

### BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord commemorates the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist and also marks the beginning of Ordinary Time. The baptism was one of the key events in Jesus' life. It is so significant that it has been recorded in all the four gospels, Mark (1:9-11); Matthew (3:13-17); Luke (3:21-22); John (1:29-34). Luke writes that as John was baptizing the people, Jesus also went to be baptized. If John preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins and those who came to him, therefore, were repentant sinners, why did Jesus, who was sinless, go to John to be baptized? There are three reasons for that: First, by submitting Himself to the baptism administered by John the Baptist, Jesus expressed His humility and obedience to the will of His Father. Secondly, Jesus allowed Himself to receive John's baptism to show his solidarity with the sinful humankind, which he came to save. Thirdly, Jesus accepted to be baptized, to sanctify the waters of baptism. He entered and sanctified the water with His very flesh so that our sins are washed away and that we become free from sin and acquire the state of holiness and grace. On this feast day of the baptism of the Lord, our baptism calls us to die to sin, to die to self and to be reborn into new life in Christ.




