

Annual Catholic Appeal Goal: \$114,800. 106 families have pledged about \$35,000. We have a way to go, but with your help we can reach our goal.

Rector update: The cost to add air conditioning to the three priests' living quarters is just over \$60,000 which includes the electrical work. Three heat pumps will be attached on the north side of the rectory, just above the garage roof. Funds in our building fund will be used for this work.

Seeking a Landscaper: Dan Payne has been mowing the lawns. The garden beds need weeding. We are looking to hire a landscaper to keep our grounds looking their best.

The July 2023 through April 2024 Financial Report to the finance council showed that the total revenue exceeded all expenditures by \$31,463.



Safe Environment Program (SEP) Requirements: Every year the parish submits a report about the status of all employees and active volunteers. To stay in good standing; conduct policies are signed, background checks every three years, and ongoing training / education about keeping vulnerable adults and children safe. If anyone is not current, they are made inactive until they can catch up.

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity

The church calendar is studded with various solemnities intended to draw our attention to essential aspects of Catholic belief. This Sunday, we are being invited to rejoice in and acknowledge the revelation of God as a trinity of persons. Using the calendar as a pedagogical tool is a brilliant means of reminding the faithful of what we believe, annually drawing our attention to various key events in salvation history and the lives of various saints. Each year, the doctrine of the Trinity is proclaimed, which helps deepen our understanding in one of the key mysteries of our faith.

Lest we forget, the idea of a Trinitarian God is a distinctly Christian concept and would have been heretical to first century Jews. One of the core foundations of Jewish faith is recited in the Shema, a daily prayer recited by Jews, "Hear O Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord is one." If the Lord is one, how can there be God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit? Retaining the firm belief in one God was critical, but how to incorporate these three separate identities revealed by Jesus posed great difficulties! Yet, the Christian experiences of God mediated by Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit could not be denied. The great controversies of the early church simmered around how best to describe the Trinitarian nature of God. The Nicene Creed we currently recite is the description we maintain.

While we have verbiage around what we mean when we talk about God as three persons but one nature, most of us scratch our heads and say, "Well, if you say so." None of our explanations fully describe the mystery that is God. "The infinite nature of God is never going to be exhaustively contained in the finite categories of human thought." Still, we are not without a good deal of information we can claim as well attested over the centuries since Jesus walked this earth. The coming of the Holy Spirit is undeniably an expression of God which turned the world upside down. The life, death, and resurrection of Jesus left his followers stating, "Jesus is Lord", a.k.a. God. God the Father, creator of heaven and earth, was a primary focus of worship by Jesus himself. Just because we cannot fully explain it does not diminish the reality or importance of our understanding of the Trinity. Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" (CCC 261). The Father, Son and Holy Spirit form a mystical, unique relationship! The three work together in love. God the Father loves his beloved

Son Jesus, Jesus loves His Father so much that He fulfilled his will by offering his life as a sacrifice, and the Holy Spirit is the love between them.

Families are called to mirror this Trinitarian relationship. The Catechism says, "The Christian family constitutes a specific revelation and realization of ecclesial communion, and for this reason it can and should be called a domestic church. It is a community of faith, hope, and charity...The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" (CCC 2204-2205).

Let us ask the Holy Trinity-- the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, to teach us how to love! Also, let us ask for comfort and courage during the times we fall short. Holy Spirit, you promised to be with us until the end of time. We believe in your promise and pray that your assistance be with us daily. Come Holy Spirit, renew our hearts. Amen!


The **Solemnity of the Holy Trinity** is celebrated on the Sunday following **Pentecost Sunday**.

The **Holy Trinity** is the mystery of one God in three divine persons. It is also the central mystery of our Catholic faith and life.

As Catholics, we believe in one God, but we believe that He exists in "three persons." They are: *God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.*




What is the difference between a Feast Day and Solemnity?

Solemnities are like Sundays, they are all obligatory. Feasts are the next rank down and identified in my homework as such.

They consist of the celebration of certain Saints such as the Feast of the Archangels or most of the Feasts of the Apostles. The Gloria is sung on these days. The Creed is not recited.

LIFE JUSTICE PEACE

May 30th, Memorial Day in the U.S., is also the anniversary of the death of St. Joan of Arc, who was burnt at the stake on May 30th, 1431. Our book club, moderated by Aaron Walsh, and, which meets every fourth Tuesday, has us reading St. Joan of Arc by Mark Twain.

The official history of Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War with a desire to honor those who had died in their service. On May 5th, 1868 General John Logan, proclaimed in his General Order 11, "May 30th, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land." The General called it Decoration Day.

On the first Decoration Day, 5,000 participants decorated the graves of 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried at Arlington Cemetery. Differently, the South refused to acknowledge the day and honored their dead on separate days. This went on until after WW I when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in all of America's wars, and then established as a national holiday.

In 1915, inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields," Moina Michael replied with her own poem:

We cherish too, the Poppy red, That grows on fields where valor led.

It seems to signal to the skies, That blood of heroes never dies.

She was the first to wear and sell red poppies as a symbol of Remembrance. The money from her sales went to benefit servicemen.

Later, a Madam Guerin from France was visiting the United States and observed the custom started by Ms. Michael. She returned to France, started the Franco-American Children's League, made and sold artificial red poppies to raise money for war orphaned and widowed women. The League disbanded a year later, and Madam Guerin approached the VFW for help.

In 1922 the VFW became the first veterans' organization to nationally sell poppies. Two years later their "Buddy" Poppy program was selling artificial poppies made by disabled veterans. In 1948 the US Post Office honored Ms. Michael for her role in founding the National Poppy movement by issuing a red 3 cent postage stamp.

In 1971, Congress passed the Uniform Holiday Act and established that Memorial Day to be commemorated on the last Monday of May. Each year at Arlington National Cemetery, a small American flag is placed on each grave. Traditionally, the President or Vice President lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

In Dec. 2000, Congress passed a resolution titled "National Moment of Remembrance." It asks that at 3 p.m. local time, Americans "voluntarily and informally observe in our own way, a Moment of remembrance and respect, pausing whatever we are doing for a moment of silence.



Whether providing a replacement for a worn-out recliner or furnishing an entire apartment, our aim is to quickly deliver items to fill each client's particular need.

ELBCH accepts new or lightly used furniture, small appliances, kitchen/dining wares, and other household items. Think "What would I need?" if I was moving into an empty studio or 1-bedroom apartment.
