



Fr. Tuan Nguyen returns to Visitation as Pastor July 1, 2021

Born in Vietnam and he came to America in 1981 with his brother Nghia Nguyen. After completing college in the US, he went to Mount Angel Seminary and was ordained in 1992 by Archbishop Thomas Murphy at St. James Cathedral, Seattle.

He has been assigned to many parishes. In 1997, he was assigned as pastor for six parishes in Lewis County and helped two communities: he worked with the Spanish community in Lewis County and the Vietnamese Community in Olympia.

In 2006, Fr. Tuan was assigned as pastor of four parishes in Tacoma: St. Ann, St. John of the Woods, Sacred Heart and Visitation. In 2008 two more parishes, Holy Rosary and St. Joseph in Tacoma, were added. In 2011, the cluster reduced to three parishes: St. Ann, St. John of the Woods and Sacred Heart.

Now in 2021, as the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning takes place, we are back again joining in one new big parish including St. Ann, St. John of the Woods, Visitation and Holy Rosary. In addition shepherding to many English speaking parishioners, includes several ethnic communities: Vietnamese, Samoan, Filipino, Spanish, Chamorro (from Guam), etc.

His prayers remain are for all and asks the Holy Spirit to help us, guide us and together assist us build the Kingdom of God for His greater honor and glory.

Meet Fr. Patrick McDermott

Born in Seattle, he grew up in Christ the King Parish in north Seattle. He went to St. Edward's and St. Thomas Seminaries in Kenmore at the north end of Lake Washington both of which are now closed. He was ordained in 1967 by Archbishop Connolly, who was the Archbishop of Seattle.

He has a brother who is a priest and is the Pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Tacoma.

He has served in a variety of parishes in the Archdiocese. The Archbishop "loaned" him to the Maryknoll Missionaries and he ministered in Peru and Bolivia for five years. He learned Spanish at the Maryknoll language school in Bolivia.

He is now retired from full time ministry and **has helped with weekday and Sunday Masses at St. Ann's, and St. John of the Woods Parishes and will help at Visitation Parish.**
