

After 14 years of providing nightly Winter Season Shelter to people who are unhoused in North King County, Lake City Partners opened The Oaks in Shoreline. The Oaks serves 60 unhoused single adults and couples, and their pets, in the 24/7 year-round enhanced shelter. This new shelter location is a supportive springboard for residents to move into permanent housing. There will be collection bins in Jubilee Hall and in the Parish Office that will accept donations of through Jan. 2nd:

- new undergarments in all sizes: t-shirts, socks and underwear
- personal care and dental hygiene items for both men and women
- new or gently used warm and/or waterproof clothing
