

CHANGE IN DISPENSATION FOR SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OBLIGATION

Archbishop Etienne has announced that the **dispensation** for obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will be **removed effective** Wednesday, **December 8**th—the **Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (CCC 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. We welcome everyone back to regular Mass attendance.

CATECHISM CORNER — From the desk of Mike Acheson

The Year of St. Joseph has come to a close. For those looking to increase your knowledge and understanding of St. Joseph I highly recommend Father Donald Calloway's "Consecration to St. Joseph – The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father." Informative, entertaining, and spiritually enriching this definitive account will lead you to this saint, as it should be.

Why do we look to saints, why do we pray to them? It is a good question, one my niece asked me recently. "Saints are dead," she said. My niece comes from an evangelical/bible only faith background. Saints no longer occupy earthly bodies but they are certainly not dead. Saint Dominic said on his deathbed, "Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." St. Therese of Lisieux said, "I want to spend my heaven in doing good on earth." (CCC 956)

A vast number of saints have said similar things. Recall the Transfiguration (Lk 9:28) where Moses and Elijah spoke to Jesus and appeared to Peter, James and John; Peter offered to build sleeping quarters for Moses and Elijah. These Old Testament men were very much alive.

In Luke 20:27 the Sadducees try to trick Jesus with regards to the resurrection of the dead, with Jesus responding, "He is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive."

Each morning I greet St. Bernadette as I pray for my daughters. I know she hears me and intercedes for me.

According to official records during World War II there were 2,579 Catholic priests in Dachau concentration camp, and of those 1,034 died there. On December 8, 1940, the priests in Dachau made a communal act of consecration to St. Joseph, asking him to help them survive their ordeal and save them from death. These priests went to St. Joseph because St. Joseph saved Jesus from Herod who was hunting Him. The priests in Dachau frequently renewed their consecration, as well as praying novenas to him. Liberated in 1945, the surviving priests testified it was St. Joseph who was responsible for their survival. A shrine was built in Kalisz, Poland in honor of St. Joseph and the priests of Dachau, and where Pope John Paul II visited and preached a "stirring" homily in thanksgiving.

The Saints, "do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and men, Christ Jesus." (CCC 956) Speak to the saints respectfully as they are the vanguards of heroic virtue, a high bar for sure, but we were created for nothing less.

SUNDAY DEVOTIONS | A MEDITATION ON NEXT WEEK'S MASS READINGS

December 26, 2021 | The Most Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

First Reading— This reading comes from a longer section that focuses on the respect that children owe their parents. Those who honor their parents, even in their old age, will enjoy many blessings from God, including forgiveness of sin and a long and satisfying life. We should remember, as well, that the command to honor one's father and mother is the first of the Ten Commandments focused on what it means to love our neighbors. [Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14]

Responsorial Psalm—"Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord." [Psalm 84]

Second Reading— The third chapter of 1 John focuses mostly on the concept of love. Because of His love, God not only calls us His children, He actually makes us His children. John also explains how sin, including hate, is never the result of a proper relationship with God. Christians, in contrast to the world, are supposed to do more than simply "feel" love; we are to act on it, as well. [1]ohn 3:1-2, 21-24]

Gospel—The Holy Family attended Passover every year in Jerusalem, as was custom for pious Jews. When on such pilgrimages, men and women travelled in different caravans, which then joined together in the evening; young boys travelled with their mothers, while older boys travelled with the men. When Jesus was twelve, His parents left Jerusalem after the Passover, but He stayed behind, listening to the teachers and asking them questions.

When they set out, Mary and Joseph both thought that He was in the other caravan, and only discovered the mistake in the evening. They rushed back to Jerusalem and discovered Jesus in the Temple, astonishing the scholars by His understanding. Jesus seemed puzzled that His parents did not understand that He had to remain in the Temple this time. Mary pondered over these things as Jesus returned with them. He obeyed His parents and "grew in wisdom, stature and favor with God and man."
