





LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him," This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?

From Fr. Jose's desk

"This is my beloved Son Listen to him"

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus, we continue our Lenten retreat. God the Father invites us to listen to the Word of his Son, his beloved, as did Peter, James and John. Jesus took these three disciples with him to Mount Tabor to witness the experience of the Transfiguration. Let us keep in mind that Jesus has chosen his twelve apostles and teaches them privately about the Kingdom of God. This time he takes these three disciples with him to the mountain in order to show them the Glory of God. Jesus *"was transfigured before them."* They saw that *"his clothes became dazzling white,"* that is, they were filled with brilliant Light. This Light did not shine on him from the outside, but came from within himself, as he emanated this light. God reveals his divine nature to these three disciples. It is a powerful experience, *"Rabbi, it is good that we are here."* This event reveals two realities: a foretaste of the Resurrection and the experience of life after death. We believe in the Resurrection and in eternal life. We believe that Jesus came into the world to teach us that we are made for what is divine. Preface I of Mass for the Dead says that in Jesus *"the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying, might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended"* God transforms our human nature into divine light.

Jesus teaches us that we have been created with the ability to be transformed into divine light. It is a process that begins here on earth, specifically at the moment of our baptism. God gives us the grace of his Spirit, the divine light. This light grows in us as long as we remain in God's grace. It diminishes when we let the shadows of sin take the place of God: resentments, envies, addictions of all kinds, etc. Lent is the time to make an effort to realize that if Jesus is not in our bodies or heart, it is because our hearts are full of shadows and there is no place for Him within us. If we want Jesus to always be in our heart, we must cleanse it from every shadow of sin. How do we cleanse our heart? We do so through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus, through the priest, absolves us of our sins and returns us to the divine light, that is to say to a state of grace.

"This is my beloved Son. Listen to him". If we listen to Jesus and let him live in our body and whole being, we will always have the blessing of God the Father who speaks to us through his beloved Son. Today more than ever we need Jesus, his divine wisdom, so we can see the shadows that separate us from God and from others. Our world is full of shadows that make us live the uncertainty of not knowing where we are heading, but with Jesus we do know where we are heading. *"He is the Way, the Truth and the Life"* Jn 14:6. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to grant us his divine wisdom to discern our shadows and choose the splendor of the light that transforms our whole being, so we too can say that it is good that I am here. Amen.

"Este es mi Hijo amado escúchenlo"

Estimadas hermanas y hermanos en Cristo Jesús, continuamos con nuestro retiro cuaresmal. Dios Padre nos invita a escuchar la Palabra de su Hijo amado como lo hicieron Pedro, Santiago y Juan. Jesús llevó consigo a estos tres discípulos al monte Tabor para que presenciaran la experiencia de la transfiguración. Recordemos que Jesús ha elegido a sus doce apóstoles y les enseña en privado sobre el Reino de Dios. Esta vez lleva consigo a estos tres discípulos al monte con la finalidad de mostrarles la Gloria de Dios. Jesús *"se transfiguró en su presencia"*. Vieron que *"sus vestiduras se pusieron esplendorosamente blancas"*, es decir, se llenaron de Luz brillante. Esta Luz no le llegó de fuera, sino que salió de sí mismo. Dios revela su naturaleza divina a estos tres discípulos. Es una experiencia fuerte, *"Maestro, ¡qué a gusto estamos aquí!"*. Este evento revela dos realidades: un anticipo de la Resurrección y la experiencia de la vida después de la muerte. Creemos en la Resurrección y en la vida eterna. Creemos que Jesús vino al mundo para enseñarnos que estamos hechos para lo divino. El prefacio I de difuntos dice que en Jesús *"resplandece la esperanza de nuestra feliz resurrección; y, aunque la certeza de morir nos entristece, nos consuela la promesa de la futura inmortalidad. Pues, para quienes creemos en ti, Padre, la vida no se acaba, se transforma"*. Dios transforma nuestra naturaleza humana en luz divina.

Jesús nos enseña que hemos sido creados con la capacidad de ser transformados en luz divina. Es un proceso que inicia aquí en la tierra y en el momento de nuestro bautismo. Dios nos da la gracia de su Espíritu, luz divina. Esta luz crece en nosotros a medida que nos mantenemos en gracia de Dios. Disminuye cuando dejamos que las sombras del pecado tomen el lugar de Dios: resentimientos, envidias, adicciones de todo tipo, etc. La cuaresma es el tiempo para entrar en consciencia y descubrir que, si Jesús no está en nuestro cuerpo, en nuestro corazón, es porque tenemos el corazón lleno de sombras y no hay lugar para Él en nuestro interior. Si queremos que Jesús esté siempre en nuestro corazón, debemos limpiarlo de toda sombra de pecado. ¿Cómo limpiar nuestro corazón? Lo hacemos a través del Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Jesús a través del sacerdote nos absuelve de nuestros pecados y nos vuelve a la luz divina, es decir, al estado de gracia.

"Este es mi Hijo amado; escúchenlo". Si escuchamos a Jesús y dejamos que viva en nuestro cuerpo y en todo nuestro ser, tendremos siempre la bendición de Dios Padre que nos habla a través de su Hijo amado. Hoy más que nunca necesitamos de Jesús, de su sabiduría divina para discernir las sombras que nos apartan de Dios y de los demás. Nuestro mundo está lleno de sombras que nos hacen vivir la incertidumbre de no saber a dónde vamos, pero con Jesús sí sabemos adónde vamos. *"Él es el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida"* (Jn 14, 6). Pidamos al Espíritu Santo que nos conceda su sabiduría divina para discernir nuestras sombras y optar por el esplendor de la luz que transforma todo nuestro ser y decir como Pedro, *"que a gusto me siento aquí"*. Amén.



In-person retreats have been postponed until 2021.



Vocation Awareness

The Four Voices of Discernment. Part I

We must learn to distinguish the voice of God from the many voices and noises in the world. There are four primary voices and discernments: God's voice, the world's voice, our own voice, and Satan's voice. These later three correspond to the traditional description of the enemies of God: the world, the flesh, and the devil. Because God usually prefers to speak in his still, small voice, we will have to find a time and place for silence if we want to hear it. It is not that God cannot speak loudly and clearly, above any obstacle. He certainly spoke loudly to the Israelites in the Book of Exodus! But he usually prefers to speak quietly and gently, especially with regards to one's vocation. Why? A vocation is an invitation, not a commandment. It is a request. A loud, terrifying voice would be a mandate, not an invitation, causing a person to respond out of fear, not out of love. God does not want this. He wants you to want to hear his voice and to know his will. He does not want to force you, and he will not force you.

Noise is a great obstacle to hearing Jesus, who is meek and humble of heart. Finding time every day for silent prayer, silent listening, is critical. Jesus' desire to tell us our vocation is much greater than our desire to know it, but we must be willing and able to hear it. We must show the Lord through our fidelity to prayer that we desire to know his perfect will regarding our vocations.






