

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

God's messengers always seem to get mocked. They speak a truth that some folks do not want to hear. While on the one hand we admire them, we also are quite happy keeping them at a distance. After all, they are not referring to me but someone else, aren't they? We often wrongly conclude that because we may be more avant-garde, contemporary, politically sensitive, and untraditional, we are somehow more in the light than others. People tend to prefer darkness more than light, even the most spiritually sensitive among us. The light always carries with it the richness of God's mercy and compassion which see beyond ideologies and concepts to relationships that cultivate life, earthly and eternal. Every hand of compassion and mercy extended to a human being must always point back to God. The call always involves ordering our lives in accord with our truth and essence of being. As God never forgets us, we must never forget God. Now is the time to take stock of our infidelity and return to the light, even though it is difficult to look at.

From Fr. Jose's desk

"God desires the salvation of all "

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, the readings for this Sunday fill us with hope. God desires the salvation of all mankind. He wants your salvation and that of your family, and the condition is to believe in the Son of God. *"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life."* What does God save us from? He saves us from sin and everything that deviates us from living our Christian lives. We all long for a life full of joy, happiness, and well-being. These desires in our lives are on a human level; however, God the Father enriches us with his grace and that makes us grow in our relationship of love with him. He blesses us through his Son who shares us his joy, love, goodness, mercy, and peace with us during this time of lent.

In the second reading, Saint Paul tells us that God is rich in love, mercy, goodness, and grace. He is very generous with his grace. Out of sheer generosity, he saves us in Christ Jesus, thanks to the faith we profess in him. This is the beauty of our faith, knowing that God loves us and is merciful to us as He in Old Testament times when the Israelites deviated from God's path.

The first reading describes the story of the people of Israel, who together with the priests, *"added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations,"* polluting even the Lord's temple. God exhorted them to give up those sins through his messengers, but they did not listen to them. On the contrary, they made fun of them. The king of the Chaldeans came and destroyed everything, including the temple of the Lord. The people were sent to Babylon where the king enslaved them for seventy years until the king of Persia freed them and sent them back to their homeland. Cyrus, king of Persia, found favor with God. He said, *"All the kingdoms of the earth the Lord, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem. Whoever among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"*

Lent is a time for reflection and conversion. God shows us his love and his mercy. He desires the salvation of all his sons and daughters. We must pay attention to our spiritual life and allow ourselves to be challenged by the Word of God, which speaks to us every Sunday and every time we read the Bible at home. The stories we read in the Bible give us insight to review our life. If we encounter situations of sin, we need to reconcile ourselves with God and with others. In this way, we let God's mercy work in our lives. He does not condemn us; on the contrary, he wants our salvation and well-being. When we return to God, we can sing: Lord, you are my joy, and you are my everything. May the Holy Spirit continue to accompany us on our Lenten retreat. Amen.

"Dios desea la Salvación de todos"

Estimadas hermanas y hermanos en Cristo, las lecturas de este domingo nos llenan de esperanza. Dios desea la salvación de toda la humanidad. Desea tu salvación y la de tu familia. La condición es creer en el Hijo de Dios. *"Tanto amó Dios al mundo, que entregó a su Hijo único, para que todo el que cree en él no perezca, sino que tenga vida eterna"*. ¿De que nos salva Dios? Nos salva del pecado y de todo aquello que nos desvía de vivir nuestra vida cristiana. Todos anhelamos una vida llena de alegría, de felicidad y bienestar. Esto es a nivel humano; sin embargo, Dios Padre nos enriquece con su gracia que nos hace crecer en nuestra relación de amor con Él. Nos bendice a través de su Hijo quien comparte con nosotros su alegría, su amor, su bondad, su misericordia y su paz durante este tiempo de cuaresma.

San Pablo en la segunda lectura nos dice que Dios es rico en amor, misericordia, bondad y gracia. Es muy generoso con su gracia. Por pura generosidad nos salva en Cristo Jesús gracias a la fe que profesamos en él. Esta es la belleza de nuestra fe, saber que Dios nos ama y tiene misericordia de nosotros como la tuvo en tiempos del antiguo testamento cuando los israelitas de desviaron del camino de Dios.

La primera lectura nos describe la historia del pueblo de Israel, que junto con los sacerdotes *"multiplicaron sus infidelidades, practicando todas las abominables costumbres de los paganos"*, manchando la casa del Señor. Dios les exhortaba a dejar esos pecados por medio de sus mensajeros, pero ellos no los escuchaban. Al contrario, se burlaban de ellos. Llegó el rey de los caldeos y destruyó todo, inclusive el templo del Señor. El pueblo fue enviado a Babilonia donde el rey los esclavizó por setenta años hasta que el rey de Persia los liberó y los envió de regreso a su patria. Ciro, rey de Persia encontró el favor de Dios. Decía, *"El Señor, Dios de los cielos, me ha dado todos los reinos de la tierra y me ha mandado que le edifique una casa en Jerusalén, y todo aquel que pertenezca a este pueblo, regrese y que Dios lo acompañe"*.

La cuaresma es tiempo de reflexión y de conversión. Dios nos muestra su amor y su misericordia. Desea la salvación de todos sus hijos e hijas. Es retomar, pues, nuestra vida espiritual y dejarnos interpelar por la Palabra de Dios, que nos habla todos los domingos y cada vez que leemos la Biblia en casa. Las historias que leemos en la Biblia nos dan luces para revisar nuestra vida. Si encontramos situaciones de pecado, es reconciliarnos con Dios y con los demás. De esa manera, dejamos actuar la misericordia de Dios en nuestra vida. Él no nos condena; al contrario, desea nuestra salvación, desea nuestro bien. Cuando regresamos a Dios, podemos cantar: Señor, tú eres mi alegría y eres mi todo. Que el Espíritu Santo nos siga acompañado en nuestro retiro cuaresmal. Amén.

Vocation Awareness

The Four Voices of Discernment. Part III

The voice of God can come to us at different times of the day, and not only during prayer. We can recognize his voice easily when he tells us that he loves us. He wants us to love him, love others to serve others, and to repent of our sins. These are the things we would expect God to say! The challenge is when he tells us unexpected things. It is hard to be sure of the answer when we ask questions like:

Should I ask that girl out on a date?

What should I do to help my parents with their marriage trouble?

Which college should I attend?

Who should I ask to be my spiritual director?

When should I contact my diocesan vocation director?

What is my vocation?

But keep asking these kinds of questions and keep actively listening for answers. Sometimes God does not immediately answer our questions for serious reasons: because we are not yet ready to hear the answer; because we are not yet able to act on his answer; or because it is just not yet the time for us to know this information. This can be frustrating. But be patient!
