The Church Teaches...



The disciples of the Lord, about whom we have been reading in the Acts of the Apostles this Easter season, physically saw the risen Christ. He walked with them, talked with them, and even ate with them. They saw Him ascend to the Father. All of this brought them a deep conviction and a confidence which radically changed their lives.

We are now centuries removed from these events. Isn't it easy to dismiss all of this as mere "story" or myth, as many do? Without the real experience the first-followers had, coming to such faith requires a choice, and it is a choice that everyone must make. Do we believe that we are here on this planet and as the people we are because of some random physiological or biological process that came together at some random moment providing us with what is? Or do we believe that we are here because we have been "loved into existence" by a God who chose for us to be here and chose for us to be who we are with souls that are unique and shared by no one else?

If we choose the first, then nothing we do or say here makes any sense. If we choose the second, and continue to follow its truth, we are going to find ourselves constantly *bumping into* the God who loves us! The bottom line is that God made us to be with Him, and God will make sure (in the end) that we are where we are meant to be. That is the power behind the Feast of the Ascension!

The Ascension connects some important dots. It brings us to where we ought to be, it connects us to our true selves. It brings all things together and removes the gap that we sometimes create between the human and the divine, the secular and the sacred. This Feast brings us home. It brings this world home just as much as it brings Jesus home.

Let us sing God's praise, for one day we shall be fully united with God, as God promised. Make the choice and believe!

Liturgical Note: We observe Easter in different stages. Easter Sunday is the greatest Sunday of the year, and it marks the start of the “Easter Season.”

The entire Season lasts 50 days, including the Ascension of the Lord, and it ends with Pentecost, which is derived from the Greek word “pentecoste,” meaning “50th.” The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as “one great Sunday.” Alleluia!


Happy Mary's Month to You!

EL EVANGELIO



Celebramos hoy la Solemnidad de la Ascensión del Señor, que forma parte del misterio salvador de la Pascua, que culminaremos el próximo domingo con la Solemnidad de Pentecostés. Jesús, finalizada su misión en la tierra, sube al cielo ante la mirada de los Apóstoles, para ser glorificado junto al Padre, y nos deja la tarea de continuar su obra: de ser sus testigos hasta los confines de la tierra.

Para expresar gráficamente el deseo de Jesús, San Lucas describe su partida (su Ascensión) de este mundo de manera sorprendente: Jesús vuelve al Padre levantando sus manos y bendiciendo a sus discípulos. Es su último gesto. Jesús entra en el misterio insondable de Dios y sobre el mundo descende su bendición.

A los creyentes se nos ha olvidado que somos portadores de la bendición de Jesús. Nuestra primera tarea es ser testigos de la Bondad de Dios y mantener viva la esperanza – no rendirnos ante el mal. Este mundo que parece un “infierno maldito” no está perdido. Dios lo mira con ternura y compasión.

También hoy es posible buscar el bien, hacer el bien, y difundir el bien. Es posible trabajar por un mundo más humano y un estilo de vida más sano. Debemos ser más solidarios y menos egoístas.

Mayo: El Mes de la Virgen María



Los Evangelios presentan a la Virgen María con rasgos que pueden reavivar nuestra devoción a María, la Madre de Jesús. Su visión nos ayuda a amarla, meditarla, imitarla, rezarla, y confiar en ella con espíritu nuevo y más Evangélico.

La Virgen María es la gran creyente, la primera seguidora de Jesús, la mujer que sabe meditar en su corazón los hechos y las palabras de su Hijo. Ella es la madre fiel que permanece junto a su Hijo perseguido, condenado, y matado en la Cruz. Ella también es testigo de Cristo Resucitado, que acoge junto a los discípulos al Espíritu que acompañará siempre a la Iglesia.

La Virgen María nos enseña como nadie a seguir a Jesús, anunciando al Dios de la compasión, trabajando por un mundo más fraterno y confiando en el Padre que nos ama.



La Conferencia de San Vicente de Paúl, aquí en la parroquia de Santa Cruz está buscando la oportunidad para llevar comida una vez (más) al mes.

Además de las horas semanales que están sirviendo ahora, el Banco de Comida estará “abierto” el último domingo del mes a la 1pm (por ejemplo, hoy, el 29 de mayo).

El equipo (compuesto de parroquianos) espera poder tener disponible comida para aquellos que necesitan una “mano amiga” para ellos mismos, pero también quieren motivarnos a que vayamos a nuestros vecinos que quizás no tienen comida suficiente. Si alguno de nosotros tenemos algún vecino/a “en necesidad” vamos a planear llevarles comida: de esta manera “nadie pasará hambre.” ¡Gracias!

PARA REFLEJAR



Cuando muere alguna persona, bondadosa y cercana a nosotros, tenemos el sentimiento de que ella permanece todavía con nosotros y sigue inspirándonos y guiándonos.

Cuando en la Ascensión Jesús dejó a sus discípulos y pasó a la gloria del cielo, Él fue para sus discípulos más que una memoria de una gran persona que había muerto. Primero, Él está todavía vivo como el Señor resucitado. Él marchó, pero permanece con nosotros por su Espíritu de fortaleza, sabiduría y amor. De esta forma es nuestro compañero en nuestra vida. Él profiere todavía para nosotros su palabra, todavía se nos da como nuestra bebida y alimento en la Eucaristía, y vive en nuestra comunidad.

Jesús, el Señor, nos dice como les dijo a los Apóstoles: “Sean mis testigos para el mundo entero.” No nos quedemos mirando pasivamente al cielo, sino que seamos su mensaje de esperanza para la gente de la tierra por el modo cómo vivimos su Evangelio.

Después de celebrar las Primeras Comuniones en nuestra parroquia, podemos recordarnos que la Iglesia Católica tiene siete sacramentos, de los cuales la Eucaristía es el “Sacramento de los sacramentos,” como afirmó Santo Tomás de Aquino.

Como enseña la Iglesia, la Eucaristía es la presencia real de Jesucristo en cuerpo, sangre, alma, y divinidad, bajo la apariencia de pan y vino. Además se conoce como “Santa Comunión.” “Comunión” proviene del latín *communio*, que significa “estar en unión con.” El Catecismo de la Iglesia señala que a la Eucaristía se le refiere con este nombre “porque por este sacramento nos unimos a Cristo que nos hace partícipes de su Cuerpo y de su Sangre para formar un solo cuerpo.” (1331)

Asimismo, el Catecismo afirma que quien acoge a Jesús en la Eucaristía recibe también “la prenda de la gloria que tendremos junto a Él. La participación en el Santo Sacrificio nos identifica con su Corazón, sostiene nuestras fuerzas a lo largo del peregrinar de esta vida, nos hace desear la Vida eterna, y nos une ya desde ahora a la Iglesia del cielo, a la Santa Virgen María y a todos los santos.” (1416)
