

The New Presence of the Crucified after the Resurrection

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ: The Resurrection of the Lord brings to the disciples a new presence of the Lord. They are still trying to understand the words of Jesus that he should die and rise again on the third day. This is a new life experience for them. In our case, it is a new experience of recognizing Jesus in the sacraments, which are the fruit of the Lord's Resurrection. We recognize him in a special way in the Eucharist, the real and effective presence of him that gives us new life each time we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. The sacraments are born as signs of the presence of the Risen One. They are Easter signs that awaken the eyes and ears to see, believe and witness the new presence of the Risen Jesus.

The grace of the Resurrection is transformative. It transformed the lives of the disciples, giving them a new perspective on their new mission as followers of Christ. Mary Magdalene's life was transformed by realizing that Jesus was alive. She went to the tomb to embalm the body of Christ. When she arrived, she found the stone removed and the body gone, learning just an empty tomb. The life of the disciples on the road to Emmaus was also transformed by the breaking of bread, that is, in the first Eucharist that Jesus celebrated with them. Their understanding was enlightened, and they recognized His presence in a new way. The life of the eleven apostles who were gathered in the upper room was also transformed when Jesus appears in their midst and greets them with the sign of peace: "Peace be with you." At hearing his greeting, they were overjoyed.

We see that the Resurrection of the Crucified Christ implies a transformation of human life with its history. The Crucified Christ has entered the glory of God and participates in the life and communion of the Holy Trinity. However, the grace of the Resurrection does not mean the absence from the life of the disciples and their history. The Risen One has a new form of presence among those who belonged to Him and He transforms them into witnesses. He is still the same person, but different. The Risen One appears, makes himself seen and manifests himself not in spirit, but in Spirit and Body, that is, Glorified.

The disciples must learn to see and live this new form of presence. It is real, effective, but different. Jesus continues to speak, send, and train his followers; he continues to make the same gestures, the same invitation, making himself known to those he has chosen to continue his mission.

You and I are the new witnesses of the presence of the Risen One in this moment in time. We live in a time of uncertainty that clouds our understanding. However, we are blessed to celebrate the Real Presence of the Lord in the sacraments and especially in the Eucharist that strengthens our faith in the one who saves us, reconciles us, heals us and gives us new life. Blessed be God. Amen.

La nueva presencia del Crucificado en la Resurrección

Estimadas hermanas y hermanos en Cristo, la Resurrección del Señor es una nueva presencia para los discípulos. Están tratando de entender las palabras de Jesús que debía de morir y resucitar al tercer día. Es una nueva experiencia de vida para ellos. Es también para nosotros una nueva experiencia de reconocer a Jesús en los sacramentos, fruto de la Resurrección del Señor. Lo reconocemos de manera especial en la Eucaristía, su presencia real y efectiva que nos da nueva vida cada vez que recibimos el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Los sacramentos nacen como signos de la presencia del Resucitado. Son signos pascales que despiertan la mirada y los oídos para ver, creer y atestiguar la nueva presencia de Jesús Resucitado.

La gracia de la Resurrección es transformativa. Transformó la vida de los discípulos, dándoles una nueva perspectiva de su nueva misión de seguidores de Cristo. La vida de María Magdalena se transformó al saber que Jesús estaba vivo. Ella fue al sepulcro para embalsamar el cuerpo de Cristo. Al llegar, encontró la piedra removida; no encontró el cuerpo, sólo una tumba vacía. La vida de los discípulos de Emaús también fue transformada al partir el pan, es decir, en la primera Eucaristía que Jesús celebró con ellos. Se les abrió el entendimiento y reconocieron su presencia de una forma nueva. La vida de los once apóstoles que estaban reunidos en el cenáculo fue transformada también cuando Jesús se aparece en medio de ellos y los saluda con el signo de la paz: "La paz esté con ustedes". Al escuchar su saludo, se llenaron de alegría.

Vemos que la Resurrección del Crucificado implica una transformación de la vida humana con su historia. El Crucificado ha entrado en la gloria de Dios. Participa de la vida y comunión de la santa Trinidad. Sin embargo, la gracia de la Resurrección no significa ausencia de la vida de los discípulos y de su historia. El Resucitado tiene una nueva forma de presencia entre los suyos y los transforma en testigos. Sigue siendo la misma persona, pero distinta. El Resucitado se aparece, se hace ver y se manifiesta no en espíritu, sino en Espíritu y Cuerpo, es decir, Glorificado.

Los discípulos tienen que aprender a ver y a vivir esta nueva forma de presencia. Es real, efectiva, pero distinta. Jesús sigue hablando, enviando y formando a sus seguidores; sigue haciendo los mismos gestos, la misma invitación, dándose a conocer a los que Él ha escogido para continuar su misión.

Tu y yo somos los nuevos testigos de la presencia del Resucitado en nuestra realidad e historia. Vivimos un tiempo de incertidumbre que nubla nuestro entendimiento. Sin embargo, tenemos la bendición de celebrar la presencia real del Señor en los sacramentos y de manera especial en la Eucaristía que fortalece nuestra fe en aquel que nos salva, nos reconcilia, nos sana y nos da nueva vida. Bendito sea Dios. Amén.

The Blessed Sacrament Chapel is open from 10am to 5pm, on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Limited Capacity.








Meet our New Parish Administrator Assistant

DO CHILDREN NEED TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION BEFORE THEIR FIRST COMMUNION?

For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914).

While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality

of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.





A WAITING HARVEST

Vocation Awareness

Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

During the time young Samuel was minister to the Lord under Eli, a revelation of the Lord was uncommon and visions infrequent. One day Eli was asleep in his usual place. His eyes had lately grown so weak that he could not see. The lamp of God was not yet extinguished, and Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the Lord where the ark of God was. The Lord called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." He ran to Eli and spoke. "Go back to sleep." So, he went back to sleep. Again, the Lord called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli, "Here I am." he said. "You called me." But he answered. "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep". At that time Samuel was not familiar with the Lord, because the Lord had not revealed anything to him yet. The Lord called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the Lord was calling the youth. So, he said to Samuel." Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the Lord came and revealed His presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, speak, for your servant is listening.

1 Samuel 3:1-10

This wonderful Old Testament story teaches us at least three very important things about hearing the voice of God. First, every man who is discerning diocesan priesthood should spend silent time regularly before the Blessed Sacrament. Just as God spoke to

Samuel in the temple, where the Ark of God was present, he will speak powerfully before the Blessed Sacrament, this is the Holy of Holies, the very presence of Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul, and divinity. Would you not expect to hear his voice most clearly there?

Second: Learning to hear and to distinguish the voice of God is an art, acquired only through effort. "Samuel was not familiar with the Lord, because the Lord had not revealed anything to him yet. "We must practice silent prayer and listening to God. Finally, when a young man is first learning to discern the voice of God, he especially needs a more experienced person to guide him. Eli was Samuel's spiritual director: "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'"

I always recommend that a man discerning priesthood should spend a minimum of one continuous hour per week before the Blessed Sacrament. Find a Eucharistic adoration chapel where the Holy Eucharist is enthroned in the monstrance and sign up for an hour. If that is not available to you, then just go and sit in the church before the tabernacle. Ask the Holy Spirit to turn up the volume on the voice of God and deafen you to all the other voices!






