

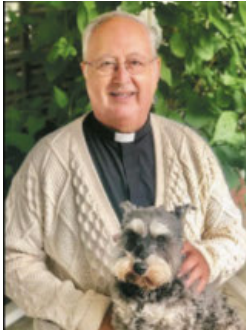

We prepare for eternal life by choosing to love and follow God. Our journey with Christ includes equipping our consciences to make morally good judgments at the end of life. While no summary can substitute for thorough catechesis, one thing is clear: we are entrusted by God with the gift of life. This obliges us to make use of appropriate, effective medical care. The Church affirms the inviolable dignity of every person, regardless of the duration or extent of the person's incapacity. Nothing diminishes the sanctity of a person's life, or the obligation to protect and care for it. Those who are sick should not be alone, and, even after death, accompaniment continues by praying for those who have passed.

We are entrusted by God with the gift of life.

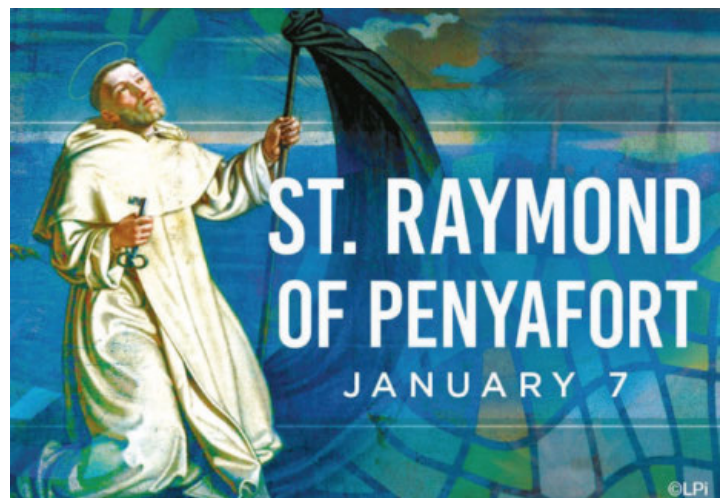

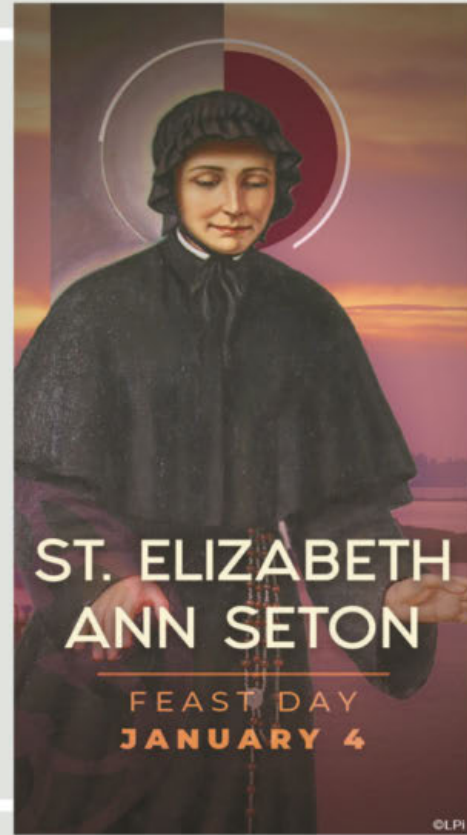

Saint of the Week

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

Aun en estos tiempos, la humanidad continúa buscando la estrella, esa estrella que muchas veces se pierde entre la injusticia, el odio y la discriminación. Sin embargo, hay que seguir el camino y alzar los ojos al cielo para encontrar el centro de su luz. “Levántate y brilla, que ha llegado tu luz y la Gloria de Yavé amaneció sobre ti (Isaías 60,1). La Gloria de la Manifestación de Jesús en su Evangelio y en la Eucaristía se hace presente entre nosotros en la Liturgia de hoy. El Papa Francisco nos explica acerca de la belleza de esta celebración. “La manifestación de Jesús, simbolizada por la luz: Levántate y resplandece, Jerusalén, porque llega tu luz; la Gloria del Señor amanece sobre ti”. Él nos exhorta al movimiento, a no quedarnos ahí fijos como estatuas sin hacer nada.

También, nos explica sobre la participación de los magos del Oriente y lo que ellos representan. “Los Magos, venidos de Oriente, representan a todos los pueblos lejanos de la fe judía tradicional: se dejan guiar por la estrella y se enfrentan a un largo y arriesgado viaje; se postran ante Jesús y le ofrecen regalos simbólicos: oro, incienso y mirra; la búsqueda del Señor implica también la generosidad del corazón” (1/6/2019). ¿Qué le estoy ofreciendo a Jesús en esta etapa de mi vida? ¿Qué tipo de manifestaciones he tenido de Dios a lo largo de mi vida? Pidamos, en esta Eucaristía, que la luz de Cristo se manifieste en estos tiempos turbulentos y oscuros que experimentamos en el mundo entero. Sigamos vigilantes, caminemos por sendas nuevas, sigamos el ejemplo de los Magos. Ellos, regresaron a su país por otro camino.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | 4 de enero



La santa patrona de las escuelas católicas, Santa Isabel Ann Seton (28 de agosto de 1774 - 4 de enero de 1821) nació en la ciudad de Nueva York en una familia prominente de la fe episcopal. Cuando cumplió 19 años, se casó con un rico hombre de negocios con el que tuvo cinco hijos. Más tarde murió de tuberculosis en 1803, dejándola viuda joven. Después de descubrir la fe católica en Italia, donde había muerto su marido, regresó a Nueva York y se convirtió al catolicismo en 1805.

Después de varios años de lucha como madre soltera, Elizabeth se mudó en 1809 a Emmitsburg, Maryland, donde fundó las Hermanas de la Caridad de San José, la primera comunidad para mujeres religiosas establecida en los Estados Unidos. También comenzó St. Joseph's Academy y Free School, que inició una reacción en cadena de la educación católica en los Estados Unidos que continúa hoy.

Santa Isabel Ann Seton fue canonizada el 14 de septiembre de 1975 en la Plaza de San Pedro por el Papa Pablo VI y fue la primera ciudadana nacida en los Estados Unidos en recibir el título de "santa".

La Iglesia afirma la dignidad inviolable de toda persona, independientemente de la duración o extensión de la incapacidad de la persona. Nada disminuye la santidad de la vida de una persona, ni la obligación de protegerla y cuidarla. Los enfermos no deben estar solos, e, incluso después de la muerte, el acompañamiento continúa, rezando por los que han fallecido.

Dios nos ha confiado el don de la vida.
