Pastor's Column

My dear Kirkland Catholics,

This “Sticky Faith: A Communal Charge” homily series is focused primarily on youth faith development. But in reality, nearly every principle we are discussing also applies to adult faith development.

This is what I meant when I said in the first homily of the series that what we are doing with our young people is, in a sense, a beta version of what we will soon be focusing on more intentionally with adults. There are very real connections here to where we are going with the One Parish Plan, and especially with the two initiatives related to “Discipleship Pathways” and “Small Groups.”

If a 5:1 ratio of caring adults to young people is ideal for helping faith “stick” in youth, studies suggest that something similar is true for adults: the most engaged and spiritually healthy adults are rarely trying to live the Christian life alone.

For example, the Gallup survey of parish health—the ME25, which Holy Family completed in 2017 and 2019—included several questions directly related to this. Among the signs of strong engagement were whether a person had “a best friend” in the parish, whether someone in the parish encouraged his or her spiritual growth, and whether, in the previous six months, someone had asked about the progress of that person’s spiritual life.

Where do those kinds of relationships most naturally develop? In small groups, and through the programs, ministries, and service opportunities that form part of our Discipleship Pathways. Studies consistently show that lay Catholics who feel they are largely “on their own” in their pursuit of God, without meaningful human relationships around them, report some of the lowest levels of satisfaction and engagement in their faith.

Being intentional about participating in the life of the parish creates ripples throughout the whole family. God does not waste those moments when we stretch ourselves communally, step a little outside our comfort zones, or make ourselves more available to one another. In His creative Providence, He uses all of it to bring us grace and to draw us into deeper communion with Him and with one another.

Let us pray for the openness to be stretched, to be more intentional in our relationships with one another, and to be ready to say yes when opportunities for growth present themselves.

Serving Christ in our Neighbors

THE WORK OF THE SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

On the Memorial of St. Vincent de Paul, September 27, our parish family gives thanks for the work of our St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) conferences at HFK and SJV. Inspired by St. Vincent's example of charity, our Vincentians provide year-round support to neighbors in need within our community.

With compassion and humility, our volunteers meet with neighbors to discern the best ways to assist with rent, utilities, food, clothing, household goods, gasoline, and other essential needs. In just the first six months of this year, our two conferences made 298 in-person visits and 222 telephone visits, assisting 1,208 people. Together, they provided \$154,603 in financial assistance - \$97,149 to help neighbors remain in their homes and \$16,392 to keep utilities running.

This charitable work is only possible because of the outstanding support of both parishes. Your financial gifts, food donations, and prayers sustain this ministry. Thank you for helping us serve Christ in those who are struggling.

At the heart of SVdP is the spiritual growth of its members: seeing the face of Christ in those we serve and strengthening our Vincentian friendship with one another. I was first drawn to St. Vincent de Paul because I wanted to help the poor and be part of something bigger than myself. This ministry allows us to take practical, tangible action—sharing our time, our resources, and our hearts. I love that about SVdP. There have been so many moments of grace over the years. Each visit stays with me because every person and every family is unique in their needs and in their story. In every encounter, we strive to see the face of Christ in the person before us, and that changes you.

My hope is that this ministry continues to help those who are struggling and continues to support parishioners who feel called to take action on behalf of the poor. We are a welcoming group, strengthened by every volunteer who joins us. Please join us—we truly benefit from each person who says yes. - Mary

SVdP ministry is transformational. Through SVdP home visits I have been invited into the apartments of some of the poorest but kindest people in our community. Often, they are embarrassed to reach out for help, but our role is to meet them where they are and to help where we can. I have grown to see the world differently since volunteering with SVdP. I'm more compassionate and more generous of spirit; thankful for the gifts God has provided. - Eileen

When I returned to the Catholic church in 1990, God placed in my heart a strong desire to assist the less fortunate in our community. So the first ministry that I joined at SJV was St Vincent de Paul, to help serve our needy neighbors in Kirkland and Kenmore. It has been so rewarding that I continue to volunteer 36 years later. In addition, some of my closest friends are members of SVdP. - Tom

You never know how deep the need is just around the corner. My partner and I once visited a sparsely furnished apartment in a building not far from Holy Family. We were invited into the kitchen to set down the groceries we'd brought, because the mother had a pot of beans boiling on the stove for dinner. When she opened the refrigerator to put something away, we saw it was literally empty except for a single condiment bottle. As she eagerly unpacked the groceries, her daughter spotted a box of cereal. "Yay!" she exclaimed. "I can have that with my birthday beans!" The mother had used everything she had to pay the rent, so there would be no presents or gift wrap. The beans were all they had.

Parishioners sometimes tell me they would feel embarrassed to visit our neighbors in need. But I promise you: members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society receive opulent gifts through these home visits. I always leave with a tremendous sense of gratitude for all I have. Vincentians gain perspective and humility by getting over our embarrassment.

Those we visit are our siblings in Christ. I see them at Café on Sundays. Some have returned because we invited them to join us at Mass.

The ministry of SVdP is beyond words. Your generosity makes this work possible, and we are deeply grateful for every gift that allows us to serve our neighbors. It is heartbreaking when we cannot help a deserving family because we've exceeded our budget for the month. Sincere thanks on behalf of the many children we serve. - Loretta

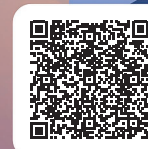
