

PASTOR'S CORNER

Do Whatever He Tells You

The story of the Wedding at Cana offers us deep insights on the life of faith aside from showcasing the stupendous ability of Christ to change water to wine. As the evangelist John himself said, “Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory.” When the gospel writer refers to this miracle as a “sign,” it speaks of its transcendental meaning. It points to a bigger reality than water and wine. Allow me to do some observations.

Mary named the problem: they have no wine. She had the courage to confront the issue in front of them. We need “Marys” in our relationships that have no fear in naming what is going wrong. She does not necessarily offer any suggestions to Jesus but simply names the problem; she lets Jesus make the final decision. At times the problems are already too obvious in front of us yet one pretends that everything is going well for the sake of maintaining “peace.” Think of situations in your life where you refuse to see the big elephant in the room.

Wine. It stands for life, zest, feast, abundance, prosperity, and joy. Is your life full of “wine?” I do not mean cases of pinot noir and merlot, but the wine of love, mercy, happiness, contentment, peace, dignity, courage, perseverance, and all the other things that make life vibrant, meaningful, and full. What “wine” has run out for you? Are there parts of your life that are dry and empty today? In what ways has life become sour or colorless and tasteless?

“Do whatever he tells you.” If we want our life to be full again, then we need to heed these last recorded words of Mary in the Scriptures. But the interesting thing about this miracle is that Jesus did not do it entirely by himself: Mary named the emptiness; the servants poured water; the headwaiter tasted the new wine. Many people had important parts to play in keeping the joy of the wedding banquet. You and I have important parts to play in keeping a life of joy! What part/s are you willing to play? – **Fr. Cary**

IT TAKES ALL KINDS

Everyday Stewardship Recognize God in your Ordinary Moments

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

DEL DIÁCONO BILL

Mis Queridos Hermanos en Cristo:

En la segunda lectura de hoy, SAN PABLO nos habla sobre el extraordinario amor de Dios manifestado en su deseo de compartir los dones de su Propio Espíritu (Santo) con nosotros que somos su Iglesia. Aquí San Pablo nos indica algunos de los dones a los que se refiere, (fe, profecía, lenguas, sabiduría, ciencia, etc.).

Sin embargo, su énfasis no está puesto tanto en los dones mismos. Lo que hace resaltar San Pablo es que TODOS LOS DONES vienen de DIOS. No son obra de los seres humanos, por muy dedicados que estos sean; existen y se reparten por DIOS así como Él lo desea. Y no es para nuestro bienestar o santificación individual en ningún caso. Los dones son, como Pablo lo proclama claramente, para EL BIEN COMÚN, o sea, para el beneficio y la santificación de la Iglesia entera, e incluso también para alcanzar a los que están alejados o lo ignoran.

La responsabilidad de los que reciben dones es grande: consiste en estar siempre dispuesto(a) a ofrecerlos para el bien de otros. Los dones son, en el fondo, vehículos que DIOS desea usar para extender su Reino y Su misericordia en nosotros y a nuestro alrededor, sin discriminar contra nadie.

BAUTISMOS - DE JESUS Y EL NUESTRO

El bautismo de Jesús es muy diferente al nuestro, porque él es EL Hijo de Dios por naturaleza, desde toda la eternidad, y no tiene pecado ni necesidad de ser perdonado. Además, él sabe muy bien su misión de parte del Padre: proclamar por el resto de su vida el Reino de Dios, aceptando las consecuencias de esta misión, incluyendo la muerte en una cruz para nuestra salvación.

La mayoría de nosotros recibimos el bautismo como niños, antes de tener idea de lo que implica (de allí el rol crítico e indispensable de los padres y padrinos). Es solamente después de un largo aprendizaje que empezamos a entender la belleza del regalo recibido y la responsabilidad que trae consigo para testimoniarlo con nuestras vidas. Y, a diferencia de Jesús, llegamos a ser hijos por adopción, y herederos del Reino.

¡Qué regalo tan extraordinario nos da el Señor, porque nos ama!

No hay que olvidar que nunca pueden reemplazar los medios fundamentales y primordiales que tenemos para alcanzar la salvación: los sacramentos, especialmente la Reconciliación y LA EUCHARISTÍA, la Sagrada Escritura, la oración, la conversión, y nuestras enseñanzas magisteriales (como se encuentran, por ejemplo, en el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica).

Bajo estas condiciones, las revelaciones privadas nos pueden ayudar a entender mejor nuestra situación, y caminar con más confianza en Dios.

2º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Con la fiesta de la Epifanía y el Bautismo del Señor se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, que siempre es precedido por el Adviento. Ahora, comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. Serán siete domingos de este corto periodo, que termina el día anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza. La segunda etapa de este Tiempo es más larga, da comienzo después del domingo de Pentecostés y termina hasta el sábado antes del primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Para qué sirve a los cristianos este Tiempo Ordinario? ¿Qué nos pide la Liturgia de este tiempo? Pues, es muy sencillo, nos pide meditar en el misterio de Cristo. En su invitación de participar en su Reino con alegría y compromiso verdadero. La Iglesia tiene diversidad de carismas, donde podemos entregarnos al servicio de los demás.

Por ejemplo, hoy el Evangelio nos invita a participar junto con María y Jesús en las bodas de Caná. Y es ahí en esa boda, donde Jesús hace su primer milagro a petición de su Madre María. El diálogo de ambos viene a ser a causa de la falta de vino. Por lo tanto, los novios estaban en apuros por esta razón. Este relato es muy profundo, el hecho de que Jesús participa en la boda, tiene como significado la boda de Dios con la humanidad, que más adelante será la Sangre de Jesús derramada para la salvación de la humanidad. “Alegrémonos, regocijémonos démosle honor y gloria, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero” (Apocalipsis 19,7). También, el profeta en la primera lectura lo pone claro: “No te llamarán más ‘Abandonada’, ni a tu tierra ‘Desolada’, sino que te llamarán ‘Mi Preferida’ y a tu tierra ‘Desposada’. Porque Yavé se complacerá en ti y tu tierra tendrá un esposo” (Isaías 62,4).



St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.


