

From the Pastor

Weekend of December 11 & 12, 2021 (Advent 3 C)

Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday

Words like joy, rejoice, dance, exult, praise, sing, song, shout and so on occur in the readings and psalm more than twenty times, at least. They do set the tone and give us the reasons to rejoice. Half way into this grace-filled season of Advent as we embark, there is a legitimate reason to have the overflowing joy in our heart as we get closer and closer to the Mystery of Incarnation.



Luke's Gospel reintroduces the figure of John the Baptist who advises us to do concrete acts of reparation. We could conceptualize John as the self-effacing precursor who phases out once Christ comes. Putting on the same mantle, we have a task cut out to make Jesus present in others and not claim any glory out of it. But the limitless award awaits us for bringing joy to others. Let us rejoice and be glad!

"Joy is doubled", in the words of Mother St. Teresa, "when it is shared". By sharing the joy, we feel the presence of God among us and that is the joyful moment of Christmas. What is it that brings me joy? What would be the best way to bring joy to others? As we are familiar with, the order of preference in our relationship brings **JOY** to us: **J**esus, **O**thers and **Y**ou! We live in a world that is torn by strife and forces us to reverse the order which eventually and evidently throws us off. Let us be very intentional in committing to the right order of relationship to guarantee ourselves with that great gift of joy.
