



OCTOBER 3: RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY


Statement of Respect for Life Month from Most Reverend Joseph F. Naumann, Chairman U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities

The month of October brings with it our annual observance of Respect Life Month. As part of the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis, this year's celebration highlights the example of that great saint. As the faithful protector of both Jesus and Mary, we find in St. Joseph a profound reminder of our own call to welcome, safeguard, and defend God's precious gift of human life.

Despite the mysterious circumstances surrounding Mary's pregnancy, St. Joseph took her into his home at the word of the angel. He guided their journey to Bethlehem, found shelter, and welcomed the infant Jesus as his son. When Herod threatened the life of the Christ Child, St. Joseph left his homeland behind and fled with Jesus and Mary to Egypt.

Like St. Joseph, we are also called to care for those God has entrusted to us—especially vulnerable mothers and children. We can follow in the footsteps of St. Joseph as protector by advocating against taxpayer-funded abortion, which targets the lives of millions of poor children and their mothers here in the United States. We can imitate his care and provision by helping to start Walking with Moms in Need at our parishes, "walking in the shoes" of mothers experiencing a difficult pregnancy, especially low-income mothers in our communities. At times, we may feel uncertain of our ability to answer the Lord's call. But He invites us to faithfully respond, despite our own fears or weaknesses: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9).

May we imitate St. Joseph's faithful trust and courage as we work to uphold the dignity of every human life. St. Joseph, defender of life, pray for us!



Each October, the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life. During this month, we will recite a pro-life prayer from the USCCB at each Sunday Mass at St. Cecilia. Remember our Lord values every life He creates and wants each of us to be in Heaven with Him.

OCTOBER 3: RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY (CONTINUED)



Every year, the US Bishops designate October as Respect Life month. St. Agatha's Respect Life Team in SE Portland would like to share a true story about the power of prayer. It's a story about two men, a father who was in the last stages of a long fight with cancer and his adult son, who was able to spend a lot of time with his Dad during his final weeks and days.

The son said that what his father wanted to do when he was awake and able was to pray the Rosary. And, every Rosary they prayed, they would pray for an end to abortion because that's what his father wanted to do. The son said that one day when they had already prayed several Rosaries to end abortion, and they were about to start another, he suggested to his father that maybe they could pray for something else this time. He said, "maybe we could pray for you to be healed or for your pain to be eased".

His father said, "no, we're praying for an end to abortion". And then, he sold his son why. He told his son about the inconvenience of his conception and how he and his mother had decided to have an abortion. He said, "we went to the first appointment and I paid the money, but when it was time to return and have the abortion, your mother stood me up". He said, "I was so angry, I didn't speak to her for weeks". His father shared a few more details and ended by saying, "and now here I am on my death bed praying with my son I wanted to abort."

The son said he felt so bad for his father, seeing him at the end of his life, having so much guilt and pain over what he referred to as "this near miss".

Two weeks later, his father, Julius Arabie, passed away. Afterward, his son, David Arabie, said he couldn't stop thinking about what his father had told him. He said he'd never thought that much about abortion before, but he sure did now. He felt he needed to do something about it, but he didn't know what that could be. And then, he said, an idea came into his mind. "What if we prayed outside places where abortions were performed and just stayed there until they closed. And then, when they did close, we'd move on to the next one and do the same thing there."

He knew it didn't make sense. He had no idea how this could even happen. But, he couldn't stop thinking about it. At one point, he mentioned it to some friends who were involved in pro-life activities. They loved his idea. They prayed about it. They gave it a timeline, and they had the skills to organize and promote. The result was the first 40 Days Prayer Campaign to end abortion. It took place in one location in 2004, outside a Planned Parenthood in Texas. Over the next three years, there were more campaigns in a few more locations. And, in 2007, 40 Days for Life became a national campaign. Today, it is international.

There are two campaigns each year in hundreds of locations around the world. Over 1 million people have participated in 40 Days for Life. Over 100 abortion facilities that were the prayer vigil sites of 40 Days have closed. Almost 200 abortion workers have left their jobs because of 40 Days campaigns. And, these are the details that we know about.

How did this happen? It was, of course, due to the prayers and hard work of many dedicated people. But, in the beginning, it was because God used the prayers of two men, a father dying of cancer and his son, who prayed for an end to abortion. Another example of the power of prayer!





Mis Queridos Hermanos en Cristo:

La primera lectura de la Misa de hoy relata la creación de la mujer por Dios y su BENDICIÓN DEL AMOR MATRIMONIAL entre Adán y Eva con el doble fin de unirlos profundamente como esposos, y traer hijos al mundo. El hombre está encantadísimo con el descubrimiento de “su pareja”, pues ningún otro ser viviente era capaz de responder a su necesidad de amistad y entrega.

En el evangelio, Jesús es cuestionado por los fariseos sobre un tema controvertido en ese tiempo: ¿Qué posición adoptaba él sobre las condiciones necesarias para aceptar un DIVORCIO? ¿Tenía que ser un asunto muy serio, o era permisible que el hombre divorciara a la mujer simplemente por aspectos de su personalidad o su conducta que no le desagradaban?

Jesús, como sabemos, no acepta NINGUNA de esas posiciones populares. Al contrario, va a insistir en volver a lo que Dios había establecido DESDE EL PRINCIPIO: El matrimonio es para toda la vida, y no hay “cláusulas de escape” en el compromiso, para cuando las cosas se ponen difíciles.
