From the Pastor January 2, 2021



Happy Solemnity of our Lord's Epiphany! **Traditionally** celebrated on the 6th day of January. conclude the 12 Days of Christmas. However, to encourage greater

participation in this great feast day, the bishops of our country have allowed its celebration to be moved to this Sunday.

The word Epiphany comes from Greek (with a similar pronunciation) and means "to appear" or "be revealed." Therefore, today we celebrate the appearance or the revelation of Jesus. This feast initially celebrated four different epiphanies or revelations of Jesus: his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his Baptism in the Jordan, and his first miracle and Cana.

At his birth, the angels announced the coming of a savior to the shepherds around Bethlehem. The humble shepherds became the representatives of God's chosen people, Israel. These shepherds made their way to the manger and beheld their infant messiah. Thus, this first epiphany was the revelation of Christ to the chosen people of Israel.

The second epiphany is the one we most closely associate with today's feast. It occurred through the miraculous guidance of a star. Led by this star, Magi from the East came to encounter the child-king, adore him, and present precious gifts of Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh. These Wisemen represented the nations outside of Israel. Therefore, the second epiphany was the revelation of Christ to the

nations of the world.

The third epiphany occurred when our Lord was grown and went to be baptized by John in the Jordan. Following his baptism, the Holy Spirit descended upon him in the form of a dove. The voice of the Father spoke from the the Epiphany would heavens and announced that Christ was his Son. In this way the third epiphany revealed to the world, the relationship of Christ to God the Father.

> The final epiphany occurred at the wedding feast of Cana. Here, at the request of his mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Lord performed his first miracle. By his own power, he changed water into wine. This act of power became the fourth epiphany through which Christ was revealed to be not just a savior, nor just a king, nor just the chosen one of the Father, but Divine. He was revealed to be God himself.

These four epiphanies were each so beautiful and important that, with time, they began to occupy their own feast days. For example, the birth of Jesus is now celebrated as its own feast on Christmas Day and the Baptism of our Lord is the third Sunday following Christmas. Though some of the Lord's epiphanies now occupy their own days, on today's feast the Church calls her children to be mindful of all the ways in which Jesus has revealed himself to us, both as a people and in our individual lives.

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever!







CARTA DEL PARROCO JANUARY 2ND 2022



¡Feliz solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor! Celebrada tradicionalmente el día 6 de enero, la Epifanía concluiría los 12 días de Navidad. Sin embargo, para fomentar una mayor participación en esta gran fiesta, los

obispos de nuestro país han permitido trasladar su celebración a este domingo.

La palabra Epifanía proviene del griego (con una pronunciación similar) y significa "aparecer" o "ser revelado". Por eso, hoy celebramos la aparición o revelación de Jesús. Esta fiesta celebró inicialmente cuatro epifanías o revelaciones diferentes de Jesús: su nacimiento en Belén, la visita de los magos, su bautismo en el Jordán y su primer milagro y Caná.

En su nacimiento, los ángeles anunciaron la llegada de un salvador a los pastores de Belén. Los humildes pastores se convirtieron en representantes del pueblo escogido de Dios, Israel. Estos pastores se dirigieron al pesebre y contemplaron a su mesías infantil. Así, esta primera epifanía fue la revelación de Cristo al pueblo escogido de Israel.

La segunda epifanía es la más cercana a la fiesta de hoy. Ocurrió a través de la guía milagrosa de una estrella. 




