CHANGES IN POSTURE AT MASS—REVIEW/REMINDER

In Advent 2020, Archbishop Etienne, decreed that the Archdiocese of Seattle will be in conformity with the rest of America during the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the Communion Rite at Mass. It is proper and fitting that we should kneel before the majesty of God, so with that in mind, we should be using the following postures:

- ⇒ **Kneel** after the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy);
- ⇒ **Stand** after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer;
- ⇒ **Kneel** after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) and remain kneeling until you go forward for Communion;
- ⇒ **Bow** before receiving the Body or Blood of Christ;
- ⇒ **Remain standing** to receive Holy Communion;
- ⇒ **Sit or kneel** after returning to your pew and during the period of sacred silence after Communion.



PRAYER & DEVOTIONS

JANUARY — THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

The month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. After the Blessed Virgin Mary conceived by the Holy Spirit, the angel Gabriel appeared to St. Joseph and told him that the Child's name should be called Jesus.

According to Jewish law, on the 8th day after his birth a male child was to be circumcised, receive his name, and become a full member of God's covenant people. According to the old Roman liturgical calendar, the Feast of the Circumcision of Jesus was originally celebrated on January 1st, eight days after Christmas, the same day that He was given His sacred name. Currently we celebrate the Solemnity of the Mother of God on January 1st and honor the Holy Name of Jesus on January 3rd. For Catholics, Jesus' sacred name is the object of a special devotion symbolized by the monogram "IHS," (letters of the Greek spelling of His name.



The name 'Jesus' means 'God Saves' — the sacred name before which "every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phil. 2:10-11) Devotion to the Most Holy Name of Jesus was popularized by St. Bernardine of Siena in the 15th century, often symbolized by the monogram IHS (denoting the first three letters of the Greek spelling of Jesus' name). —Exert from Catholic Company.com

Make us, O Lord, to have a perpetual fear and love of your holy Name, for you never fail to help and govern those whom you bring up in your steadfast fear and love: who lives and reigns forever and ever. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

CATECHISM CORNER — From the desk of Mike Acheson

One of the characteristics of all saints is a **heroic virtue** directed towards humanity and God. There are many virtues, so what is its definition? Simply, "A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person to give the best of himself... with all his sensory and spiritual powers; he chooses the good and chooses it in concrete actions." (CCC 1803)

All saints possess the virtue of holiness; with Joan of Arc the virtue of courage is front and center; with St. Therese of Lisieux humility; with Padre Pio faith and trust in God. We are all different, which is a beautiful thing. We are given the gifts of the Holy Spirit, but the fruits of that are unique to us.

The cardinal virtues are the pivotal virtues with all the virtues grouped around them. They are prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. Let's look at **prudence** as it is called, "the charioteer of the virtues; it guides the other virtues by setting rule and measure."

"It is prudence that immediately guides the judgement of conscience. The prudent man determines and directs his conduct in accordance with this judgment." (CCC 1806)

It is prudence that tells us not to take that first step towards something, or in another case to take that step. If you have been around for a number of years, which most of us have, you realize how critical a step towards something or away, can be. Prudence is acting within us whether we realize it or not. It is this "charioteer," this guide that keeps us away from potential evil, and which moves us towards the beautiful and good.

The CCC says this succinctly that, "with the help of this virtue we apply moral principles to particular cases . . . and overcome doubts about the good to achieve and the evil to avoid."

Sometimes these movements in our lives is very subtle which is why it is good to always call on God, and His angels and His saints, to help us in our walk; as small things, good and bad, can always lead to greater things, good and bad, we stay close and hug the sacraments and prayer, thus allowing the charioteer to move our conscience in the right and correct way. It is important to note that prudence, "is not to be confused with timidity or fear, nor with duplicity or dissimulation." On the contrary, as Proverbs 14:15 says, "The prudent man looks where he is going," and in this way we find strength through peace.

SUNDAY DEVOTIONS | A MEDITATION ON NEXT WEEK'S MASS READINGS

Jan. 16, 2022 **2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading—The words in this reading convey a message that extends to all people for all time. They name a reality known to us all; bad times don't last forever; "vindication" and "glory" follow times of hardship, even those we brought upon ourselves, because God is never stingy with mercy. Though its marriage imagery links this text to this week's Gospel, both passages speak of something more than weddings; God's ability to take a painful past and turn it into a glorious future, to transform lack into abundance—those are the real messages here. Knowing that no matter what we have done, God can remake and rename us; this is transformative. [Isaiah 62:1-5]

Responsorial Psalm—"Proclaim His marvelous deeds to all the nations." [Psalm 96]

Second Reading—From across the sea, Paul writes his spiritual children to restore peace and right teaching. He reminds them that their gifts come from God for the good of all, not for the glory of the one who is the conduit of God's grace.

[1 Corinthians 12:4-11]

Gospel—When Jesus uses the water reserved for Jewish ceremonial washings to transform into wine, He shifts focus from ritual to the heart of the Gospel. Rather than slavish ties to rubrics of the old Law, Jesus introduces His disciples to the superabundance of God's grace and the freedom of God's Kingdom. Mary's words to the servants—"Do whatever He tells you"—the last she speaks in all the Gospel accounts—echo down the centuries as sage advice to all who would be her Son's disciples. This event transcends Jesus' other miracles to become one of John's seven signs that manifest the glory and power of Jesus and God's Kingdom. [John 2:1-11]
