

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 12, 2022

Life can leave us feeling very distracted and detached. Perhaps this is why many people seek things that make them "feel good," wrongly believing those things actually provide a sense of meaning and purpose. In truth, they are simply more distractions. When we discover real silence, we can realize that the stirrings and impulses in our hearts desiring connection, meaning, and purpose are really God desperately trying to pull us toward His Divine Heart. Once we submit to God's pull, we are led to the beauty of God's presence. This holy presence carries us to the heights of mountains, the vastness of ocean depths, the beginning of things and their end, and the majesty of universal wonder. We meet the Father. Then, gently carried to the tenderness of compassion, love, mercy, and forgiveness we touch the innocence and vulnerability of life. We see the poor and those who are broken. We meet the Son. Fr. Don's Musings . . .

This week, we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday. My brother is the pastor at Holy Trinity Church in Beaverton and they do a big celebration of their feast day there. We'll celebrate St. Clare's feast day in August (Feast of St. Clare is Aug. 11) but like all Catholic churches around the world, we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday this weekend.

Our God is so big that God comes to us in three distinct ways, as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

When I think of God the Father, I think of God the Creator. I appreciate the Creator when I am praying out on the river early in the morning and surrounded by natural beauty: the shimmering water, the clouds or sun, the bright green trees, the eagles, geese, ducks, beavers... The little cove that I like to pray in, God the Creator made all the beauty we see and enjoy.

When I think of God the Son, I think of Jesus as my brother. He walked on this earth, he experienced the same emotions and feelings that I do. He knows what it's like to be human, and he knows me. I treat Jesus like a good friend, because in fact, he is my BEST friend.

When I think of God the Holy Spirit, I think of God's presence inside of me and inside of you. The Holy Spirit empowers me to continue the work that Jesus began. The Holy Spirit helps me to not only live Jesus' message of love, truth and goodness, but to spread that message to others. The Holy Spirit empowers me and you to be disciples for Jesus.

We are blessed to have such an awesome God. Today, we celebrate the three persons in our one God. Which person of the Trinity do you most relate to? Which person of the Trinity do you have the most questions about? Which person of the Trinity do you usually pray to?

Dear God, I want the Holy Spirit to teach me more about Jesus, too.


