OUTREACH MINISTRY/VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Our **Outreach Ministry** has resumed, and we are in need of more volunteers to bring Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to attend Mass in person.



The Problem: Among the losses from COVID 19 was our ability to bring Holy Eucharist to the homebound and those in extended care facilities. Now we can begin to visit these places once again. However, the pandemic has greatly reduced the number of volunteers still available to perform this vital mission of our parish. We need many more new volunteers for this work of mercy.

Your Role: After a brief training period, you would bring Holy Communion to your assigned parishioners on a schedule which you and the Parish Staff/Priests would determine. You would choose the frequency, number, and location of those you would visit and there is flexibility in this process.

The Rewards: The persons you visit are able to receive the Holy Eucharist and to discuss their faith, joys, and struggles with you. You may be their only contact with our Catholic faith, and you give them a vital link to the sacraments. You are serving as an extension of priestly ministry and can alert the Priests if their presence may be needed---particularly in the Anointing of the Sick. This ministry is richly rewarding, and you will likely develop a special bond with those you are serving. By comforting the afflicted and with prayer you are performing spiritual works of mercy. In visiting the sick you are also doing a corporal work of mercy. This service should deepen your own spirituality as you progress in your own pilgrimage with our Lord.

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Happy news! Fr. Ken's weekly Wednesday 12:30 and 5:30 classes are back! Each week, they will focus on a chapter from the DVD "The Search," followed by discussion and teaching by Fr. Ken. After so long, it is wonderful to be able to come back together again in the parish hall.

On May 4-7, all priests of our Archdiocese will gather at a convocation in which Archbishop Sample will lay out his plans for the coming years regarding the evangelization of western Oregon. Beginning April 25th, for the nine days leading up to the convocation, our Archbishop has asked all the faithful to pray a special Novena Surrender, asking the Lord to grant success for these efforts. This e-mail has a link to the Surrender Novena; it is also on our website.

Be sure to check out the interesting article in the current Catholic Sentinel about Judy Crowe and Kellie Halsted – two of Sacred Heart's recently initiated Catholics! Great picture too.

Can you believe we are now about halfway through the Easter season? Colleen Pressprich's Our Sunday Visitor article, "6 ways to live the Easter season," suggests ways in which we can continue to live the Easter season weeks after Easter Sunday has passed. After all, for 40 days we put great care into preparing for Easter, but how do we spend the next 50 days celebrating it? Colleen Pressprich's "6 ways to live the Easter season" is full of good suggestions. She writes:

"Lean into Sunday feasts. Each Sunday is meant to be a day of rest and, indeed, a mini-Easter celebration all on its own. This Eastertide, I encourage you to lean into Sundays as a feast day," writes Colleen. What would it take to make Sunday look and feel different from the other days of the week to you and your family?"

"Pray a Novena. Between the Ascension of Christ and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost are nine days, during which the apostles (and Mary) waited and prayed – the very first novena... As we remember these days each Eastertide, it is a powerful time to pray a novena to the Holy Spirit, to ask Him for an outpouring into our lives, our families and our parishes."

"Throw a Pentecost party. Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit descended from heaven, is the last day of the Easter season. It is also the day we celebrate the birth of the Catholic Church. In addition to attending Mass, it's fun to throw a birthday party. My family and I will bake a cake, decorate it with sprinkles and all sorts of toppings, and then we will sing Happy Birthday to our Catholic faith after dinner, enjoying one last Easter dessert to close the season."

"Plant a Mary garden. I love that as we are celebrating Christ, who makes all things new, the world around us is sprouting with new growth. Starting a Mary garden can be a wonderful way to celebrate Eastertide," Colleen writes. There is also a fun article about it – "Creating my Marian garden" by Sarah Wolf - in the current issue of the Catholic Sentinel.

Inspired by these suggestions, on a future visit to our daughter's family in the Baker diocese, I can't wait to take our little grandchildren, Annie and Christian, to pick out a Marian statue and some plants that have a special connection to Mary. Together, we will pick a location in their yard and plant a sweet Mary garden, and it will be their little prayer garden and special time with Mary. Then we will celebrate with a Pentecost party. It is so fun to plant faith in little ones. Mary Stallard, our Children's Rel Ed Coord, is here to help you plant faith in your children!

Thank you for praying the Surrender Novena for the success of the priests' convocation. And a beautiful Easter season to you as we continue to celebrate the Good News that He is Risen!

We've had some busy weeks recently.

Preschooler Liliana brought beeswax from her bee farm in to share some fascinating information! We learned where the honey is made, where the baby bees live and even saw the Queen nest in there!



Third grade is enjoying our sunny weather! Some favorite games on the playground have been two touch, four square, and night at the museum. In class, we are exploring the wide world of fractions and have started to find equivalent fractions on a number line. We are also finishing our science unit on living organisms.

This week for Friday Fun Day, **fifth grade** had the opportunity to view paramecium and hydra, and several students got to see some moving, live organisms! We also played Math Madness adding and subtracting decimals, and the teams were neck in neck with a tie!
