LOVE: THE KEYNOTE OF LIFE

Inner agreement with God belongs to the happy life. Only if this fundamental relationship is right can all the other relationships be right. For that reason it is important throughout one's life and from one's youth onwards to learn and to practice thinking with God, feeling with God, willing with God, so that love may grow from this and become the keynote of our life. If that is the case, love of neighbor becomes self-evident. For if the keynote of my life is love, then as far as concerns those whom God has placed on my way I can once again only live on the basis of the assent, this trust, this agreement, and this love.

To describe love of neighbor Scripture uses a very wise and profound phrase: *Love your neighbor as yourself*. It does not demand any fantastic and unreal heroism...No, it is *as yourself*...People who are dissatisfied with themselves will not be really good to others. Those who do not accept themselves take exception to others. True love is fair: where it is leading us is to love oneself as one of the members of Christ's body. Oneself like the others—becoming free of that false perspective with which we are all born, as if the wold revolves around me and my ego. Through faith we must all learn a kind of Copernican evolution. Copernicus discovered that this earth along with the other planets revolved around the sun. We all begin by seeing ourselves as a tiny earth around which all the suns must turn. Faith teaches us to leave this error and to behave like brothers and sisters, joining together with all the others in the round dance of love around the one center that is God. Only if God exists, only if he becomes the center of my life, is this *love my neighbor as myself* possible. But if he exists, if he becomes my center, then it is also possible to reach this inward freedom of love.





Lives of the Saints st. john of avila

Feast Day: May 10

Born in the Castile region of Spain, John was sent at the age of 14 to the University of Salamanca to study law. He later moved to Alcala, where he studied philosophy and theology before his ordination as a diocesan priest.

After John's parents died and left him as their sole heir to a considerable fortune, he distributed his money to the poor. In 1527, he traveled to Seville, hoping to become a missionary in Mexico. The archbishop of that city persuaded him to stay and spread the faith in Andalusia. During nine years of work there, he developed a reputation as

an engaging preacher, a perceptive spiritual director, and a wise confessor.

Because John was not afraid to denounce vice in high places, he was investigated by the Inquisition but was cleared in 1533. He later worked in Cordoba and then in Granada, where he organized the University of Baeza, the first of several colleges run by diocesan priests who dedicated themselves to teaching and giving spiritual direction to young people.

He was friends with Saints Francis Borgia, Ignatius of Loyola, John of God, John of the Cross, Peter of Alcantara, and Teresa of Avila. John of Avila worked closely with members of the Society of Jesus and helped their growth within Spain and its colonies. John's mystical writings have been translated into several languages.

He was beatified in 1894, canonized in 1970, and declared a doctor of the Church on October 7, 2012. St. John of Avila's liturgical feast is celebrated on May 10.
