

PASTOR'S CORNER

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

With the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we formally close the Christmas season. The baby Jesus is now a grown up man! He is ready to start his public ministry; ready to begin his long-awaited journey to Jerusalem, where he will manifest and reveal why he came in the first place. The Child-King, who was visited last Sunday by the Magi in the Feast of the Epiphany, is ready to embrace the cross, his salvific throne as King. This is the very reason why the Father is "pleased with him" using the words in the Gospel today.

The baptism of the Lord in the Jordan River was also the beginning of his active public ministry. After baptism, we saw him preaching boldly the Good News, curing the sick, etc. This is also what is expected of us of our baptism. Our baptism carries a huge responsibility of leading a life according to our Christian commitment. The rich and many symbols of the sacrament of baptism start with the asking of the priest for the name of the child which signifies that the person to be baptized is no longer anonymous, he/she cannot live in darkness anymore without a clear identity but is now a child of God. Another powerful symbol in the baptismal rite is the signing of the cross in which the priest says these words, "(name), the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Savior by the sign of his cross," which powerfully communicates that we are now of God's because that sign is an indelible mark of our incorporation to Jesus, and to act otherwise is then to deny our new identity. As baptized, we walk in this world with that invisible sign of the cross on our forehead and that invisible sign is made visible by the way we lead our own lives. How are we living up to our baptismal commitment?

When I was eleven years old one of my best friends tried to commit suicide. From the hours of ten PM to three AM in the morning the frantic search was on for a vulnerable and hurt eleven year old girl. This ordeal started at bedtime that night. I had decided to sneak my phone upstairs and even though I disobeyed my parents I'm thankful I did. What started as a light and carefree conversation between two friends slowly started to turn dark and ruinous. As she told me of her feelings I was having a difficult time convincing my friend that suicide was not an option. As I grew more and more concerned I decided to tell my parents. I sat there and listened as they called the police and handled the situation.

As the night went on my concern continued to grow, and for the first time in a long time I prayed. Even though I go to a Catholic school and mass regularly, my connection to God was distant. As I thought about my friend and the hurt that she was going through it scared me. This made me want to reconnect to God and my faith. Sometimes these trying events are the ones that impact us the most, and the ones that bring us closer to God.

Loss is painful, loss happens because we are mortal. When we think about life it should never be about the things we have, but the people we share it with. The loss of a friend is one I never wanted to, or want to experience, and it was that fear that made me want to rekindle my relationship with God. In that moment it was hard to focus on anything but the fear I felt. I froze up and debated with myself whether telling my parents was worth the risk of my friend being mad at me. I didn't know what I would do if she was mad because even though I knew that what I had done was right I couldn't bear the thought of her being mad at me. I had to surrender control and put my fears and hopes into the arms of God. In that moment my connection with God was strengthened. This event caused my faith to grow and persevere through the hardships it was facing and as a result my relationship with God matured.

As I continue to grow in faith I clearly see this experience has affected many aspects of my life profoundly. It shapes my perspective and view of the world. Instead of waking up to another random day I now thank God for each moment. My life is full, and instead of wanting what I don't have I thank God for what I do. I have not yet experienced all that God can show me but I look forward to the days ahead as I know they will be faith filled and full of promise.

This event has shaped who I am as a person and Catholic and whenever I face trials in my faith I try to find the joy in it. I know that no matter what God will always be there for me. Even when I'm mad at him he's always there on the other side of the door waiting patiently for me to open it and embrace him once again. I learned I can always count on God to welcome me back with open arms and that you shouldn't wait until something goes wrong to embrace him. "But Jesus beheld (them), and said unto them, With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible," Matthew 19:26.

RESEPECT LIFE

U.S. Bishops' Pro-Life Chairman Denounces FDA Decision on Chemical Abortion Pill

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced they will eliminate the safety requirement of in-person dispensing in the Risk Evaluation Mitigation Strategy (REMS) for the chemical abortion drug mifepristone in response for the diminishing number of doctors who are willing to do abortions. The new protocol expands the use of Mifeprex (morning after pill) to 70 days after conception. The new recommendation also cuts the dosage down to one pill. The FDA's action clears a path for the drug to be dispensed by clinics, medical offices, and hospitals through the use of online pharmacies or drug delivery services. Planned Parenthood doctors can dispense the pill.

Mifeprex blocks the action of progesterone – the natural hormone vital to maintaining the rich nutrient lining of the uterus. As a

result, the tiny, developing baby literally starves to death as the nutrient lining of the womb sloughs off.

The new protocol expands the possibility of a failed abortion and/or danger to the woman.

Possible Side Effects of an RU 486 Abortion*

- Nausea, diarrhea, vomiting, dizziness, headache
- Severe cramping
- Incomplete abortion requiring surgical abortion.
- Infection
- Heart palpitations
- Hemorrhage (heavy bleeding)
- Allergic reaction to the medicines.
- Rupture of tubal pregnancy
- Emergency treatment for any of the above problems, including possible need to treat with an operation, medicines, or a blood transfusion.
- Psychological trauma from seeing the baby's body
- Rarely, death (at least 14 women have died since the FDA approved the drug).

In response, Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement:

"Every life is sacred: the lives of mothers and the lives of the unborn. Not only does this decision further the tragic taking of unborn lives but it does little to care for the well-being of women in need. Far from the accompaniment that women in crisis pregnancies deserve, this decision would leave women alone in the midst of trauma, often without any medical attention or follow up care.

"One of the essential tasks of governments is to safeguard the health and well-being of citizens. As such, the FDA ought to act to protect the lives and health of mothers and children, rather than merely succumbing to the abortion industry's pressure to loosen safety standards. "I call on leaders of every level of government to stand with women in need by promoting policies that recognize the value and human dignity of both mother and child, rather than further promoting the devastating tragedy of abortion." <u>usceb.org</u>


GOSPEL






St. Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and Doctor of the Church | January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 - c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.


