

#### <u>Weekly Reflection</u> 3rd Sunday of Easter May 1, 2022

What prevents us from seeing the Lord? We are not used to seeing Jesus in the ordinary, everyday events of our lives. We expect some kind of startling, extraordinary revelation to occur that definitely and unmistakably sends a signal that God wants our attention. We don't expect a visit from Jesus while we are having breakfast, doing the dishes, running after the kids, negotiating a deal at work, or taking a shower! Sometimes when God simply stands on the shore of our lives casually looking for us, we don't recognize him. Did we ever stop and think that God is really and truly interested in the routine, run of the mill events of our lives? So, "what did you do today?" God may ask. Maybe we don't think that God is concerned about such things, or we are so consumed with life's demands that we give it little if any thought. Perhaps we are determined to achieve our own success, desire to control things ourselves or not really sure what God cares about. God is there. One day, out of the blue, God will get our attention and ask, "Do you love me? ©LPi

#### Fr. Don's Musings . . .

Last weekend, we had 16 of our high school students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Peter Smith at our 10:45 Mass. This week we have about 30 of our younger parishioners receiving their First Holy Communion. These students received their First Reconciliation back in February and now they are receiving Holy Communion. I'm proud of them.

Do you remember what the seven Sacraments are? Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist, Confirmation, Matrimony, Holy Orders, and Anointing of the Sick. Sacraments are visible signs, instituted by God, that give us invisible grace. God gives us grace in LOTS of ways but the Sacraments are special ways that God gives us grace.

In Holy Communion (Eucharist), the visible sign is receiving the bread and wine that has become the Body and Blood of Christ. God instituted it at the Last Supper, and it gives us the grace of union with God. As we eat the Body of Christ, together we become the Body of Christ. Our job is to be the Body of Christ to those around us, to bring Christ's goodness to our world. As St. Augustine said, "we become what we receive."

Congratulations to our 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion recipients this weekend. May they always experience the closeness of Jesus in their lives as they continue to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. ~ *Fr. Don*

#### Deacon Bill Goes to the Movies . . .



I had the chance last Tuesday to head to Bridgeport Village to catch the new movie, called *Father Stu*. The movie has an R-rating and is not for kids because of language and excessive

violence, but that was what Stu Long was all about until he settled down and let God into his life. It is based on a true story about Father Stu Long who was ordained a priest after being formed at Mount Angel Seminary here in Oregon right down the road from us.

The movie depicted a life changing story of a person searching for a meaning in this life and only finding it in God and then still staying connected to God even after contracting a disease that would cause loss of mobility and eventually an early death. There were many good Christian themes depicted in Father Stu's story such as forgiveness, redemption, reconciliation and acceptance of suffering.

Father Stu is a 2 hour and 4 minute movie. I, for one, judge a movie by looking at the time to see how much longer it will be until the end. Even though I knew the story before hand, I never checked my watch once to see how much time was left.

Mark Wahlberg who starred, produced, and put his own money into the picture, took on this six year project, because as he stated, "this really resonated with me." Just for that fact alone, to advocate for a Christian-based movie, it is well worth going to see.



#### Small Group Study: The Holy Spirit


Begins on Thursday, May 5 9:15 - 10:30am Clare Room downstairs at the Parish Office

*So, who is the Holy Spirit in your life and what does he mean to you?* The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God and Jesus, will not come into our lives without an invitation. He wants to live within us, to comfort us and to teach us. He wants to help us on our journey, but we must ask him to guide us and direct us.

Throughout Lent, a group of St. Clare parishioners gathered each week for fellowship, learning and reflection. This is a lively group always excited to discuss with each other many different topics of the church and their faith. On Thursday, May 5, we will begin a new series focused on the Holy Spirit in our lives. All are invited to come and are welcome to join us whenever available.

This new study will include a series called, *Wild Goose*. "Wild Goose" was a term that the ancient Celts had for the Holy Spirit. This 14-part series features Fr. Dave Pivonka, a Franciscan priest from the University of Steubenville. The Wild Goose invites viewers to an encounter or renewed encounter with the Holy Spirit.





During the second part of each session, there will be a discussion on the book, *A Church Renewed* by Pope Francis. Our focus for this series is: *What is it that the Holy Spirit is calling us to do in this current time in the church?*


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#### THE WAY OF ST. JAMES


#### ACTS OF THE APOSTLES WITH MARK HART
