Synod Update from Deacon Bill . . .

So where are we now on our Synod Journey?

A 5-page report has been compiled from all of your responses via email, google mail, zoom, general meetings, and handwritten notes.

Thanks to all of you who have responded!

We received 182 responses from approximately 75 people. You can find the report sent from St. Clare Parish to the Archdiocese by visiting <u>www.saintclarechurch.org</u> and click on *Report on Synod Questions* under QuickLinks on the homepage. Please note some of your responses were quoted directly to highlight a theme.

What's next?

Father Don and two representatives from the parish will attend a Vicariate meeting at St. Anthony Parish on May 4th. Our Vicariate has 6 parishes and 1 mission. At that gathering, approximately 50 representatives will participate in generating the Vicariate Document which will include many of the themes that we have touched upon. It will reinforce the themes and ideas expressed by all of you. That report will also be forwarded to the Archdiocese. After the Archdiocese receives all the Vicariate reports, it will work on the final report which will be sent to the (USCCB United States Conference of Catholic Bishops). Their final document will be delivered to Rome.

Let's keep praying that everyone keeps listening.
