



PASTOR'S CORNER

"The Potential 13th Apostle"

The encounter between Jesus and the rich young man highlights one of the difficulties and challenges of discipleship. It's very obvious that the rich young man understood his ultimate goal: eternal life. He asked Jesus: "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" And, when Jesus enumerated to (continued)

him the commandments as the path to eternal life, the rich young man confidently answered: "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth". Jesus responded: "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me". The gospel story mentioned that the rich man went away sad for he had many possessions.

The rich man's story is the story of many. One may understand and believe that God invites us to eternity with him, following all the "requirements" and rudiments of religion, yet still divided and conflicted in putting the Lord as our utmost priority and our greatest treasure. The man's wealth isn't the issue here but, rather, his attitude towards it. He was possessed by his own possessions. Rather than having control over them, his possessions controlled him. Possessions are to be used; we don't use people or relationships in order to possess things.


What do you consider are your important possessions? Do they serve to glorify God in the end and deepen your relationship with others? Or, do they get in the way of having meaningful, true and lasting

relationships? At times, possessions can even be the source of conflicts, bickering and strained relationships, among marriages, families, friends, communities and nations.

It's interesting that Jesus mentioned the commandments first when the young man asked Jesus about inheriting eternal life. Commandments, in its final analysis, must deepen our attachment to God and our detachment from other worldly things. They only serve its purpose when one grows in self-surrender, finding in the Lord our greatest treasure. The young man went away sad. He found great sadness in his possessions, but he wasn't willing to give them up just yet. He wasn't yet ready to follow Christ. He could have been the 13th apostle!

This reminds me of an adage: The only things we can bring with us when we die are the things we have given away. Would you have a different answer from the young man if it's you that Jesus invited to follow him? Will you be the 13th apostle?

Before I end this reflection, I want to thank everyone for your greetings, cards, gifts and, especially, for your prayers when we celebrated Priesthood Sunday two weeks ago. When I think of you and of our parish, I thank the Lord for his goodness, graciousness and love for me. – Fr. Cary

IRA - REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

If you're 70½ or older, you can transfer your 2021 RMD (up to \$100,000) to a charity at any time. The donation counts as your required minimum distribution but doesn't increase your adjusted gross income, which can be particularly helpful if you don't itemize and can't deduct charitable contributions. The money needs to be transferred directly from the IRA to the charity in order to be tax-free. If you withdraw it from the IRA first and then give it to the charity, you can deduct the gift as a charitable contribution (if you itemize), but the withdrawal will be included in your adjusted gross income. Sandra and I (Therese) were at Lilith this morning. Even though we didn't see any prospective clients, we had many good interactions.

One young man responded when we told him of the late-term abortions happening on the 9th floor, and that we were there to help women with their babies. He said, "I got a girl pregnant." Recently? "Yeah". What's she going to do? "I don't know. She's acting weird". What do you mean? "She won't answer my calls".

Maybe you can get through to her. Give her this information/resources. We'll give her anything she needs! "I can provide for her; I can get the things for her" he said with pride. We showed him pictures of the baby's development and gave him some brochures.

How far along is she? "I don't know. About 2 or so months."

Sandra gave him a 12-week fetal model in a little blanket. He said she lives in Salem, and that he wanted to go down there and see her. We urged him to do so, and said that even if she didn't want to be with him, he should at least try to save the baby. What's her name? "(withheld)." We said we'd pray for her and ask you to pray also.

FUN FACTS!

Some claim that Jerusalem's city wall had a narrow gate known as the "eye of the needle." The size of the gate made it impossible for a fully loaded camel to pass through it. The animal would have to be fully unloaded or walk on its knees, in a vulnerable position, in order to get through the opening.

MEET OUR EXTENDED FAMILY: **BL. ADÍLIO DARONCH** (FEAST DAY: MAY 21)

Blessed Adílio Daronch was a Catholic teenager. He was born to Italian immigrants as the third of eight children and lived his entire life in Brazil. He was known to have had a love for football and riding. He became a dedicated altar server following the reception of his First Communion and often accompanied the priest, Blessed Manuel Gómez González, on his long missions of evangelization to the Kaingang Indians.

In 1924, the Bishop of Santa Maria asked Fr. Manuel to go to the Teutonic colonies in the forest in the south, so Fr. Manuel decided to take Daronch with him. The pair stopped in Palmeria to administer the sacraments where Fr. Manuel exhorted the local revolutionaries to practice mutual respect and forgiveness. But the extremists took a strong dislike to this and grew incensed when he provided a burial for some of their own. The extremists viewed the pair with suspicion and plotted to kill them for this.

The locals warned the two not to go into the forest for they would be at risk. The pair was ambushed in the morning on May 21 and shot dead. Both were beatified in October of 2007 in Brazil. Daronch was made the co-patron for World Youth Day 2012 and 2013.




