

From the Pastor

When reflecting on the saints, we tend to be drawn to the miraculous aspects of their lives. We love to focus on the moments when they levitate, cast out demons, have mystical visions, cure the sick, turn back invading armies,

bilocate, manifest the stigmata, or make prophetic statements about the future.

It is natural that we are drawn to these extraordinary supernatural manifestations of sanctity. However, it is often at the cost of missing the natural, yet still extraordinary, manifestations of holiness in their lives. That is tragic. It is tragic because the saints are given to us by the Church as models to emulate, and not simply venerate.

As much as we may marvel at the supernatural manifestations of sanctity in their lives, we can't choose to imitate the supernatural. Those graces are given completely at the discretion of the Divine Majesty. For example, I can't practice or grow in my ability to bilocate (as much as I would like that!). I can rejoice in such supernatural gifts, but I cannot emulate them.

However, I can seek to emulate the natural manifestations of sanctity in the lives of the saints. The tendency to overlook the natural manifestations because of our preference for the supernatural can be seen in our common reaction to St. Juan Diego. Most people are familiar with the story of this young indigenous man who, while walking by Tepeyac hill, had a miraculous encounter with the Blessed Virgin Mary. This encounter would ultimately lead to the curing of his sick uncle, the blooming of roses out of

season, the presentation of those roses to the local bishop, the revelation of the image of our Lady of Guadalupe (inexplicably present on Juan Diego's outer garment), the building of a shrine dedicated to Our Lady on the location of the apparition, and the conversion of millions from pagan Aztec religious practices to faith in Jesus Christ.

However, in focusing on these miraculous occurrences, most Christians fail to notice the extraordinary, heroic virtue manifested in the life of Juan Diego. This heroic virtue is revealed by asking a simple question: what was Juan Diego doing on the day of the first apparition as he walked by Tepeyac hill? Juan Diego, at 57 years of age, was walking barefoot, nine miles, to Mass.

This would be an extraordinary manifestation of virtue, of devotion to the Lord's sacrifice present upon the altar, if he did this every week to fulfill his Sunday obligation. However, this was not the case. No, St. Juan Diego would rise before dawn, walk nine miles barefoot (one way), in order to attend daily Mass.

Though it is unlikely that we will ever find ourselves in a situation in which we need to walk 18 miles for our Lord on Sundays, let alone barefoot for daily Mass, St. Juan Diego is a powerful example for us. He is an example of devotion to the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist—an example that the church proposes to us, not merely for our veneration, but our emulation.

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever!



Our Pastor, Fr. Nicks, has asked our Walla Walla Catholic Schools to oversee the faith formation of members of our English speaking Walla Walla community. The school has asked Mrs. Anne Guest to fill the role of Director of Religious Education (DRE). Please contact her with any questions about the program.

Sacramental Prep

Our Sacramental Preparation program is a two year program. In year one students will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In year two students will receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharistic.

CATHOLIC SCHOOL
Students enrolled at Walla Walla Catholic Schools will complete their Sacramental Prep classes during school hours. Students are still required to register with the DRE for record keeping purposes. Students will also participate in parish-wide retreats.

NON-CATHOLIC SCHOOL
Students not enrolled in Catholic School can complete their Sacramental Preparation by either using a homeschool program or enrolling in our parish classes. Homeschool students are still required to register with the DRE for record keeping purposes and program approval. Students will also participate in parish-wide retreats.

General Catechesis

Our goal for the 2021-22 school year is to offer K-5 catechesis. The number of classes will depend on students registered and available catechists.

Parent Formation

Our goal for the 2021-22 school year is to offer optional weekly parent faith formation with some mandatory classes pertaining to the sacraments. This of course will depend on available catechists.

STEWARDSHIP OF VOCATION:

"Jesus calls us as his disciples to a new way of life – the Christian way of life – of which stewardship is a part. But Jesus does not call us as nameless people to a faceless crowd. CARTA DEL PARROCO
5 DE SEPTIEMBRE DEL 2021



Cuando reflexionamos en los santos, tendemos a ser atraídos hacia los aspectos milagrosos de sus vidas. Nos gusta enfocarnos en los momentos que hacen grandes cosas como, expulsar demonios, tienen visiones místicas,

sanan al enfermo, volver atrás ejércitos invasores, estar en dos lugares al mismo tiempo, manifestar la stigmata, o tener declaraciones proféticas acerca del futuro.

Es natural que nos sintamos atraídos a estas manifestaciones extraordinarias supernaturales de santidad. Sin embargo, a menudo es a costa de perderse las manifestaciones no sobrenaturales de la santidad, aún así, hay manifestaciones extraordinarias de santidad en sus vidas. Eso es trágico. Es trágico porque los santos se nos han dado por la iglesia como modelos para imitar, no simplemente para venerar. Por mucho que podamos maravillarnos de las manifestaciones sobrenaturales de la santidad en sus vidas, no podemos escoger imitar lo sobrenatural. Esas gracias son completamente a la discreción de la Divina Majestad. Por ejemplo, no puedo practicar o crecer en mi habilidad de bilocar (estar en dos lugares al mismo tiempo) por mucho que quisiera eso. Me puedo regocijar en tales regalos sobrenaturales, pero no imitarlos.

Sin embargo, podemos buscar imitar las manifestaciones de santidad que no son sobrenaturales en las vidas de los santos. La tendencia a pasar por alto lo no sobrenatural debido a nuestra preferencia por lo sobrenatural se puede ver en nuestra reacción común a San Juan Diego. La mayoría de la gente están familiarizados con la historia de este joven indígena que, caminando por el monte del Tepeyac, tuvo un encuentro milagroso con la

Bendita Virgen María.

Este encuentro llevaría ultimadamente a la sanación de su tío enfermo, las rosas florecientes fuera de temporada, la presentación de esas rosas al Obispo local, la revelación de la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe (inexplicablemente presente en la tilma de Juan Diego), la capilla dedicada a Nuestra Señora en el Lugar de la aparición, y la conversión de millones, de ser Aztecas paganos practicantes religiosos, a la fe en Jesucristo. Sin embargo, en este torrente de acontecimientos milagrosos, la mayoría de los Cristianos no se dieron cuenta de lo extraordinario, la virtud heroica manifestada en la vida de Juan Diego. Esta virtud heroica surge al hacer una simple pregunta. Que es lo que estaba haciendo Juan Diego el día de la primera aparición cuando pasó por el monte del Tepeyac? Juan Diego, a sus 57 años de edad, estaba caminando descalzo, nueve millas para ir a Misa. Sin embargo, este no era el caso. No, San Juan Diego se levantaba antes de que amaneciera, caminaba nueve millas descalzo (una sola ida), para asistir a Misa todos los días. Aunque es poco probable que nos encontremos a nosotros mismos en una situación en la cual necesitemos caminar un total de 18 millas para Nuestro Señor en Domingos, mucho menos descalzos para ir a Misa diariamente, San Juan Diego es un ejemplo poderoso para nosotros. El es un ejemplo de devoción al Sacrificio de la Misa y de la Presencia Real del Señor en la Eucaristía—un ejemplo que la Iglesia nos propone, no meramente para nuestra veneración, sino para nuestra imitación.
