Dear Sisters and Brothers of Sacred Heart,

There is something about the season of summer that allows me to see and reflect upon the glory of God in His creation a little more clearly. Blue skies and sunshine are a big help. Some time ago, I received a wonderful book called *A Year with Thomas Merton*. This book provides 365 days worth of Merton's writings upon which to reflect. This passage appeared on a day on which I was wondering what I might share:

“By the reading of Scripture I am so renewed that all nature seems renewed around me and with me. The sky seems more pure, a cooler blue, the trees a deeper green, light is sharper on the outline of the forest, and the hills and whole world are charged with the glory of God, and I feel fire and music in the earth under my feet.”

Merton used his days as a Cistercian monk to pray and to reflect more deeply about life. As he wrote in the passage above, Holy Scripture brought him a new way to view life and to reflect upon his place within creation. You and I are not monks and do not live that quiet disciplined lifestyle. Yet we can, with just a little effort and creativity, develop a quiet place in which we can withdraw and reflect.

We can take just a couple of ideas from Merton's reflections. Let's start with Scripture. Every three years the Church takes us through the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. (John's Gospel is interspersed every year throughout the writings of the other Gospel writers.) The parish bulletin faithfully lists the readings for the day. How much time would it take for us to read only the Gospel passage? Two or three minutes?

Once we read the passage, find a word or short phrase that seems to capture our attention... our imagination. These words become our personal message from God. Merton says of this practice, “Every word that comes from the mouth of God is nourishment that feeds the soul with eternal life.” The meaning or value of Scripture is inexhaustible. It is alive and speaks to us anew every time we reflect on its meaning in our lives.



The Summer Solstice occurred three weeks ago. Although we may not notice, the daylight hours are growing shorter. However, we still have many more days of summer left to enjoy beautiful sunrises and sunsets.

This leads me to a second idea that Thomas Merton gives me: Does our practice of reading and reflecting upon Scripture make God's creation more vivid? Do the birds chirp more sweetly? Are the late summer flower blossoms painted in Technicolor? Is the crisp morning air filled with the promise of God's love? Are we able to see and appreciate God's gifts to us in His creation?

Nearly 53 years after his death, Merton still has something to teach us. Perhaps the thoughts I share could be written as a mathematical equation: Reading of scripture (rS) + a few moments of reflection (mR) = a greater awareness of God in our lives (aG).

As summer moves toward autumn, may we bask in the glory of God which we find in His magnificent creation! May our feet feel the fire and music in the earth!

Sacred Heart Parish fiscal year, along with the Archdiocese is July to June, which means we just finished the 2020-2021 fiscal year. As has been stated numerous times elsewhere, this has been a challenging year. It is hard to remember that in-person mass restarted after a 13 week stoppage in June of 2020 and there has been limited in-person Mass since then. As the vaccine was introduced to the general public less than six months ago we are still not fully back to the way we were before this pandemic struck. Our parish just restarted passing the collection basket during the offertory. However during all this time you, our parishioners stuck with us in prayer, attending Mass, watching Mass online and volunteering where possible. We were able to keep our Food Pantry, Rent Assistance and Clothing Bank open with social distancing rules in place. Thank you for your faithfulness. I will present a full annual report later in the year. However, I can say that our parish is doing well financially. This is made possible due to your Stewardship of Treasure, the giving of your financial resources to the parish and others.



St. Francis of Assisi was inspired to a way of life based on the Gospel reading we hear today. "...take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack no money in their belts" (Mk 6:8). This is what he sought with all his heart – to follow the poor, crucified Christ who had nowhere to lay his head. Poverty of spirit is what drove Francis and has inspired millions of others through history to adopt his way of life. Why? Because it so closely follows the life of Christ! There is much in our culture that points in another direction – to buy and acquire more because we have the means to do so. All of this is the driving force of our economy. We are to pack our lives with things even at the expense of exploiting creation by raping the earth for its precious metals at the expense of God's creation.

What about the people who live in those regions? Well, they too can be exploited by moving them off their lands and paying them less than a just wage so we can enjoy products at a "good price." Poverty is often the result of unjust oppression. Are we as followers of Christ's teachings willing to do with less? Are we as followers of Christ willing to reshape our lives as a result of reflecting upon today's Gospel? Saint Francis did it. St. Clare did it. If they can, by the grace of God, so can we! The work of true justice doesn't just suggest it – it demands it! May this week allow us the opportunity to live out our trust in the Lord. Amen.




Staying Cool



Faith in Marriage

Question:

What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?

Answer:

Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn’t always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There’s never “enough time” for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don’t prioritize prayer, we’ll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you’re not already praying individually, that’s a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is an engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.


