

Hello Everyone,

People seemed to like it last time I reviewed some books that I've read, so here you go. Here are a few more.

I'll Push You: This is the true story of two best friends who decided to walk the Camino

de Santiago in Spain together. For those who don't know, the Camino de Santiago is a walking pilgrimage across Spain. While there are several different routes, the most common is from France and passes through cities like Burgos and León. What made this story interesting, however, was the fact that one of the friends was confined to a wheelchair.

Having walked about 200 miles of the Camino myself a couple years ago, I enjoyed the book. There were some spiritual insights they picked up along the way, and I enjoyed the stories of the people they met and the challenges they overcame. I enjoyed it because I've done the Camino, but I'm not sure I would have as much if I hadn't. It kind of made me want to go back, to be honest. If you have walked the Camino, I highly recommend it and if you have not, I suggest you walk the Camino and then read it! (stay... tuned for more on this... hint, hint...;)

I'm Starting to Worry About This Black Box of Doom: This was my vacation book. I just wanted something easy and relatively mindless to read and in that sense, it delivered. But other than that it was up and down. I almost didn't want to admit that I read this because there is a lot of objectionable, shallow and immature material in it, but it had its good moments too.

Basically, a young man gets offered a couple hundred thousand dollars to drive a young woman and a big black box across the country. They have

no idea what's inside the box. Some evidence suggests its a bomb. Other evidence suggests its nothing. But the internet gets hold of the story and starts wildly speculating on what is happening.

This, in my opinion, made the book enjoyable. It was like all the scientific data you've ever read about Gen Z and how the internet and social media has wrecked their brains in literary form. The wild speculation of people who knew nothing about what was happening but spoke authoritatively of what was in the box and the relationship between the young man and woman was excellent, and there were some great lines from the characters about friendship and trust, but there were some negative things too about the material making it, so I can't widely recommend it. Sad too, because it was a good idea for a story.


Humility Rules: Saint Benedict's 12 Step Guide to Genuine Self-Esteem: I read this book a couple of years ago, but I still regularly pick it up to reflect on from time to time.

Seeing as how our parishes have such a history of Benedictine spirituality, I think this is a good one for people to read. It takes one of the great works of Western Civilization, The Rule of St. Benedict, and makes it very easily understandable for a modern reader. I found it very easy to read, thought provoking, but also very practical. If you are looking for a little spiritual reading on the simple side to jumpstart your prayer life and spark some reflection, this is a book I totally recommend, especially if you are unfamiliar with the rule of St. Benedict.

That's it for now! I know that some of you expected All the Light We Cannot See, and it's coming, I promise. I'm hoping to finish it by Christmas.

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: Please pre-register at least 4 weeks before our monthly Baptism class for infants through 6 years of age. A copy of the birth certificate of the child to be baptized is needed at the time of registration (must be attached to the registration form).

Marriage: If you are planning a wedding, please contact us at least 6 months to 1 year prior to your anticipated wedding date. We offer marriage preparation classes three times per year, if you would like to attend these classes. Please call to register. Our next marriage prep class session started on January 6th from 6 pm to 8:30 pm, and consists of 6 classes.

Quinceañera: You must register at least 6 months prior to the event and provide copies of your Baptism and First Communion certificates at the time of registration for the classes and scheduling of the event. The next class will start in February 2025.

OCIA for Adults, Children, and Youth 360-491-0890

The Order for Christian Initiation for Adults—also known as RCIA—is a conversion journey through which non-baptized adults, children and youth enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and the celebration of rites at Holy Mass. Participants in the OCIA are known as catechumens. They undergo a process of conversion as they study scripture, profess faith in Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church, and receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The OCIA follows the ancient practice of the Church and was restored by the Second Vatican Council as the normal way catechumens prepare for baptism. 








What is a Jubilee Year?

Jubilees ordinarily take place every twenty-five years. The theme of Jubilee 2025 is Pilgrims of Hope, and the faithful are encouraged to participate, either by going on pilgrimage to Rome or in your local archdiocese. During the Jubilee Year 2025, Pope Francis is calling on all the faithful to become Pilgrims of Hope. During the Jubilee, millions of pilgrims are expected to travel to Rome to walk through the Holy Doors and participate in Jubilee events. Those unable to travel to Rome can participate in the Jubilee locally by making a pilgrimage to St. James Cathedral in Seattle or to one of the other designated pilgrimage sites.
