St. Charles offers several opportunities in the area of Faith Formation.. # Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



## The Beginning of Ordinary Time

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord (on January 9, 2022) brings to a close the Season of Christmas. The very next day the Church will begin the first week of Ordinary Time. What do we think of when we hear Ordinary Time? It does not mean "regular" or "nothing special." Ordinary refers to the "order" of this time. There are 33-34 weeks of Ordinary Time each year. Ordinary Time is part of the liturgical year that falls outside the two great seasons of Christmas and Easter, and their preparatory seasons of Advent and Lent. The children in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd recognize green as the color of Ordinary Time.

#### Parables of the Kingdom

The word parable means "laid beside." The Kingdom of God is known by laying beside it, certain elements from daily life, i.e. a mustard seed, a precious pearl, leaven, hidden treasure, etc. Unlike a simile, the parable contains the truth revealed by the comparison. The parables are not just comparisons or indicating that something is like something else. In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd this month, the children and their catechists will spend time reflecting on and discovering the richness, the value, and the mystery of the Kingdom of God.

### Prayer and The Kingdom of God

The parables are the usual teaching method of Jesus in the gospels. Jesus explains the Kingdom of God many, many times. There are 45 parables in the New Testament about the Kingdom. The prayer Jesus taught his disciples to pray also speaks about the Kingdom. We pray it every week in our liturgy: "Thy Kingdom come; thy will be done." What do we think of when we hear or read about the "The Kingdom of God"? Have we thought about how God's Kingdom will come? What is God's will regarding His Kingdom?

### The Presentation in the Temple and Simeon's Prayer

Simeon was an old man, and a very holy man, who waited for the Messiah to come. Jesus is an infant in this story, and he does not proclaim his own greatness. As Simeon took the infant Jesus in his arms, he blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." How are we called to be like Simeon? Can we believe in and recognize God's presence in the world and be the one who proclaims it by word and deed?

## SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER MINISTRY BEGINS THIS MONTH!

Please join us as we pray for pregnant moms and their babies. This weekend (1/22 & 1/23) we continue the kick-off of our 10-month prayer cycle of Spiritual Adoption. The plan is simple: say the prayer of Spiritual Adoption every day, now through October.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph. I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion.

To focus your prayer, we recommend that you name your baby. There is space on the prayer cards (available in the main vestibule and rear exits) to add a baby name. If you want to share your baby's name, we will have small, paper hearts available in the main vestibule on which to write his/her name(s). We will collect the hearts and add them to a special poster to display each month during Spiritual Adoption weekends from February through October.
