THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

First Reading: Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-27

Gospel: Luke 1:39-56



Dear Parish Family,

I can't express how grateful I am to be with you here at Sacred Heart. It has been a wonderful blessing for me thus far, and I look forward to progressing through the liturgical year with you.

One of the sad things that seems to be happening in the world – as of this writing – is the rapid spread of the new virus known as SARS-COV-2 (Delta), and with that comes the question of whether now would be a good time to consider getting vaccinated. I am no medical professional. Doctors and nurses go to school for years to learn about pathogens like this virus and how to prevent the spread of disease and how to treat infections. I suggest that you find a trusted doctor to advise you on how best to protect yourself and those you love.

As a priest, I, however, went to school for years to learn about Catholic theology, part of which is moral theology. My expertise after years of academic training is not quite judging whether a human act is morally good or evil. I only have a Bachelor in Sacred Theology (STB) (along with an M.Div. and an MA in Theology), but there are those who study far more than I do and are able to nitpick every detail of moral choices; they have Doctorates in Sacred Theology (STD). These are the kind of people who are employed in seminaries to train would-be priests or are employed by bishops to help them formulate their pastoral teaching on certain issues. My STB gives me a general good sense of what are worthy expert sources in order to understand and apply the teaching of the Catholic Church to moral questions of the day. It is worth knowing that these experts can differ in their advice because there are so many factors in moral choices, just like there are so many factors in giving medical advice and one might find in the same hospital differing opinions on how to treat some disease.

The moral question of whether vaccination is a good moral act centers especially around the issue that vaccinations seem to be morally compromised because of a connection to cell lines that pharmaceutical companies use to test and develop vaccines that originate in the willful death of a child through abortion. The nuts and bolts of this cell line connection is too complicated to get into here, but I would refer you to my go-to source for Catholic bioethical questions, the National Catholic Bioethics Center, which has done extensive research and deliberations from a Catholic bioethics perspective. For our discussion, it is first of all important to know that the Church has from the very beginning taught of the moral evil of abortion. There is no legitimate debate on this question in Catholic moral theology. Nevertheless, there is a question about benefitting from this terrible and tragic evil in the way that one might from receiving a vaccine. This kind of secondary participation in someone else's moral act is called in moral academic circles "cooperation."

Moral theologians distinguish between types of moral cooperation, "formal" and "material" cooperation. Formal cooperation means to choose the evil in one's will. For example, if my brother, when I was child, went into a store to steal candy (I shall not comment on whether this is an example based in history or not), and I waited outside for him, hoping to eat that stolen candy, I would have formally cooperated in the evil of theft, a grave sin, even though I never went into the store. Formal cooperation like that would be just as evil as stealing the candy myself.

Material cooperation is different. It is a kind of contribution to the act but not necessarily formally. For example, when I go to the US Post Office and buy stamps, I support the activity of the Post Office, materially. But I don't formally support every act of the post office. The USPS, for example, delivers mail to and picks up mail from establishments that I would not and could not morally support, like recreational marijuana dispensaries, for example. In a remote material way my buying stamps so that I can mail people mass cards supports the recreational marijuana dispensaries and other establishments, like abortion clinics, which benefit from the USPS services. Moral theology distinguishes between this kind of remote material cooperation and more proximate material cooperation. An example of proximate material cooperation would be donating money directly to Planned Parenthood or renting your store-front building to a marijuana dispensary. This kind of material cooperation, proximate material cooperation, is basically the same thing as "formal cooperation," and could implicate your will in the evil act done by another. But buying stamps is rather remote and should not trouble your conscience.

The question here is whether being vaccinated is remote or proximate material cooperation in the evil of an act of abortion. The moral theologians – the very learned doctors on this matter – have given their studied advice to the pastors of the Church – the Holy Father and the Bishops – and they have determined that there is

no formal cooperation, but rather remote material cooperation in receiving a vaccine. That doesn't mean we have to like it. And certainly, the people who make the vaccines might be implicated in evil of abortion, but receiving a vaccine is judged by most credible theologians and pastors to be like buying stamps, indirectly and remotely contributing to an evil act, but not morally complicit in it. By the way, there are unfortunately other ways these cell lines are used in testing common household products that doesn't get so much attention as vaccines.

Now, since we don't like that these companies use these cell lines, we should tell them so. Or we should prefer to receive a vaccine that is less morally tainted, if these were available. For Covid, sadly there are not any other available vaccines, right now. As an aside, there is a question about whether mRNA technology is a traditional vaccine or not, but I guess the medical tradition of vaccination, which originally "involved taking the pus from someone suffering with smallpox and scratching it into the skin of a healthy individual [or] blowing smallpox scabs up the nose," has developed over the years. Personally, because of my Moral Theology studies, I am excited about the mRNA technolo-

gy because it means that vaccine production is no longer dependent on cell lines at all (but they still use these cells for testing). But I understand why some people would hesitate to consume artificial products, like vitamins, Doritos, sunscreen, or vaccines. Also, I don't understand why Catholic medical facilities don't work to develop a similar cell line from sources that are not morally compromised.

Unfortunately, many people struggle with the moral connection between these aborted children and the vaccines. But as Catholics, we believe that true and authentic discernment regarding what is morally good or evil is the competence of the pastors of the Church – the Pope and the Bishops. Our consciences should be formed by their teaching, not the other way around. Although we are not obligated, necessarily, to get a vaccine, we should not feel any compunction about getting the shot if we judge it to be good for the sake of protecting ourselves or stopping the spread and further mutations of a deadly virus. It could even be the morally better thing to do, but the Church leaves that to our own individual consciences to determine.




