## The Journey of Faith with Fr. Matthew Oakland



Each year popes publish a series of intentions for each month in the following year—2022’s intentions are already published, for example—as we the church is invited to be one in prayer for the needs of the Church and the world. In the beginning of June, a short video on the beauty of marriage including this month’s intention was released through the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network - <https://www.popesprayer.va/>.

Here are his full comments, including the intention for this month in bold:

“Is it true, what some people say—that young people don’t want to get married, especially during these difficult times?


Getting married and sharing one’s life is something beautiful. It’s a demanding journey, at times difficult, and at times complicated, but it’s worth making the effort. And on this life-long journey, the husband and wife aren’t alone; Jesus accompanies them.

Marriage isn’t just a “social” act; it’s a vocation that’s born from the heart; it’s a conscious decision for the rest of one’s life that requires specific preparation.

Please, never forget this. God has a dream for us —love— and He asks us to make it our own. Let us make our own the love which is God’s dream for us.

**And let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community: may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness and patience.**

Because a great deal of patience is necessary in order to love. But it’s worth it, eh?”



Last Spring, we were not only disallowed from public Mass, but weddings and funerals as well. We helped one couple move their wedding to another state where they were able to have a small wedding with just 10 people. Reopening, we had a few weddings with just 30 people, and some just chose to wait a year in hopes of something more.

Because Sacraments mean something. They are encounters with God, as we open ourselves up to His life and grace. And in the Sacrament of Marriage, a couple draws near not just to one another, but to Lord in His love for them as well.

Marriage is a vocation—a calling from God—so its pretty important to include Him throughout, to listen for the voice of where the Lord is calling. The vows, the heart of the Rite of Marriage, take just a few seconds—but define the rest of their lives as they make that choice to love. Yes, a demanding journey. Yes, requiring love, generosity, faithfulness and patience. And, yes worth it!

Please keep our couples preparing for marriage in your prayers, and pray for a greater discernment and embrace of the vocation of marriage—the beautiful calling of God to share in His communion.

On this Father’s Day, we call to mind the fruitfulness of married love, and the many ways in which fathers give and sustain the lives of others, in particular those entrusted to their care by the Lord. Thank you, dads, for choosing to love with generosity, faithfulness and patience, for the ways in which you have provided and protected and prayed for your beloved sons and daughters.

## This Is The Day The Lord Has Made

### Do the consecrated bread and wine cease to be the Body and Blood of Christ when the Mass is over?

No. During the celebration of the Eucharist, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, and this they remain. They cannot turn back into bread and wine, for they are no longer bread and wine at all. There is thus no reason for them to change back to their "normal" state after the special circumstances of the Mass are past. Once the substance has really changed, the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ "endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist" (*Catechism*, no. 1377). Against those who maintained that the bread that is consecrated during the Eucharist has no sanctifying power if it is left over until the next day, St. Cyril of Alexandria replied, "Christ is not altered, nor is his holy body changed, but the power of the consecration and his life-giving grace is perpetual in it" (*Letter 83, to Calosyrius, Bishop of Arsinoe* [PG 76, 1076]). The Church teaches that Christ remains present under the appearances of bread and wine as long as the appearances of bread and wine remain (cf. *Catechism*, no. 1377).

## Gospel Reflection

What a relevant reading! I picture Jesus standing with us in the early months of 2020. "Let us cross to the other side," he says, as the world enters a frightening and unprecedented pandemic. Through the violent squall of deaths, economic despair, and loneliness, Jesus remains at our side. The sea is now appearing to heed his order to be still.

These past 15 months have been distressing and uncertain. As the disciples were terrified in the boat, so have we been terrified. As Christians, we must remember that this pandemic has been part of God's master plan. Our faith is what has allowed us to press forward.

We are not quite at the "other side," but we will get there soon. Through the end of next winter, the tide may ebb us back a couple of times before we reach the shore, but we will get there. The question is what is on the other side. No one knows! The answer, though, is up to us. What lessons have we learned from the pandemic and how will we apply them going forward? Will we cherish the time we have with family and friends? Will we support the small businesses in our community? Will we be active partners in our children's education? Will we take daily walks and offer friendly waves to our neighbors? If we will, then perhaps our society will realize some long-term benefits from the squall. When we eventually disembark from our boat, let us call to mind the instruction of St. Ignatius Loyola to "Act as if everything depended on you; trust as if everything depended on God."

# Building the Domestic Church: Living the Faith At Home

## Breakout Questions for Parents

- As a parent, how do you model to your children and help them navigate the storms in their own lives? What do you want your children to learn from observing you in stormy situation, even if you “lose” your temper? Do you invite the family to pray together for a solution to the problem?
- During this pandemic we have all faced many uncertainties, do you ever doubt the presence and loving care of God? What prayer or action calms you when you face uncertainty? Do you ask Jesus for hope in uncertain times?
- As a parent, you have experienced many storms in your life. How did you handle these situations?

## Words to Ponder by St. Francis de Sales

*Have no fear for what tomorrow may bring. The same loving God who cares for you today will take care of you tomorrow and every day. He will either shield you from suffering or give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace then, and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations.*

## Suggested Activity:

Read today’s Gospel with you family with your family (Mark 4:35-41). Talk about how you would have felt if you were with Jesus and the disciples during the storm. Make a poster for your refrigerator. On the poster, draw a boat and have each person in the family write his/her name on the boat. At the bottom of the poster, put this caption: “Where two or three are gathered together, there am I in their midst.” Link to the Gospel reading: [Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time | USCCB](#)

## Breakout Questions for Teens

- Have you ever needed to be rescued? What was the situation?
- Write a song or poem expressing praise and thanksgiving to God for an area of your life, a victory God has won in your life, or simply for who God is.
- When has God won a victory in your life?
- Do you find it easier to praise God when things go well or to be angry at God when things are not going well?

## Breakout Questions for Children

- Storms can be scary sometimes. Imagine what it must have been like to be one of Jesus’ disciples, in a boat in the middle of the sea, during a storm. The big waves filled the boat with water. The boat rocked back and forth and the disciples probably thought they might tip over, but Jesus stayed asleep through the whole thing. If you were one of Jesus’ disciples and you saw Jesus sleeping, what would you do?
- Have you ever experienced a rough, awful day or a moment where you felt sad, lonely, or frightened? Did you ask anyone for help?
- Today’s gospel reading reminds us that Jesus is always with us. Jesus can do amazing things for us if we bring him our worries and the things we are afraid of. Do you ask for Jesus’ help to calm you down when you are afraid?

## Breakout Questions for Adults

- Have you ever experienced a mighty storm, like a monsoon or thunder storm? What was that experience like?
- What storms, or hardships, are you currently facing? How are you navigating them? What emotions have been stirred up within you as a result?
- When do you find it most difficult to remain faithful to the Lord? How can you deepen your faith in these times?
- How can you grow in trust of the Lord and His ability to calm the seas and storms of life?

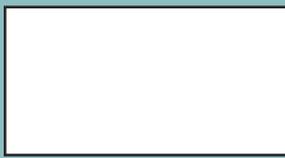
