

From the Pastor

July 18, 2021



I'm actually writing this particular letter at the beginning of July, shortly after having prepared my homily for the weekend, the 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The Gospel for

this Sunday is Mark 6:1-6. It speaks of the brothers and sisters of Christ—a reference that is often used by Protestants to trip up Catholics who hold Mary to be a perpetual virgin. How, then, do we as Catholics respond when this passage is pointed out to us?

First, we must ascertain the possible meanings of the word? The word is the Greek, “adelphos.” Adelfhos can mean brother, but can also mean “relative” or “kin.” For example, in Genesis, Abraham and Lot were called “adelphos” though we know that Abraham was Lot’s uncle. Also, in 1 Chronicles, we hear that two blood brothers “adelphos” named Eleazar and Kish, each got married and had kids. Eleazar had only daughters and Kish had sons. Then the text says that the sons of Kish married their “adelphos,” who were the daughters of Eleazar. In this case, adelphos explicitly refers to cousins. So it is clear that though the term can mean “blood brother;” it can also mean “relatives” or “kin.”

Second, how do we know which translation of “adelphos” is correct in Mark 6? The key

to answering this is provided by the naming of the “adelphos” - James and Joses and Judas and Simon. This is key because we learn later in this same Gospel (Mark 14:49, Mark 14:47, and Mark 16:1) that James and Joses were the sons of a different Mary! Who is this other Mary? If we go to the Gospel of John, she is further identified as Mary the wife of Clopas and the Virgin Mary’s sister. Clopas, therefore, would be Jesus’ uncle.

Of further interest is that, at least two of these “adelphos,” cousins of Jesus became bishops in the early church. In particular James and Simon were the first two bishop’s of Jerusalem.

In summary, though Protestants often use this passage referring to the brothers of Jesus to show that the Catholic Church is wrong in affirming Our Lady’s perpetual virginity, this reference actually strengthens our position. Why? Because if early Church writers were willing, not only to mention the close relatives of Jesus, but to actually name them (his uncles, cousins, etc.), what are the chances that they would fail to mention his actual biological siblings if he had them? Slim to none it seems to me.

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever!

THE BEATITUDES: BLESSED ARE THEY WHO ARE PERSECUTED FOR THE SAKE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS Dr. Brant Pitre adds in his discussion on the Beatitudes 'Then finally the most paradoxical, strangest and surprising of all of Jesus' Beatitudes is the eighth Beatitude, when he says, "happy are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness." So this would describe any group or any person who is slandered or falsely accused or reviled specifically for either the sake of righteousness, in other words for those doing the right thing, or, Jesus goes on to say, for his sake, in other words for bearing witness to Christ, for being a disciple."

POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS ON THE BEATITUDES:
"Today we conclude our catechesis on the Beatitudes with the final Beatitude: "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:10). All the attitudes contained in the Beatitudes, when lived for Christ, can lead to oppression by the world; yet ultimately this persecution is a cause of joy in heaven. The way of the Beatitudes is an Easter path, leading us from selfishness to a life guided by the Spirit. We see this in the saints who show that the experience of persecution can set the Christian free from worldly compromise. Tragically, today many of our brothers and sisters still face persecution, and we express our closeness to them. May we too always remain, "salt of the earth", lest by losing the "taste" of the Gospel we lead others to disdain it. By God's grace, whatever trials we do face can draw us to become more like Christ, who leads us to new life." (General Audience, 4/49/2020).

REFLECT: Have I ever been ridiculed or been put down because I have stood up for the faith in some way? How did I react? If I have never been ridiculed because of my faith, is it because I have never stood up for it? Am I hesitant to speak out for what I believe, in case someone disagrees with me? Do I believe that faith should be a "personal" thing – not to be talked about with others who may not agree with me?

ACT: Learn about and pray for Christians worldwide who live in countries where they face severe persecution. OPEN DOORS, and NGO, recently released its annual World Wide List of the top 50 countries where Christians face the most severe types of persecution: 1 in 8 worldwide, 1 in 6 in Africa, 2 of 5 in Asia, 1 in 12 in Latin America.

Saint Lawrence of Brindisi | July 21
Lawrence was born on July 22, 1559, and died on his birthday in 1619. When he was 16, he entered the Capuchin Order and was ordained a priest at 23. He mastered several languages, and was able to study the Bible in its original texts. At the request of Pope Clement VIII, he spent much time preaching to the Jews in Italy. So excellent was his knowledge of Hebrew, the rabbis felt sure he was a Jew who had become a Christian. He had the combination of brilliance, human compassion, and administrative skill needed to carry out his duties and was promoted to minister general of the Capuchins and papal emissary and peacemaker, a job which took him to a number of foreign countries. An effort to achieve peace in his native kingdom of Naples took him on a journey to Lisbon to visit the king of Spain. Serious illness in Lisbon took his life in 1619. St Lawrence, pray for us! Actualmente estoy escribiendo esta carta particular al comienzo del mes de Julio, poco después de haber preparado mi homilia para el fin de semana, el 14 Domingo del tiempo Ordinario. El Evangelio para este Domingo es Marcos

Santiago, Joset, Judas y Simón. Esta es clave porque aprenderemos más tarde en este mismo Evangelio (Marcos 14:49 y Marcos 14:47. y Marcos 16:1) que Santiago y Joset eran hijos de una Maria diferente! Quién es esta otra

Maria? Si vamos al Evangelio de Juan, ella es identificada como Maria la esposa de Cleofas y hermana de la Virgen Maria. Cleofas, por lo tanto, seria el tío de Jesús.

De mayor interés es que, al menos dos de estos “adelphos”, primos de Jesús se convirtieron en obispos en la Iglesia Primitiva. En particular Santiago y Simón fueron los primeros dos obispos de Jerusalén.

En resumen, aunque los Protestantes utilizan a menudo este pasaje refiriéndose a los hermanos de Jesús para enseñar que la Iglesia Católica está mal al afirmar la virginidad perpetua de Nuestra Señora, esta referencia actualmente fortalece nuestra posición.

Porqué? Porque si los escritores de la Iglesia primitiva estaban dispuestos, no solo a mencionar a los parientes más cercanos de Jesús, sino actualmente nombrarlos (sus tios, primos, etc.), cuales serian las posibilidades de que no mencionaran a sus hermanos biológicos reales si los tuviera? Me parece que no tendrian ninguna razón para no mencionarlos.

6: 1-6. Habla acerca de los hermanos y hermanas de Cristo—una referencia que utilizan a menudo los Protestantes para hacer tropezar a los Católicos que consideran que Maria es una virgen perpetua. Entonces, nosotros como Católicos, como respondemos cuando se nos señala este pasaje?

Primero, debemos determinar los posibles significados del mundo? La palabra griega es “adelphos.” Adelfhos puede significar hermano, pero también quiere decir “parientes”. Por ejemplo, en Genesis, Abraham y Lot fueron llamados “adelphos” aunque sabemos que Abraham era el tío de Lot. También en 1a. De Crónicas, escuchamos que dos hermanos de sangre “adelphos” llamados Eleazar y Kish, cada uno se casó y tuvieron hijos. Eleazar tuvo solamente hijas y Kish tuvo solo hijos. El texto dice que los hijos de Kish se casaron con “adelphos” que eran las hijas de Eleazar. En este caso, adelphos explicitamente se refiere a primos. Está claro que aunque el término quiere decir “hijos de sangre,” también quiere decir “parientes.”

En Segundo lugar, como podemos saber que traducción de “adelphos” es correcta en Marcos 6? La clave para responder a esto la proporciona el nombre de los “adelphos” -
