

Notes from Father Bonaventure Rummell

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Sacred Heart of Jesus!

Fr. Ken has asked me to write occasionally to you through the bulletin. He's given me the freedom to choose the topic, so I thought for this first letter, I'd share some impressions that I have about returning to Oregon after having been away for 19 years. As you may know, I used to live in Oregon when I was younger, and I left in 2002 to join a religious community in New York. I returned this year. I have to say there are two shocking and bizarre impressions I have that contrast with what I knew about Oregon.

The first is that never in my childhood do I ever remember Oregon being hot - 115 degrees hot. Cold and rainy, yes; hot, no. I was in Albany, OR visiting my family, when the temperature reached 115 degrees! I don't know what to make of that. Of course, along with the heat comes dryness, drought, and fires. I was shocked to drive up to Detroit Lake and see all the damage from the fires from last year, and the fires are burning again. This is not the Oregon of my childhood. Pope Francis, a few years back, wrote an Encyclical *Laudato Si!* I am sad to admit I only skimmed the letter because I found myself to be too busy to spend much effort reading it. But I think maybe I should. Concern for the earth and its well-being is the original charge that God gave to Adam when he placed mankind on earth in the Garden of Eden. We are all of us originally called to "rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground," as we read in Genesis 1, or as we read in Genesis 2, God "took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden, to cultivate and care for it." We are meant to cultivate and care for our planet. I have no idea how best to do that, and I know that this can be a strangely politicized topic, which I'd

like to avoid, but definitely my first impression of being back in Oregon after so long is that we the people of God need to reclaim, develop, and foster this original responsibility and mission given to us by God. Perhaps I could suggest that one way to adopt this is through a prayerful reading of this encyclical letter of Pope Francis, leaving the secular politics aside.

The second surprising impression I had, came through driving down the street in my hometown and seeing an advertisement on the side of the road for "mota." I thought to myself, "wait, I think that was a slang word for 'pot' when I was a kid." And I was right. I knew that marijuana became legal in Oregon, but viscerally I was shocked by seeing the industry in sales and - here in Southern Oregon - in production. When Solomon blessed the original temple built in Jerusalem the smoke of God's glory entered the temple - the Shekinah Glory! I don't mean to sound judgmental, but unless there is a medical reason, and under the supervision of a medical doctor, it seems to me that the smoke of mota can drive the smoke of God's glory right out of the temple of the Holy Spirit that is our bodies. Maybe I'm old fashioned, but I don't think that human behavior ought to determine our legal system. Rather, we should make the laws on ideals rooted in Christian morality - if we're able to. There are many very questionable things I did in my childhood - some of which should be illegal! I don't think the people in Oregon are doing themselves or the next generations any favors by legalizing marijuana. I wouldn't be opposed to a movement to make it illegal once again. But may I suggest to you that just because something is legal doesn't make it good.

I want to say, however, that Oregon is still one of the most beautiful places I've been to on earth! And I am so glad to be here. And being here at Sacred Heart - in the Sacred Heart - is the best place to be.

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

How are you? Can you believe that August is already here? Happy Feast of the Transfiguration next Friday, August 6th! I hope you have been having a lovely summer. Although I had something else in mind to write about, I'm moved to share with you something that happened this week. It's an experience that anyone who has ever loved a pet has also been through.

It was ten years ago this past weekend that Tim and I went with our daughter Molly to pick up her new puppy, a little black lab she named Modoc. From the kennel, we came directly to the parish picnic to show him off, where Modoc was quite a sensation. With Tim's careful training, Modoc went on to become a wonderful retriever, bursting with excitement every fall as Tim would arrive at Molly's with the duck decoys and gear. Modoc was a loyal, protective companion to Molly and then her husband and the children that started to arrive. He was a good boy.

Yesterday Molly called to say that the time had come, it would be the next morning, and did we want to come over that evening and say good-bye to Modoc. We did. We left right after work and when we arrived, Molly was with Modoc on the back lawn. It was still light. We kissed and hugged Modoc and whispered words of gratitude for the joy he had given us. Tim and Modoc had that special bond between master and retriever. Modoc stood up and his tail was wagging a bit. He was happy. We were all there, sitting on the grass with him – Molly and her husband and their children and Tim and me. It was just how Modoc must

have wanted it, for suddenly and quietly, he passed away.

God is so good. Pets are part of His goodness and care of us. They bring us so much companionship and joy and lessons too in patience and taking care of God's creatures. I had brought a little book with me by Franciscan Friar Jack Wintz titled *I Will See You in Heaven*. Although it is a mystery and there is no teaching of the Church thus, what person who has lost a pet hasn't hoped that perhaps someday, somehow, by the tender mercies of God, we will see our loyal companions again.

Let's say a prayer, I suggested, and opened Friar Wintz' book to the prayer "For an Animal That Has Died or Is About to Die." All eyes rested tenderly on our beautiful Modoc, now at peace, and I took a deep breath and began the prayer. Perhaps it is one that you might want too. It goes:

Loving God,

*Our beloved pet and companion, (name)
is on its final journey.*

*We will miss (name) dearly
because of the joy and affection
(name) has given to us.*

Bless (name) and give him/her peace.

*We thank you for the gift
that (name) has been to us.*

*Give us hope that in your great kindness,
you may restore (name) in your heavenly kingdom
according to your wisdom, which goes
beyond our human understanding. Amen.*

God gives us so many gifts. Our pets are gifts to us. We will treasure them forever in our hearts.


Public MARIAN Procession ~Feast of the Assumption ~All Are Invited to Participate Sunday August 15, 2021




