Devout and Faithful Servant of God

In the Gospel reading for today, Jesus is speaking to the disciples, and to each of us, telling us that we should do what is commanded by God without complaining and without expecting to be praised. This might be difficult for many to take in as we all want to be seen and given due credit for whatever small deed we do. . On the other side of the spectrum when things aren't to our standard we complain. We let the world know that we are not satisfied, that we are upset and angry, that we demand things to be as we want them to be. Neither of these characteristics are pleasing to God. We are servants to the Lord. What is pleasing to God is for us to follow His commands and be in accordance with His will. By doing this we show our love for God.

How can we be good servants? By serving as Jesus Christ served. We should take care of the poor, the sick, the hungry, those who mourn. We should be meek and humble. We should follow righteousness. We should be merciful and pure of heart. We should be peacemakers and stand firm in front of persecution. I learned that this is the true definition of what it means to be a servant; a devout and faithful follower of Christ. . . As servants of the Lord our work never ends...but, it does not end because we never stop being faithful followers of Christ! Our mission is to always preach and worship His good name. We will continue to plow and plant seeds of faith. We will continue to tend the sheep and build up the Church. Unlike the man in the parable who is not grateful to his obedient servant, God sees the work we do for Him and He loves us. When we enter the gates of heaven our Lord will joyously tell us "come here immediately and take your place at table".





A PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY LAND

With Deacon Bill Hamlin

Our Lady Star of the Sea, Bremerton, WA September 5-16, 2023

Day 1: Depart USA from Seattle Airport

Day 2: Arrive to the Holy Land and meet our tour guide who will be our escort throughout the pilgrimage. Depending on the arrival time, drive to visit Caesarea Maritima, then Drive to Tiberius. Dinner and overnight. (Pilgerhaus requested)

Day 3: In the morning we will have boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. Visit Capernaum and the House of Peter. Visit Magdala; the "Jesus' boat" at Nof Ginosaur; the Church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes at Tabgha. Then we continue to visit St. Peter's Church on the Sea. Dinner and overnight. (Pilgerhaus requested).

Day 4: Drive to Cana of Galilee, the place commemorating the first miracle of Jesus. Drive to Mt. Carmel; visit Baha'i Garden in Haifa; continue to Nazareth to visit the Basilica of the Annunciation, Mary's Well, St. Joseph Church and the old Synagogue., if Arrival time did not allow us to visit Caesarea Maritima on day 02, we will visit in this day, Dinner and overnight. (Pilgerhaus requested)

Day 5: Drive to Mt. Tabor to visit the Church of the Transfiguration; visit the baptismal site on the Jordan River; and drive along the Jordan Valley to Jericho (time to relax and swim at the Hotel in the afternoon. Dinner and overnight in Jericho.

Day 6:; Visit Bethany and the Tomb of Lazarus; drive to the Mount of Temptation; Tel Sultan; the sycamore tree of Zacchaeus; caves at Qumran then drive to swim/float in the Dead Sea.; Drive on to Jericho Dinner and overnight in Jericho

Day 7: Tour Bethlehem; Nativity Church; Milk Grotto; the Shepherd's Fields; and the old city of Bethlehem. Enjoy an evening of cultural dinner with folk dancing. Overnight in Bethlehem









Day 8: Tour the Old City of Jerusalem. Begin with St. Anne Church and the Pool of Bethesda; Chapel of Flagellation; walk the Via Dolorosa to visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher; and visit the Wailing Wall. In the evening join the local families over dinner, overnight in Bethlehem.

Day 9: Drive to the Mount of Olives to enjoy a panoramic view of Jerusalem. Visit the Chapel of Ascension and the Pater Noster Church; walk to Dominus Flevit; the Garden and the Church of Gethsemane; Walk again the Via Dolorosa and discover the stages following the Palm Sunday walk, and tour the old city Bazar, Dinner and overnight in Bethlehem.

Day 10: Drive to Jerusalem visit Mt. Zion; Dormition Abby; David's Tomb; the Cenacle or Upper Room; and the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu and Exploring the Four Quarters of Jerusalem, Free afternoon in Jerusalem, then have the farewell dinner overnight in Bethlehem.





Lives of the Saints

SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

Feast Day: October 4

The patron saint of Italy, Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally—not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.

Serious illness brought the young Francis to see the emptiness of his frolicking life as leader of Assisi's youth. Prayer—lengthy and difficult—led him to a self-emptying like that of Christ, climaxed by embracing a leper he met on the road. It symbolized his complete obedience to what he had heard in prayer: "Francis! Everything you have loved and desired in the flesh it is your duty to despise and hate, if you wish to know my will. And when you have begun this, all that now seems sweet and lovely

to you will become intolerable and bitter, but all that you used to avoid will turn itself to great sweetness and exceeding joy."

From the cross in the neglected field-chapel of San Damiano, Christ told him, "Francis, go out and build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." Francis became the totally poor and humble workman. He really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (Luke 9:1-3).

Francis' first rule for his followers was a collection of texts from the Gospels. He had no intention of founding an order, but once it began he protected it and accepted all the legal structures needed to support it. His devotion and loyalty to the Church were absolute and highly exemplary at a time when various movements of reform tended to break the Church's unity.

Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favor of the latter, but always returned to solitude when he could.

During the last years of his relatively short life, he died at 44, Francis was half blind and seriously ill. Two years before his death he received the stigmata, the real and painful wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side.

On his deathbed, Francis said over and over again the last addition to his *Canticle of the Sun*, "Be praised, O Lord, for our Sister Death."


