

Musings from the Bee Yard & Other Wonderful Places
We are at the heights of summer. So much is in bloom and the
honeybees are hitting their zenith of colony growth. Summer is here and
nature brings on its full beauty & joy, while simultaneous preparation
begins for the dark days to come. Life towards death and then new life
again! The seasons are a circle and around and around we go.

I think most of our hives seem to be in good shape: stable populations, reasonably good reserves of food and no signs of disease. But with some, death will take them as it is their time. Somehow, they know that. They have done their best. For them it is now time for the drones to fly, the queen is no more, and workers fade into history till there is none. It is the work of the drone. They all eventually leave the hive to mate with some yet to be found queen from another hive to pass on the genes of the now dead hive, looking like the vacant Tomb of Christ. Yes, Christ has risen – Life begins a new in a different way. Honeybees teach me not to lose Hope!

Nothing stays the same except Faith, Hope and Love. If we hold fast to anything else; if we try to possess a thing we think is ours, we are only holding on to disappointment. I try to learn from honeybees. Live out the seasons with grit and joy, then leave all else to future generations and to the Wisdom of the Creator.

Flowers are amazing. They provide food for the bees while giving us their wonderful fragrances, fantastic colors, and creative designs! We use them to brighten up our homes and adorn our churches. On feast days, children with flowers in procession head to the alter in praise of God! Always a joy. However, I have always been saddened by our disregard for aged flowers, since WE think they no longer have value. When they are vibrant, we process them with great pomp and circumstance, but then we toss them, with no regard, into the trash.

Old flowers, they too can teach us of the circle of life – the story of death and resurrection. Not wanting the flowers to suffer the indignant fate of being dismissed into the trash, we now foster their full circle of life in dignity by composting them. It may sound silly or inconvenient, but it is an important act of kindness and a connection to the wonders of God's Creation. Our "Modern Culture" is toxic to life! It tells us that only comfort, convenience, possession and fear matter. That is wrong and not of Christ. Christ teaches us by his incarnation into our world that all is sacred, interconnected and can teach us of God! Caring for withered flowers can be a teachable moment, revealing the wonders of life, rebirth and our interconnections. At St. Charles and at St. Leo's we now collect those old flowers and help them compost into something new and life giving. Such a nice Christian message indeed!

Frederic recognized and responded to the needs around him, promoting acts of generosity and service that fit each person's individual circumstances, while going on home visits and inviting prayer for guidance in sharing blessings with others.

Every month, we distribute between \$9,000 and \$11,000, and with more resources, our impact could grow even further. Each week is different in the number of individuals and families we serve.

In the last week in May we touch the lives of around 82 individuals and families. Just this past week, we had the privilege of helping a dedicated mom with four children restore their water supply, showing that together, we can make a difference.

Anointing of the Sick

Contrary to belief, an anointing is not just for those who are actively dying. One can receive an anointing if they are severely ill, are about to have surgery, are actively dying or any other emergency circumstances. Although we know that it is not always possible to give ample notice for an anointing, if possible we ask to not wait until the last minute so we can ensure priests are able to make it in time.

If you are in need of an anointing please call Cathy at 253-564-5185 ext. 3011. If you are in need of an anointing for someone who is actively dying (outside office hours), please call the emergency line at 253-564-5185 and press 3.

Pregnancy Aid of Tacoma is a 501c3 non-profit organization, our services are free, and our staff are all Catholic volunteers. We serve the well-being of families with children in the womb to five years old by providing material and emotional support in the Tacoma area for over 50 years. Last year Pregnancy Aid served over 300 clients of which 136 were new clients. We gave out over 30,000 diapers, 70 newborn layettes, and gave out over 90 large baby items (cribs, strollers, highchairs, swings, etc.).
