

From the Pastor

June 20, 2021



One of the blessings of our Catholic tradition is that it teaches us to engage our faith in a wholistic way. We engage with thoughts, words, and actions; our tradition both respects and demands a fully human response to

God—body and soul. This is true, not only in our call to concertize our faith through service to the poor and marginalized, it is also true in how we pray.

As Catholics we do not pray with only our thoughts or words, but with our bodies too. This is manifest in many ways, through the use of sacred music, incense, bells, sacred art, and the like. It is also manifest in the postures we assume while praying. Standing in respect, sitting in a spirit of receptivity, kneeling in reverence, and prostrating in adoration. Perhaps the most iconic gesture, the thing that most would see and identify as “Catholic,” is the sign of the cross.

The sign of the cross is ubiquitous in our lives of faith. We begin and end every prayer with it. It is used by priests to bless their people and by parents to bless their children. We make the sign of the cross with holy water as we enter the church and while genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament. We make it before taking on a daunting task, in gratitude when surviving peril, and as a prayer of protection against the enemy.

The exact origin of this gesture, this prayer with

our bodies, is uncertain. There is no doubt that it is ancient. Explicit mention of it is made in the 4th century. However, even then, it referred to it as a well established practice.

It is even possible that the practice, in one form or another, finds its origin in apostolic times. The Cappadocian Father, St. Basil the Great, indicated that this practice was taught by the apostles themselves.

In addition to its antiquity, the sign of the cross is a prayer with power. In the 4th century, St. Cyril of Jerusalem spoke of this saying: “Let us make the sign of the Cross boldly and courageously. When the demons see it, they are reminded of the Crucified; they take flight; they hide themselves and leave us.”


It is for this reason that goes on to exhort the faithful saying: “Let the sign of the cross be continually made on the heart, on the mouth, on the forehead, at table, at the bath, in bed, coming in and going out, in joy and sadness, sitting, standing, speaking, walking—in short, in all our actions. Let us make it on our breasts and all our members, that we may be entirely covered with this invincible armor of Christians.”

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever!





THE BEATITUDES: *Blessed (happy) are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.* Dr. Pitre explains “Who is Jesus describing here? Well he’s describing those who literally are starving or thirsting for righteousness and justice. The Greek word here for righteousness, *dikaioisune*, has both those meanings: righteousness, in the sense of holiness, being right with God, but also justice, in the sense of doing right toward others. Obviously if you look around the world there are innumerable acts of injustice, an unimaginable amount of sin and a lack of holiness, and so what Jesus says here is that those who hunger and thirst, who are starving for justice in the world, they will be satisfied, they will be filled.”

POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS ON BLESSED ARE THOSE WHO HUNGER AND THIRST “The Scriptures speak of the suffering of the poor and oppressed which God knows and shares. For having listened to the cry of the oppression raised by the children of Israel (cf. Ex3:7-10) God descended to free his people. But the hunger and thirst for righteousness’ sake that the Lord refers to is even more profound than the legitimate need for human justice that each man and woman carries in his/her heart...In this Beatitude, Jesus announces – hunger and thirst for righteousness – which is a thirst that will not be disappointed; a thirst that, if supported, will be satisfied and always have a positive outcome because it corresponds with God’s own heart.” (General Audience Wednesday, March 11 2020)

ST. MOTHER TERESA SPEAKS: “If the poor die of hunger, it is not because God does not care for them. Rather, it is because neither you nor I are generous enough. It is because we are not instruments of love in the hands of God. We do not recognize Christ when once again He appears to us in the hungry man, in the lonely woman, in the child who is looking for a place to get warm.” *Do Something Beautiful For God, June 7 reflection.*

REFLECT & ACT: Do I seek to become holier? Do I recognize that learning to love God means also to love my fellow man? Jesus shares this when he says in Matthew 22:36-40 that the greatest commandment is to love God and the second is to love one’s neighbor. What do I do to love my neighbor? Do I donate to charities that help the poor in my community and around the world? Do I see people from other countries, cultures, languages as being beloved children of God? Do I judge those who are not like me in culture, class, religion, politics? Do I support laws that treat all people as equal and that promote justice and fairness?



completamente humana hacia Dios-cuerpo y alma. Esto es cierto, no solo en nuestro llamado a concertar nuestra fe a través del servicio a los pobres y marginados, sino también en la forma que oramos. Como Católicos no solo oramos con nuestros pensamientos o palabras, sino también con nuestros cuerpos. Esto se manifiesta de muchas maneras, a través del uso de la música sagrada, incienso, las campanas, arte sagrado, y cosas por el estilo. También se manifiesta en las posturas que asumimos mientras oramos. De pie por respeto, sentados en un espíritu de receptividad, hincados en reverencia, y postrados en adoración. Quizá el gesto más icónico lo que la mayoría vería e identificaría como “Católicos” es el signo de la cruz. La señal de la cruz es omnipresente en nuestras vidas de fe. El exacto origen de este gesto, esta oración con nuestros cuerpos, es incierta. No hay duda de que es muy Antigua. Una mención explícita fue hecha en el siglo 4to. forma o de otra, encuentre su origen en tiempos apostólicos. El Padre Capadocio, San Basilio el Grande, indicó que esta

Práctica fue enseñada por los mismos apóstoles.

Además de su antigüedad, el signo de la cruz es una oración con poder. En el siglo IV, San Cirilo de Jerusalén habló acerca de esto diciendo: “Hagamos la señal de la cruz con Valentia. Cuando los demonios la vean, se van acordar del Crucificado; se echan a volar, se esconden y nos dejan.”

Es por eso que continúa exhortando a los fieles diciendo: Que la señal de la cruz se haga continuamente en el corazón, en la boca, en la frente, en la mesa, en el baño, en la cama, entrando y saliendo, en la alegría y tristezas, sentado, de pie, hablando, caminando-en breve, en definitiva, en todas nuestras acciones. Hagámoslo en nuestros pechos y en todos nuestros miembros para que estemos enteramente cubiertos con esta invencible armadura de Cristianos.”




