Notes from Fr. Ken Sampson

Lessons from the Pandemic

Thanks be to God, the signs from across our nation as well as here locally, seem to indicate that we are slowly returning to normal life again... at least as normal as we can hope for in this post-Covid world. Businesses, churches and schools are slowly reopening, though not as quickly as some would hope. People are rebuilding their social lives, are daring once again to resume traveling and gradually fear and anxiety are giving way to hope.

Still, many hard lessons were learned during what was, for me at least, the hardest year of my life and the most difficult year for my priesthood as well. For a time, access to the public Mass was denied to us. People experienced great hardships economically with family businesses going bankrupt and employment layoffs. Some lost loved ones to Covid-19 or to other illnesses and were sadly even denied the ability to make final visits to say farewell to them or even to properly bury their dead. Political riots and civil unrest were on display everywhere and divisiveness was on ugly display both in the news and on social media. As an indicator of just how poorly most people were coping with it all, my counseling time went from being maybe 5% mental health related pre-Covid to 100% with people battling anger, stress, fear, depression (coming from isolation), reemerging addictions, etc. Then, just when we thought things could not get worse, the Almeda fire hit us locally and brought further trauma with home losses and destruction. To the hardest hit, things really felt apocalyptic for a while. In the midst of it all, I watched as some lost their faith, convinced that a loving and merciful God could not possibly exist while others, humbled by loss and problems beyond their control, found faith amidst those same events. I often asked God in prayer during those days: What are you asking me to do? How can I serve the needs of my people? What are you trying to teach me? And I found myself battling with the same sense of powerlessness that others were also battling.

Often it is only with the passage of time and proper hindsight that we become able to see more clearly. Recently I have had the benefit of that new perspective and I have concluded, at least for now, that the following were my list of takeaways:

1. A deeper gratitude for the Mass – Though I was able to receive the daily Eucharist throughout the pandemic, others were not, when the public cele-

bration of the Mass was temporarily suspended. I thought of all the places in the world where that is the sad norm and became more grateful for a thing I was at least partially guilty of taking for granted.

2. A deeper gratitude for our faith community – Similarly, celebrating Mass to an empty church became the saddest experience of my priesthood. What is a shepherd without a flock? This experience led me to some fruitful reflections on my priestly identity.

3. A deeper gratitude for my fellow priests – Many priests complained of feeling isolated in the midst of the crisis. Early on, before technical solutions were found, communications were not strong. Priests received letters of instruction from time to time but it felt to some as though we were being left on our own to solve problems. Later, and still today, communications became more frequent and now they are stronger than they have ever been during my ordained life. It took a pandemic to bring that change about and it reaffirmed for me that the fraternity of the priesthood is absolutely essential for healthy clerical living.

4. Finally being able to see these events, through the eyes of faith, as merciful gifts – How does God get through to hardened hearts...to a people who live in comfort and who have forgotten God. How does he reach those who treat God as a last resort or a children's fairytale. He allows that self-reliance to be destroyed for a time. He allows a series of crises (notice I did not say "causes") so that in our helplessness we might remember to turn back to him. Like the ten plagues of Egypt, arrogant and stubborn people sometimes need harsh lessons but, when eternity is on the line, this is a mercy.

5. A reminder that the experience of tragedy is not the time to adopt a bunker attitude or to throw in the towel. Instead, it serves as an invitation to go deeper in prayer and to engage the world even more aggressively – It is when people are trapped in hopelessness and darkness that they are most in need of the Good News and it is when we are in most need of guidance that we need prayer most.

6. Solidarity with the poor and the shut-ins - This experience for me became clear in two ways. First, in hearing the stories of loss from the Almeda fire victims...and second, through various forms of quarantine experience. We shared with others what we had, we experienced loneliness and being cut off socially along with others.

We shared with others what we had, we experienced loneliness and being cut off socially along with others. We also saw a wonderful response of love from throughout Oregon and locally, involving other faith communities. The solidarity of suffering helped to reveal something more of our potential as people of faith to bring change.

These are the top six lessons that come to mind for me about this collective experience that we are just coming out of. I, for one, feel like I am a better person for having gone through it. I am grateful that God walked that journey with me and I hope that you also learned some life changing lessons as a result of our shared corporate suffering.

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Greetings! Because the Catholic Church's first celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly happens on this Sunday, July 25th – the Sunday closest to the Feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents – I'd like share parts of Pope Francis' message for the World Day, as conveyed in the July 9, 2021 edition of the Hawaii Catholic Herald newspaper.

God is close to the elderly and still has plans for their lives, Pope Francis told older Catholics. "The Lord is always – always – close to us. He is close to us with new possibilities, new ideas, new consolations, but always close to us. You know that the Lord is eternal; he never, ever goes into retirement... Think about it: what is our vocation today, at our age? To preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young and to care for the little ones," he wrote. "Never forget this... There is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to your grandchildren. You just need to set out and undertake something new."

"Pope Francis said he knew many older people might wonder how they could be called to something new when their 'energy is running out' or they cannot even leave the residence where they live... A better future, he said, must be built on the pillars of 'dreams, memory and prayer,' pillars that 'even the frailest among us' can erect with God's help." While many people, young and old, act as if the reminiscences of the elderly are boring, Pope Francis said that "without memory, we will never be able to build; without a foundation, we can never build a house. Never. And the foundation of life is memory." For instance, sharing the painful memory of war is important "for helping the young to learn the value of peace."

Turning to the importance of prayer, Pope Francis

cited "my predecessor, Pope Benedict, himself a saintly elderly person who continues to pray and work for the church' at the age of 94. The prayer of the elderly can protect the world, helping it perhaps more effectively than the frenetic activity of many others," the Pope quoted his predecessor as saying. "He spoke those words in 2012, toward the end of his pontificate. There is something beautiful here."

"Your prayer is a very precious resource: a deep breath that the church and the world urgently need," Pope Francis told the elderly. "Especially in these difficult times for our human family, as we continue to sail in the same boat across the stormy sea of the pandemic, your intercession for the world and for the church has great value: it inspires in everyone the serene trust that we will soon come to shore."

The Vatican also announced that people who attend a Mass for the day, "devote adequate time to actually or virtually visiting their elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty" or join in prayers for the elderly on July 25th can receive a plenary indulgence as long as they fulfill the usual requirements of also going to confession, receiving the Eucharist, and praying for the intentions of the Pope. The indulgence also is available to the "elderly sick and all those who, unable to leave their homes for a serious reason, will unite themselves spiritually to the sacred functions of the World Day, offering to the merciful God their prayers, pains or sufferings of their lives," the Vatican said.

On this, the Catholic Church's first celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, may all grandparents and elderly know what a beloved treasure they are in their family's eyes and in the eyes of God and the Church. May God bless you all with peace and happiness!
