




<u>Baptism</u>: Go to our parish website to fill out the proper paperwork. After we receive your information, you will be contacted to schedule an appointment.

IRA Charitable Rollover

Congress has reauthorized and made permanent the IRA charitable rollover. If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can make a charitable gift of up to \$100,000 from your IRA. Your gift will qualify for your required minimum distribution and you will not have to pay federal income tax on the amount given directly from your IRA to charity. Synod




Youth Faith Formation


Middle School students meet on Wednesday from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM in the St. Thomas More gym, except for the first Wednesday of each month—see above note.

made it possible for us to serve these families:


- We received nonperishable food donations to fill the baskets.
