Lucy & Elizabeth Rosas Arenas demonstrated Fidelity & Love for Our Lord in the Eucharist.



CATHOLIC LIBERAL EDUCATION IN ACTION

In middle school science, Dr. Clemen has been instructing students to work with others, perform experiments safely, and write neat and clear reports.

- **Eighth graders** have been using pendulums to study the conservation of energy and transfer of energy between potential energy and kinetic energy.
- Seventh graders finished up a lesson on changing ecosystems and learned a new word – eutrophication. (Ask a 7th grader what that word means.)
- Finally, **Sixth graders** modeled the inner planets and made solar systems that filled the room-scaling these models using math skills.

All these skills will be invaluable in their future classrooms and possible careers.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank **Burdette and Bruce Lott** for their work on Mary's Place since the inception.

They organized the kitchen so we could feed 75 – 150 people each Monday evening. Burdette made the menus each week and they shopped to get the best deals on commodities as well as coordinating with Salvation Army, Benedict House and Kitsap Rescue Mission to share those commodities. Burdette has kept records since we began in 2014 and through 2019 we had served 49,971 plates to both our guests and our volunteers at about \$1.49 per plate. We pivoted when Covid-19 hit and prepared meals for pick-up to keep our guests fed and safe. When it was feasible, we began serving in-house again.

Their stewardship of Mary's Place and their dedication to our mission and our volunteers has been steadfast and for this we are very grateful. Burdette has mentioned several times how her father, the late Deacon Jim Bemis, was her impetus to take on this huge task to feed the homeless, in body, mind and spirit and we're sure he is well pleased.
