From the President of Catholic Schools

March 14, 2021 Fourth Sunday of Lent



“It is not good that the man should be alone,” God says after he had brought Adam into the garden. An earthly paradise is not enough for man; the company of all the animals is not enough for man. No, it is good that man is united to another, certainly in marriage but also in family, in community, indeed in society. “It is not good that the

man should be alone.”

Sadly, our current culture often views others as impeding our freedom more than fostering our nature. While true independence is, of course, impossible, we have arrived, technologically and culturally, at the point of credible illusion. Given our technological advances, we have the means to fool ourselves into thinking that we are truly independent of one another. Interactions with others can be done almost entirely on our own terms and to the extent that we want it. Food, entertainment, even community are now accessible nearly entirely on our own terms. Delivery services, streaming services, and social media allow us to cultivate a life that hosts interactions nearly entirely on our own terms. Now with the changes of COVID, even work and education are being experienced more completely on one’s own terms. Now with the sexual revolution entering its newest phase, the most basic of biological identities is up for self-identification and definition.

What is the result? Despair. Despair is, in a technical sense, a lack of hope. In a world that is entirely dependent upon ourselves for construction, what is there to hope in? Sure we can define our own community, but we have found that left to ourselves we do not make very good company. We have at our fingertips a variety of food and entertainment that even the wealthiest in ages recently past could only dream of. Yet still, we find nothing we want to eat and nothing we want to watch. Even before this year of forced separation, loneliness, depression, and the phenomenon known as “deaths of despair” (suicide, overdose, and alcohol-related deaths) were increasing at an alarming rate. Our current youth, Gen Z, the most connected generation in history, is perhaps the loneliness.

Into the midst of this real hell, the Church echoes God’s own words, “It is not good for the man to be alone.” We are made for each other in God’s image and likeness. God, himself One, is a Trinity of persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in eternal and perfect relationship with one another. We too, made in His image, are called to be in relationship with one another. Relationships are hard! Even at its shallowest encounter, it is often harder at the moment to be with another person than to be by yourself. It is easier to watch the movie you want to watch by yourself than with someone else. If you are part of an organization, it will likely be inefficient and faltering, doing things that don’t perfectly agree with your own thoughts. Worst of all, you might actually be right in that assessment. But, to be alone is to be without love and to be without hope, to have no other object of faith other than your own ability, which is never enough.

In and through the communion of the Church, the Body of Christ, God provides us the true society that fulfills our longing. His love overcomes our failures, His sacrifice, our sins. As Catholics, we have a mission to share this communion with others. We are called to love others and to draw them into the love of Christ. Without God, without Christ, there is only isolation and despair, there is only hell. May God give us the grace to engage in the messy, difficult, and sometimes overwhelming work of loving our neighbor and loving our enemy for the love of God. It is through this love, and only through this love that the hell of isolation can be overcome, and we can have hope in a true heaven. “It is not good that the man should be alone.”

EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF DRONERO, ITALY

August 3, 1631, a great fire broke out in Saluzzo in the town of Dronero. The townspeople desperately attempted to extinguish the fire, but all their efforts proved useless as the fire developed further. Friar Maurice da Ceva, was inspired to have recourse to the power of the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and organized a procession with the Blessed Sacrament followed by all the townspeople to the location of the fire. The moment the Blessed Sacrament arrived, the flames subsided and miraculously were extinguished! This miraculous event is described in details on a stone tablet in the small Church of St. Brigid. On the Feast of Corpus Christi, the citizens of Dronero keep alive the memory of this miracle with a solemn annual procession.

“No es Bueno que el hombre esté solo,” Dios dijo después que trajo a Adán al jardín, un paraíso terrenal no es suficiente para el hombre; la compañía de todos los animales no es suficiente para el hombre. No, es Bueno que el hombre esté unido a otra persona, ciertamente en matrimonio pero también en

familia, en comunidad, indudablemente en sociedad. “No es Bueno que el hombre esté solo.”

Tristemente, nuestra cultura a menudo ve a otros como impidiendo nuestra libertad más que fomentando nuestra naturaleza. Si bien la verdadera independencia, es por supuesto, imposible, hemos llegado tecnológica y culturalmente, al punto de una alusión creíble. Debido a nuestros avances tecnológicos tenemos los medios para engañarnos a nosotros mismos pensando que somos verdaderamente independientes de unos a otros. Las interacciones con otros se pueden hacer casi enteramente en nuestros propios términos y en la medida que lo deseamos. Comida, entretenimiento, aún la comunidad es ahora accesible casi enteramente en nuestros propios términos. Servicios a domicilio, servicios de transmisión, y los medios sociales nos permiten cultivar una vida que alberga interacciones casi enteramente en nuestros propios términos. Ahora con los cambios de COVID, aún el trabajo y la educación han sido experimentados más completamente en los propios términos. Ahora con la revolución sexual entrando en su nueva fase, lo más básico de identidades biológicas está preparado para la auto identificación y definición.

Cual es el resultado? Desesperación. La desesperación es, en un sentido técnico, falta de esperanza. En un mundo que depende totalmente de nosotros para la construcción, que podemos esperar? Seguro que podemos definir nuestra propia comunidad, pero nos hemos dado cuenta de que dejándonos a nosotros mismos no hacemos muy buena compañía. Tenemos a nuestro alcance una variedad de alimentos y entretenimiento con los que incluso los más ricos solo podían soñar. Sin embargo, no encon

tramos nada que querramos comer o nada que querramos ver. Incluso este año de separación

forzosa, soledad, depresión,, y el fenómeno conocido como “muertes por desesperación” (suicidios, sobredosis, y muertes relacionadas con el alcohol) estaban aumentando en un ritmo alarmante. Nuestra juventud actual, la generación Z, la generación más conectada de la historia es quizás la soledad.

En este verdadero infierno, la Iglesia se hace eco de las propias palabras de Dios, “No es Bueno que el hombre esté solo.” Somos hechos el uno para el otro a semejanza de Dios. Dios, El mismo, es una Trinidad de personas; Padre, Hijo, y Espíritu Santo en una eterna y perfecta relación de uno con otro. Las relaciones son difíciles! Incluso en su encuentro más superficial, a menudo es más difícil en este momento estar con otra persona que estar solo. Es más fácil ver la película que tú quieres ver tu solo que con alguien más. Si eres parte de una organización, es probable que sea ineficiente y vacilante, haciendo cosas que no concuerden perfectamente con tus propios pensamientos. Lo peor de todo es que quizás tengas razón en esa evaluación, pero estar solo es estar sin amor y sin esperanza, no tener otro objeto de fe que no sea la propia capacidad, que nunca es suficiente.

En y a través de la comunión de la Iglesia, el Cuerpo de Cristo, Dios nos proporciona la verdadera sociedad que satisface nuestros anhelos. Su amor supera nuestros fracasos, su sacrificio, nuestros pecados. Como Católicos, tenemos la misión de compartir esta comunión con los demás. Estamos llamados a amar a los demás y llevarlos al amor de Cristo. Sin Dios, Sin Cristo, solo hay aislamiento y desesperación, solo hay infierno. Que Dios nos de la gracia de participar en el trabajo complicado, difícil y, a veces abrumador de amar a nuestro prójimo y amar al enemigo por amor a Dios. Es a través de este amor, y solo a través de este amor que se puede superar el infierno del aislamiento y podemos tener esperanza en un cielo verdadero. “No es Bueno que el hombre esté solo.”


