

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross - SEPTEMBER 14 -

Early in the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She found a building that was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses, but which one belonged to the Lord? In order to find the true cross, they presented the three crosses to a dying woman and upon touching one of them, she was instantly healed. Helena had no doubt at all: she had found Jesus' cross.

Later, the cross disappeared into the hands of the Persians but was recovered in 630, by Heraclius, the Emperor of the Byzantine Empire. He triumphantly returned a part of the Cross to Jerusalem — the other part was left in Constantinople — where he himself placed it at Calvary. This event is commemorated by the Church on September 14, proclaimed as the feast of "The Triumph of the Cross" or "The Exaltation of the Holy Cross".

The universal symbol of the Christian faith, the cross represents Christ's victory over death. The feast celebrates the redemptive transformation of a barbaric instrument of torture into a divine "tree of life" that brings hope to humankind.



Lives of the Saints SAINTS CORNELIUS & CYPRIAN

Feast Day: September 16

In the third century, the emperor Decius decided that all who would not give up their Christian faith should be killed. The pope, Fabian, was martyred along with many others. Emperor Decius thought that without a pope, the Church would die, so he prevented the election of another bishop of Rome. A council of priests secretly carried on the work. After a year, while the emperor was away at war, Cornelius was elected pope in 251 with almost-certain knowledge that he would die a martyr's death. In 252, the plague entered Rome, and the Romans blamed the disease and resulting pestilence on the Christians. As punishment, Cornelius was exiled to Civitavecchia.

Letters of support and appreciation came to him from Cyprian, the Bishop of Carthage. "Whichever of us shall be first taken hence, let our charity persevere in never-ceasing prayer to the Father for our brothers and sisters."

Cyprian was born in Carthage about 210, the son of pagan parents. He lived a virtuous life after being converted to Christianity as an adult. He was made a priest and then a bishop of Carthage for nearly 10 years. Cyprian had only one year of peace. After that, the persecutions under Decius began.

Cornelius was martyred in 253, Cyprian in 258. Their names are still invoked in the Roman Canon, the First Eucharistic Prayer.

Cornelius and Cyprian encouraged each other to lead virtuous, self-sacrificing, and loving lives for God. There is no greater gift that one friend can offer to another. Today let us think of ways to help our friends grow closer to God.
