DO YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW NEED TO RECEIVE AN ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

Contrary to belief, an anointing is not just for those who are actively dying. One can receive an anointing if they are severely ill, are about to have surgery, are actively dying or any other emergency circumstances. Although we know that it is not always possible to give ample notice for an anointing, if possible we ask to not wait until the last minute so we can ensure priests are able to make it in time. If you are in need of an anointing please call Jessica at 253-564-5185 ext. 3013. If you are in need of an anointing for someone who is actively dying (outside office hours), please call the emergency line at 253-564-5185 and press 3. Attending Saturday or Sunday Mass and need an anointing? No problem. Fr. Michael and Fr. Marc welcome you to be anointed after any Mass! 
On the third weekend of each month, we will display a "Developmental Milestones Poster" and our "Babies' Names Poster" in the church.
