

From the President of Catholic Schools

March 28, 2021 Palm Sunday



“A Message Signed in Blood to the Nation of the Cross” was the title of a video published by the Islamic state in 2015 that documented the martyrdom of twenty Coptic Christians, and one man, baptized in blood on that day. It was the intent of these militants to mock and

insult all Christians through this action. Yet, I could not help but find the framing of the event almost funny.

Christians are, in fact, the people of the cross. St. Paul boldly states,

“Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God’s foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength” (1 Cor. 1:22-24).

We know that the cross sounds foolish, we have known this for two thousand years. But we also know that the cross has conquered all who have attempted to destroy it. We are a people who worship the crucified God. We wear that instrument of torture and death around our neck, carry it in our pocket, and hang it on our walls. It is only because of distance in time and culture has caused us to not see it in the same light as if it were an electric chair, noose, or lethal injection bed.

Over these last few weeks we have been drawing out the elements of the painting “Victory, O Lord,” which depicts Moses, Aaron, and Hur’s participation in God’s victory

over the Amalekites. We have discussed the need to be supported by the community and to support the community in return. We have discussed that true victory is not found in our own strength but in the work of God. Today, we recognize that the pain, weariness, and fear, in short, the suffering, that of these patriarchs was part of God’s very instrument of victory. Moses and his companions suffered and suffered mightily. Yet, this suffering wasn’t empty or meaningless because God used it for his greater glory.

Suffering is never a good, in itself. Even the crucifixion was not good on its own terms. It, and all suffering, though, can be made good through the work of God. At times, suffering can cause us to question God’s presence, His goodness, perhaps even His existence. I do not know entirely why God allows suffering at all, and I certainly don’t know why God allows particular events of suffering. What I do believe, I do know, is that God does not leave us alone in our suffering. He suffers with us- or to be more accurate- He allows us to suffer with Him.

We are truly the people, the “Nation of the Cross.” This is not our weakness, it is the power of God present even in the worst of places.





“Un mensaje Firmado en Sangre para las Naciones de la Cruz” era el título de un video publicado por el Estado Islámico en el 2015 que documentaba el martirio de veinte Cristianos Coptos, y un hombre, bautizado en sangre ese mismo día. La intención de estos

militantes era burlarse e insultar a todos los Cristianos a través de esta acción. Sin embargo, no pude evitar encontrar el encuadre del evento casi divertido.

Los Cristianos son, de hecho, el pueblo de la cruz. San Pablo lo declara audazmente.

“Los Judios demandan signos y los Griegos desean sabiduria, pero nosotros proclamamos a Cristo crucificado, tropiezo para los Judios y locura para los Gentiles, pero para los llamados, tanto Judios como Griegos, Cristo es poder de Dios y sabiduria de Dios. Porque la necedad de Dios es más sabia que la sabiduria humana, y la debilidad de Dios es más fuerte que la fuerza humana.” (1 Cor. 1:22-24.

Sabemos que la cruz suena tonta, pero lo hemos sabido por más de dos mil años. Pero también sabemos que la cruz ha conquistado a todos los que han intentado destruirla. Somos un pueblo que alaba al Dios crucificado.

Llevamos ese instrument de tortura y muerte al cuello, lo llevamos en el bolsillo y lo colgamos en nuestras paredes. Es solo por la distancia en el tiempo y la cultura que ha hecho que no lo veamos con la misma luz que si fuera una silla eléctrica, una sogá o una cama de inyección letal.

Durante estas últimas semanas hemos estado dibujando los elementos de la pintura “Victoria, O Señor” que representa la participación de Moisés, Aaron y Hur en la Victoria de Dios sobre los Amalecitas. Hemos discutido la necesidad de ser apoyados por la comunidad y de apoyar la comunidad también. Hemos hablado de que la verdadera Victoria no se encuentra en nuestras propias

Fuerzas sino en el trabajo de Dios. Hoy, reconocemos que el dolor, el cansancio y el miedo, en fin, el sufrimiento de estos patriarcas fue parte del instrument mismo de la Victoria de Dios. Moisés y sus compañeros sufrieron y sufrieron poderosamente. Sin embargo, este sufrimiento no fue vacío o sin sentido sino que Dios lo usó para su mayor gloria.

El sufrimiento nunca es Bueno en si mismo. Aún la crucifixion no fue buena en sus propios rérminos. Sin embargo, tanto el como todo el sufrimeinto pueden subsanarse mediante la obra de Dios. A veces el sufrimiento puede hacernos custionar la presencia de Dios. Su bondad, tal vez incluso Su existencia. No se enteramente porqué Dios permite el sufrimiento, y ciertamente no sé porqué Dios permite eventos particulares de sufrimiento. Lo que si creo, lo sé, es que Dios mismo no nos deja solos en nuestro sufrimiento. El sufre con nosotros—o para ser más exactos— El nos permite sufrir con El.

Somos verdaderamente el pueblo, la “Nación de la Cruz.” Esta no es nuestra debilidad, es el poder de Dios presente incluso en los peores lugares.


