

Pastor's Letter

Dear Parishioners,

We had a blessed weekend to celebrate Valentine's Day. It was a blessed week for couples of all ages, celebrating and appreciating their married lives together. They shared their joy and challenges of raising their family. It was a wonderful weekend for the community to acknowledge and recognize these couples within our parishes for their vocation and commitment to each other. Like every vocation, there are times of happiness and sorrow, but in a marriage the challenge and difficulty rises when one of the spouses passes away. Thus, when two halves make the commitment to join together to become one (in a marriage) and when the time comes when one half is no longer there, the experience of sorrow, grief, and of loss experienced by the surviving half is immense. With this in mind, our Faith Community continues to keep all of our parishioners experiencing this challenging and difficult time in their lives in our prayers and thoughts.

We welcome you to celebrate the Seventh Week of Ordinary Time with our merging parishes. You are welcome to participate and join us with the Synodal process of listening to each other, as well as allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us to assist the Church in moving forward to have a vibrant parish. We cordially invite you to join us for these special listening sessions that we have at each of our merging parishes. There are prayers and questions for us to reflect upon and we can share with each other our thoughts. These thoughts will be shared with the Archdiocese and Pope Francis. We thank our coordinators for their time to attend their training sessions to lead these listening sessions. There are explanations and information about this on our parishes' bulletin and website.

We had an informative staff meeting with the staff sharing with me what they have done since the last meeting and what they are planning to do. I also took the opportunity in the meeting to thank them for their ministry. We have different ministries within our merging parishes. Each parish has its own ministry such as St. John of the Woods Mission has a wonderful outreach program for our senior parishioners. For example, serving and assisting our seniors with what they need, such as preparing luncheon for them twice a month. These senior parish volunteers have their own program and they organize lunch for their group to spend time together. They also reach out to others to check on them by calling them on the phone. Visitation has a wonderful Catholic School as well as Outreach Program for the poor and needy living on the street. We serve the homeless and give them hot meals and provide a friendly place around the Church for them to feel a little safe for a while. St. Ann's Church has a wonderful multicultural program for the children with CCD, Faith Formation, and Outreach for the poor. They also have many Vietnamese programs to serve our Vietnamese parishioners. In addition, we have St. Vincent De Paul Ministry that reaches out to serve the poor. It is amazing what we are doing each day if we look into services that we are offering to the local community, apart from providing Sacraments to serve our parishioners. We thank you for your continuing support and you can be very proud of our parishes for being able to share and assist our local community with many things.

We thank the Vietnamese Leadership Team who met last week to plan for their upcoming activities and ministry. We also thank the Liturgy Committee at St. John of the Woods Mission, Visitation Parish and St. Ann Parish for their separate meetings to plan for the Lenten Season at each parish, as well as for the Holy Week celebration. We thank parents who spent time to study about the Vaccination Clinic at St. Ann's Church and they brought their children there to receive the vaccination. We also thank the School Commission members for their monthly meeting last Tuesday. It was a wonderful meeting with the principal sharing information and updating them on Visitation STEM Academy School, and asking them to share their thoughts on school related issues. I truly appreciate their members and thank them for their insights on what we have asked of them. They had approved the assumption proposal budget for the next school year and they recommended us to move forward with the New School and Faith Formation Center Project. Archbishop spent time to meet with Pastors and Principals of the Archdiocese of Seattle last week. I thank him for spending time to talk about the Catholic Church and the important role our Catholic School is in the parish's life and it is a blessing for the parish to have a Catholic School.

We thank the Building Committee members for their time to study about the project of the New School and Faith Formation Center for the New Parish. There is a guideline/process that the project must follow to make sure we comply with all necessary requirements. There are many different meetings with the parish leadership team, the Archdiocese of Seattle, Archbishop, and the City of Tacoma for permission to build. We also need to work on the financial planning regarding how we can obtain or raise sufficient funds for the project. We are currently at the planning and meeting stage.

You are also cordially invited to join us for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction at our merging parishes each week. I would like to inform you that the Facility and Maintenance Committee members at St. John of the Woods Mission Church have done a wonderful job by cleaning the gutters of the Church's building, the Parish Office, as well as other parish buildings. They also took time to repair the broken gutter section, which had loosened due to wear and tear (reconnected it to the rain filter pipe that leads to the ground). All of these works are important to keep our parish well maintained and healthy.

Stewardship of time, talent and treasure is very important for our parishes! Please try to be generous with what you can do to support our parish. May the Lord continue to bless you and your family!

Pastoral Plan Activity

Feb 20 Reread today's Gospel Luke 6:27-38 Jesus challenges us to follow his way of acting and treating others. In our country, too often acrimony and angry words divide people and harden hearts. Jesus gives us another way of acting and treating others.

Dialogue: Jesus calls us to respond with generous kindness, patiences, and understanding toward others. What do you think were some of the reactions of those who first heard these words of Jesus? Lent begins next week. How might these words of Jesus guide us as we journey through the 40 days with prayer, fasting (sacrifices), and alms giving (generosity).

Activity: Talk about some lenten practices you might do as a family: daily rosary, reading the Sunday Scripture Saturday before Mass and talking about their meaning, no dessert one day, no sugar or sweet drinks one day, giving up something as a family and putting the money aside for the Rice Bowl or collection for the poor. Pick a day or time to share a sign of peace with each family member each week in Lent.

St. John of the Woods Mission Church Re: Synod Listening Session

Pope Francis has called for a worldwide Synod of Bishops to commence in Rome with an assembly in October of 2023, planning for the future of the Church. In preparation for that synod, we at St John's are invited to pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance, to discuss ideas with family and friends, and to write down some ideas about how we'd like to see the Church move into the future. How can we best be disciples of Jesus Christ? At St. John's we will have our "Listening Session" in the form of the written word, not in face-to-face meetings. There will be a box at the back of the church during February where you are invited to submit your written ideas. These submissions will be read by the local synod committee and assembled into paragraphs of ideas to send on to Archbishop Etienne. There is no requirement to sign your written work. This is intended to be a grass-roots contribution of ideas which will eventually make their way to the world-wide Synod of Bishops in 2023.






