





From Fr. Jose's desk

"The Mercy of the Lord endures Forever Alleluia".

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus, today we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy; it is also the second Sunday of Easter. The readings for this Sunday tell us about the fruits of the Lord's Resurrection: faith, hope, love, peace, joy, and mercy. On the very day of the Resurrection, the Lord appeared to his disciples; he greets them with a sign of peace and shows them his hands side. When they saw him, they were filled with great joy and their hope was invigorated. The Master had told them that "The Son of Man was going to be delivered into the hands of men, they would kill him, and on the third day he would rise again." (Mt. 17, 22-23). However, they do not quite understand this truth about the Resurrection. He appears to them in order to strengthen their faith in the Risen One. After this experience, their mission will be to announce to the whole world that Jesus is alive and risen.

In our human experience, reunions are a reason for joy and hope. Perhaps you have already had the experience of reuniting with your loved ones and friends after a long time of pandemic and have felt the joy of seeing them again in person. Thus, the disciples were filled with great joy when they saw their Master again. They thought they had lost Him because they did not yet understand the mystery of the Resurrection. For us, this should be a cause of great joy to know that death does not have the last word. We believe in the God of life, who saves us and gives us new life (physical and spiritual) in Christ our Lord. He has shown us his love, forgiveness, joy, closeness and his mercy.

Today we celebrate the feast of Divine Mercy that Pope Saint John Paul II instituted on April 30, 2000 in order to convey the following message to the heart of each person: God is Merciful and loves us all ... "and the greater the sinner, the greater his right to My mercy" (Diary, 723). God's Mercy is cause for celebration. We celebrate it with great joy and confidence, making this grace that God gives us our own, which fills us with inner peace and much hope. It is the same grace that the disciples received on the day of the Resurrection. "Peace be with you;" It is not the peace that the world gives. but the peace of God that he gives us as the fruit of his divine mercy.

God has had mercy on humanity by saving us through the Death and Resurrection of Christ our Lord. It is the Love and Mercy of God that saves and gives new life. It is the mission that Jesus entrusts to the disciples to announce to the world that God forgives all our faults and gives us new life. He said to them, Receive the Holy Spirit. Those who forgive their sins will be forgiven; and to those who do not forgive them, they will remain unforgiven". It is in the confessional where we experience the Love and Mercy of God who saves us, reconciles us, heals us and grants us peace. Risen Jesus, I trust in you because your mercy is eternal. Amen.

"La misericordia del Señor es eterna Aleluia".

Estimadas hermanas y hermanos en Cristo Jesús, hoy celebramos la Fiesta de la Divina Misericordia; es también el segundo domingo de Pascua. Las lecturas de este domingo nos hablan de los frutos de la Resurrección del Señor: fe, esperanza, amor, paz, alegría y misericordia. El mismo día de la Resurrección, el Señor se apareció a sus discípulos; los saluda con el signo de la paz, les muestra sus manos y su costado. Ellos, al verlo se llenaron de mucha alegría y su esperanza recobró nueva vida. El Maestro les había dicho que "El Hijo del Hombre iba a ser entregado en manos de los hombres, le matarían, y al tercer día resucitaría". (Mt. 17, 22-23). Sin embargo, ellos no acaban de entender esta verdad sobre la Resurrección. Él se les aparece para fortalecerles su fe en el Resucitado. Después de esta experiencia, su misión va a ser anunciar a todo el mundo que Jesús está vivo, que ha resucitado.

En nuestra experiencia humana, los reencuentros son motivo de alegría y de esperanza. Posiblemente ya has tenido la experiencia de reencontrarte con tus seres queridos y amistades después de un largo tiempo de pandemia y sentir la alegría de volverlos a ver en persona. Eso te llenó de emoción y de mucha alegría. Así los discípulos se llenaron de mucha alegría al ver nuevamente a su Maestro. Pensaban que lo habían perdido porque no entendían todavía el misterio de la Resurrección. Para nosotros, esto deber ser causa de mucha alegría saber que la muerte no tiene la última palabra. Creemos en el Dios de la vida, que nos salva y nos da nueva vida (física y espiritual) en Cristo nuestro Señor. Nos ha mostrado su amor, su perdón, su alegría, su cercanía y su misericordia.

Hoy celebramos la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia que el Papa San Juan Pablo II instituyó el 30 de abril del 2000 con el fin de hacer llegar al corazón de cada persona el siguiente mensaje: *Dios es Misericordioso y nos ama a todos ... "y cuanto más grande es el pecador, tanto más grande es el derecho que tiene a Mi misericordia"* (Diario, 723). La Misericordia de Dios es una fiesta. La celebramos con mucha alegría y confianza haciendo nuestra esta gracia que Dios nos regala, que nos llena de paz interior y de mucha esperanza. Es la gracia que recibieron los discípulos el día de la Resurrección. "La paz esté con ustedes". No es la paz que el mundo da. Es la paz de Dios que nos regala como fruto de su divina misericordia.

Dios ha tenido misericordia de la humanidad salvándola por medio de la Muerte y Resurrección de Cristo nuestro Señor. Es el Amor y la Misericordia de Dios lo que salva, lo que da nueva vida. Es la misión que Jesús confía a los discípulos de anunciar al mundo que Dios perdona todas nuestras culpas y nos da nueva vida. "les dijo: "Reciban el Espíritu Santo. A los que les perdonen los pecados, les quedarán perdonados; y a los que no se los perdonen, les quedarán sin perdonar". Es en el confesionario donde experimentamos el Amor y la Misericordia de Dios que nos salva, que nos reconcilia, que nos sana y nos concede la paz. Jesús Resucitado, en ti confío porque tu misericordia es eterna. Amén.

The Blessed Sacrament Chapel is open from 10am to 5pm, on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Limited Capacity.






Prayer Shawl Ministry

The story of Thomas' doubt in the resurrected Jesus is one of the most well-known resurrection narratives. Why do you think Christians throughout the ages are drawn to this story?


because he has special qualifications that make him a good fit for the community). In the case of new or recently ordained priests, the vibrancy and diversity, the presence of a school, or certain social programs offer invaluable training and ongoing formation.

In making their decisions regarding the placement of priests, most bishops rely on a priest personnel committee or a council of priests. There is also a period of dialogue with the priest(s) who will be moved, sometimes even including an extended period of discernment and self-assessment, helping to be as sure as possible that the assignment of a priest to a particular community will truly benefit the people and be a healthy one for the priest himself.

WHY ARE PRIESTS TRANSFERRED FROM ONE PARISH TO ANOTHER? HOW IS THAT DECIDED?

Bishops take the appointment of pastors to parishes very seriously and the decision to assign or transfer priests is one of the most important decisions bishops can make, effecting the lives of everyone in the parish community.

In 1984, the bishops of the United States implemented a six-year term limit for pastors (which can be renewed by bishop); term limits for associate pastors vary from diocese to diocese. Sometimes a particular priest is assigned to a parish or chaplaincy to respond to specific issues (such as a parish merger, a fundraising campaign, or





A WAITING HARVEST

Vocation Awareness

Rebuke It, Correct It, or Obey It.

When a person identifies which voice is speaking, he should do one of three things: rebuke it, correct it, or obey it. If it is the voice of God, obey it. If it is the voice of Satan or the world, rebuke it. But if it is your own voice, you need to decide if it is speaking the truth. Sometimes it will be true, and at other times it will be deceiving. If your own voice is saying to you, "I will never be happy as a priest. I will always be miserable because I am not married and because I cannot do what I want," then you need to correct this voice. The truth is that you will be most happy doing nothing less than the will of God for your life, whatever it might be.

If you are serious about hearing the voice of God, especially regarding your vocation, you need to minimize other voices and maximize the voice of God, who speaks in a small, still voice. The Blessed Virgin Mary was not listening to her iPod when the Archangel Gabriel came to her with a message from God! As a woman of silence, she clearly heard the voice of God.

Once, when presenting this idea at a retreat, a young man responded, "Well, if an angel comes to me like Gabriel did to the Blessed Mother, then the voice would be clear. I would answer God's call then and accept his will." I reminded him of the words of Jesus in the parable of Lazarus and the rich man. When the rich man—who was in hell – was begging Abraham to send someone from the dead to warn his brothers, Abraham replied, "If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead" (Luke 16:31). Angels are coming to you all the time. Jesus has risen from the dead! The voice of God is coming to you all the time. Eventually you must give an answer. Mary did: "I am the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to thy will."


O Jesus,







SHARING THE GOSPEL


