
The Solidarity of Union

January 9, 2022

With our celebration today of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord we honor the last of the great Christmas epiphanies. Today's Mass recalls the baptism of Jesus by St. John. Recall that John's baptism was for the forgiveness of sins. Here we might rightly ask, "Why would the Son of God choose to undergo this purification given his sinless divine nature?" Though he obviously needs no such baptism for his own person, by so

submitting Jesus demonstrates that the entirety of his life and mission now unfolds in complete solidarity with mankind. As our Lord descends into the waters of the Jordan, being plunged into its depths, he does so as a foreshadowing of his death on the cross. Through him, it is our sins that are washed away and as he rises from the waters he anticipates not only his own resurrection but also our victory over death in him. Jesus' own baptism demonstrates the fruits of the sacrament of baptism itself through which the human soul is regenerated and made fit for eternal life. It is our anointing with his Spirit that accomplishes such fitness and which gives us the name 'Christian'.

In the aftermath of John's baptism, we hear of the descent of this selfsame Spirit upon the Lord in the visible form of a dove. As at the waning of the Great Flood, the appearance of a dove represents the dawning of a new covenant. This Trinitarian epiphany is made complete when the Father's voice is heard proclaiming: *This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased*. We can hear the echo of that original proclamation today as we receive from this altar the Eucharist of Christ whose graces hearken back to the happy moment of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus and indeed, our very own.
