On May 13, Catholics around the world celebrate Our Lady of Fatima.

Throughout her apparitions, Mary makes predictions and warns that unless everyone prays, repents and abandons sin, the world will suffer war, turmoil and persecution of the Church. Dear Friends of Sacred Heart,

February 25, 2021. Noriko Nasu, a Japanese language teacher at Inglemoor HS in a Seattle suburb, was attacked by a man wielding a sock filled with stones. The resulting impact knocked her out, fractured her cheekbone and jaw, broke her teeth and left her with a concussion. Months later she continues to suffer headaches and dizziness.

Today's Gospel reminded me of this terrible incident. Over the last few years, I have grown in my awareness of how our faith as taught by Jesus should bear on issues of justice. In eleven words Jesus expresses it all, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you" (Jn 15:12). He does not say, "This is my suggestion: love one another if you want to." No, he is forceful in his statement. It's a command, an order, a rule. It is a sad commentary on our times that this command is violated so frequently.

Hateful attacks on Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders have escalated 150% in the first three months of 2021 according to Pew Researchers! One of the identified reasons for this escalation is the mistaken belief that anyone who is "Asian are of Chinese origin, and that China was responsible for the start of the coronavirus." Hatred has no place in a Christian heart. Jesus, our Prince of Peace, had every human reason to hate those who nailed him to the cross. In the midst of the terrible pain he felt as the nails were being driven into his flesh and bones, he asked his Father to "forgive them, they know not what they do" (Lk 23:24).

I am embarrassed when I get riled up over some small, trivial thing that brings out the worst in me. The sin of wrath (anger) that causes me to think vengeful, unforgiving thoughts of someone is an offense against the commandment of Jesus: "...love one another as I love you." Jesus suffered far more than I will ever suffer and yet he pardoned those who inflicted such pain and death upon him. I sometimes fail to model Christ as I should.

Pope Francis's recent encyclical letter, Fratelli Tutti, is a powerful Christian statement that reminds us that we are "brothers and sisters all" (FT, 8). The first chapter gives a brief overview of what compelled him to write this letter to us. The chapter is entitled "Dark Clouds

Over a Closed World." Certainly Ms. Nasu and so many others of our sisters and brothers of color know only too well how dark the clouds of racism hang over their heads.

When I meditate on the words found in Genesis that you and I are made in the image of God, I find myself completely overwhelmed by those words. We look like God! How many faces does God have? There are 8 billion human faces on earth...each an image of God! Every human has inherited the beauty and dignity granted us by the Father.

"If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love..." (Jn 15:10). When it comes to issues of race, how easy is it to remain in the love of Christ? This is a question well worth examining.

In 1979, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops wrote a document (Brothers and Sisters to Us) that stated, "Racism is a sin: a sin that divides the human family, blots out the image of God among specific members of that family, and violates the fundamental human dignity of those called to be children of the same Father."

Our parish is the spiritual home to many Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders. Many of them probably have stories they could share with us about their experiences of being the recipients of demeaning comments and/or assaults on their person. If we see them being troubled by someone's hurtful words or threatening posture, will we come to their aid in the name of God? Would we "lay down our life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13)?

Pope Francis concludes his encyclical with "A Prayer to the Creator." A portion of it reads as follows:

Lord, Father of our human family,  
you created all human beings equal in dignity;  
pour forth into our hearts a fraternal spirit  
and inspire in us dreams of renewed encounter,  
dialogue, justice and peace.

Let this be our prayer as we actively build more fraternal and loving relationships. Amen!



If we read the Gospels as if Jesus is talking directly to us from the ambo, then what might His words say to us? “I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father” (Jn 15:15). The word “you” is to be used universally. While he is speaking to the disciples, He is also speaking to us. He does not separate the original twelve from us in time. “You” stands for both rich and poor; for the healthy and the sick; for friend and for enemy; for relatives and for strangers; and for saints and sinners. Everyone is His friend...”because.” Because why? Because Jesus has laid out the way we are supposed to conduct our lives. And this way was given to Him by the Father for all of us. Jesus sums up everything in the last line of today’s Gospel, “This I command you: love one another” (Jn 15:17). Jesus does not say “I suggest....” No, He commands! Justice is the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give our due to God and neighbor (CCC #1807). Today Jesus asks, “Friends, for the love of God, do you really love one another without distinction? Do you live out by the grace of the Father the virtue of justice by giving and doing what you can for those in need?” Jesus did and so should we.
