God the Father created our Earth, and he is asking us to care for it, understand its needs, and protect it.

In Psalm 8:4-9, the psalmist tells us . . .

"When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, the son of man that you care for him?
You made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. You made him ruler over the works of your hands; you put everything under his feet: all flocks and herds, and the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish if the sea, all that swim in the paths of the seas."

Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge, and the Teachings of Plants by Robin Wall Kimmerer

Drawing on her life as an indigenous scientist, Kimmerer demonstrates in this book how all living things including asters, goldenrod, salamanders, algae, sweetgrass, and more offer us "gifts and lessons, even if we've forgotten to hear their voices." She makes a case for her belief "that the awakening of ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgment and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world. For only when we can hear the languages of other beings will we be capable of understanding the generosity of the earth, and learn to give our own gifts in return."

Named as a bestseller by the *New York Times, the Washington Post,* and the *Los Angeles Times* and a Best Essay Collection of the Decade by *Literary Hub*, this collection of essays is described by author Elizabeth Gilbert as "a journey that is every bit as mythic as it is scientific, as sacred as it is historical, as clever as it is wise."

Robin Wall Kimmerer is a scientist, a decorated professor, and an enrolled member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation. She is a SUNY Distinguished Teaching Professor of Environmental Biology and the founder and director of the Center for Native Peoples and the Environment.
