

OUTREACH MINISTRY/VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Our **Outreach Ministry** has resumed, and we are in need of more volunteers to bring Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to attend Mass in person.



The Problem: Among the losses from COVID 19 was our ability to bring Holy Eucharist to the homebound and those in extended care facilities. Now we can begin to visit these places once again. However, the pandemic has greatly reduced the number of volunteers still available to perform this vital mission of our parish. We need many more new volunteers for this work of mercy.

Your Role: After a brief training period, you would bring Holy Communion to your assigned parishioners on a schedule which you and the Parish Staff/Priests would determine. You would choose the frequency, number, and location of those you would visit and there is flexibility in this process.

The Rewards: The persons you visit are able to receive the Holy Eucharist and to discuss their faith, joys, and struggles with you. You may be their only contact with our Catholic faith, and you give them a vital link to the sacraments. You are serving as an extension of priestly ministry and can alert the Priests if their presence may be needed---particularly in the Anointing of the Sick. This ministry is richly rewarding, and you will likely develop a special bond with those you are serving. By comforting the afflicted and with prayer you are performing spiritual works of mercy. In visiting the sick you are also doing a corporal work of mercy. This service should deepen your own spirituality as you progress in your own pilgrimage with our Lord.

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Happy 5th Sunday of Easter! We hope this note finds you doing well and enjoying this pretty Easter season.

We have a few announcements: Daily Mass will be celebrated this coming Monday, but there will be no daily Mass on Tuesday through Thursday while our priests attend the priest convocation. However, during that time, there will be a prayer service – no Communion – every morning at 8:30AM in the church, led by the Deacon. Prayer Service booklets from the Office of Divine Worship will be provided. The Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet will continue to be prayed every day. In addition, please note that Fr. Ken's weekly Wednesday class will not meet next week. Thank you for keeping our priests in your prayers and for praying the Surrender Novena for the success of their gathering.

While our county is in the "extreme category," seating in the church will still remain at 125, with overflow in the parish hall. Social distancing remains at 6' in churches, except for family groups. Masks or face shields are still generally required to be worn by everyone five and older. Just a reminder that the area around the baptismal font and the open front pew are reserved for those with mobility issues, please. If you need help finding another seat, an usher will be glad to help you. Thank you for your understanding.

This Saturday, May 1, we honor St. Joseph the Worker. While there are no recorded words of St. Joseph in the four Gospels, his silence points to the most valuable lesson we learn from him: Joseph spoke with his faith and actions. In her article, "The creative courage of St. Joseph the Worker" (Our Sunday Visitor, 4/25/21), Jen Sullivan writes, "When Pope Pius XII added the feast of St. Joseph the Worker to the Church's calendar in 1955, the celebration highlighted the Church's esteem for workers and human labor...The feast affirms that work is sacred because it is the privileged path by which we participate, through our daily work, in the creative work of God in the world...."

"In this Year of St. Joseph, announced by Pope Francis, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker is an invitation to reflect on the virtues of the humble carpenter to whom God entrusted his divine son, Jesus, and his blessed Mother. With his hands, Joseph built the home and crafted the livelihood that provided for the earthly, practical needs of Jesus and Mary. And with his virtues, Joseph crafted out of his life a masterpiece for God, radiant with faith, creative courage and love in action."

In the many challenges of life and especially in our work, may we learn from and be strengthened by the virtues and example of St. Joseph the Worker, the humble carpenter of Nazareth, and craft of our own lives "a masterpiece for God, radiant with faith, creative courage and love in action." St. Joseph, pray for us.

Mrs. House did “guided drawings” with her second grade class last week. The students follow along with step by step instructions to create a dragon.




THIRD GRADE

When electricity passes through a wire it creates a magnetic field, and when the wire is coiled, it can be made to rotate over a stationary magnet. Very fun!
