using her handmade cross as a visual aid. The man then came to faith in Jesus Christ, and Brigid baptized him just before he died. Today, many Irish people display a Saint Brigid's cross in their homes, since it is said to help ward off evil and welcome good.

This weekend we will honor our patron saint with two celebrations; a reception following our Saturday Vigil Mass and on Sunday, following our Mass at 9:30 am. Please join us on our tented patio and classroom area off of the parish hall for these festivities.




