



Staff Retreat: Joy and Hope A message from the Pastor

Last week, our pastoral staff went on retreat with three goals: 1) increase our openness to the Holy Spirit,
2) strengthen our relationship with one another and 3) grow in our ability to serve our parish family of
St. Leo and St. Charles. It was such a good experience, I want to share it with you.

We started by reflecting on the Church's teachings about the importance of helping the faithful to grow in their ability to live out the call they received in Baptism to share in the ministry of Christ. The only way that we can serve the tens of thousands of people in our parish boundary, is if each of us answers our call from Jesus sharing the Gospel with our family, neighbors and community.

We then listened to each other and appreciated the gifts and experiences of our parish staff. We are truly blessed to have this team. This faithful, talented and enjoyable group is committed to responding to the challenges coming our way.

We also reflected on how the Church calls us to recognize the joys, griefs, hopes and fears of our parish community as the joys, griefs, hopes and fears of Christ (Gaudium et Spes 1). I know the changes of this last year have been big. The Jesuits cared for St. Leo for 100+ years. Fr. Mike shepherded St. Charles for 24 years. Neither of our parishes expected to be joined together as a parish family. It's natural that those changes would cause grief.

It's also natural to have anxiety. Will we have enough vocations to the priesthood for the future? Will we lose what we love about our parishes? Will our children keep the faith?

But we found the joys and hopes spoke so much more powerfully to us. Joy from the children gathering at the altar at the Sunday Masses. Joy from the encounter with God in creation our youth group experienced on our Youth Pilgrimages this summer. And joy from the new families joining our parish.

We see many signs of hope too. Mercy 253, a St. Charles ministry to the poor, is already exploring ways to grow this ministry, as well as minister to the poor amongst the St. Leo campus. Our Young Adult ministry is taking off in new ways and responding to an emerging hunger for faith among our young people. The Holy Spirit is working in our community and it is a joy to be part of that work.

Thank you for your support of our wonderful parish staff. We look forward to serving you in this year to come!




Ministry Spotlight: Millions of Monicas



The Archdiocese of Seattle has a 2 year preparation process for our children to prepare for the sacraments of penance and First Communion. Children age 7, are ready to begin this journey so, when your child is in the First grade, they should enroll in our Family of Faith program if they are not in a Catholic School. This begins their preparation process. In their 2nd grade year, they should enroll in Family of Faith and take part in our Family-At Home preparation for the Sacrament.

Youth Confirmation




Confirmation is the sacrament of initiation in which a baptized person receives special gifts of the Holy Spirit and is strengthened in grace. Students in grades 7-12 are invited to prepare for this sacrament. We will be meeting on select Tuesday evenings, and monthly Sunday afternoons. Our first class will be October 7th.

Becoming Catholic - Children



OCIC stands for Order of Christian Initiation of Children. OCIC is the process whereby children ages 9 -13 may be initiated into and fully enter the Catholic Church. It is for non-Catholic children who have not completed their own sacraments of initiation. Children should register and attend Family of Faith classes, as well as attend select Wednesday evening sessions.

Breaking Open the Word THE IGNATIAN WAY

Ministry formation programs for BIPOC and Young Adults

Rooted in the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, The Ignatian Way is a dual-track nine-month program that forms emerging leaders for public ministry in preaching and spiritual companionship, while nutruing care for the whole person with retreats and regular prayer.



IGNATIAN WAY PREACHERS

The Ignatian Way Preachers program forms persons to break open the Word with imagination, justice, and spiritual depth. The process nurtures authentic, culturally relevant proclamation for today's diverse communities.

IGNATIAN WAY SPIRITUAL COMPANIONS

The Ignatian Way Spiritual Companions program forms persons to listen, share the Word, and guide prayer in one-on-one and group settings. The process prepares them to guide others with authenticity, spiritual depth, and attention to God's movement.

PARTICIPANTS CAN EXPECT

- Experiential learning of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius
- Care for the whole person through retreats, rest, and prayer
- One-on-one coaching (Preachers) or spiritual direction (Spiritual Companions)
- · Enriched learning through small cohorts of diverse participants
- · A funded year-end individual or team project
- Structured support for their ministry after the formation year

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

The Ignatian Way formation programs are open to BIPOC and young adult individuals who are committed to sharing their faith with others: emerging leaders, lay ministers, pastors, teachers, spiritual directors, chaplains, and others who seek to deepen a call to ministry in their community.





